Addendum

1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Simon Hough (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) from the Committee on Contributions, effective 3 May 2017. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Mr. Hough, which expires on 31 December 2017.
2. The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland has nominated Steve Townley to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Hough.
3. In a communication dated 9 May 2017, the Secretary-General was informed by the Chair of the Group of Western European and other States that the candidature of Mr. Townley had been endorsed by the Group.

In depth knowledge and experience of United Nations reform issues and of United Nations financial management and business transformation projects, including Umoja, human resources and procurement reforms, common system developments, implementation of IPSAS, counter-fraud and corruption initiatives, enterprise risk management, technical cooperation and project and programme management. Experience in examining complex accounting and audit issues, involving re-performance and validation of economic and other models used by entities in core business processes such as budgeting (e.g. budget re-costing), employee liabilities (including validation of actuarial reports) and complex accounting estimates (e.g. finance leases).

This project tested the effectiveness of FAO IT Security and Governance structures leading to important improvements in cyber security.

As Project Director, my responsibilities included selection and procurement of an appropriate ERP solution and integration partner. The project successfully replaced an ageing mainframe computer system with a modern integrated ERP database system which provided a platform for further business transformation and increased operational efficiency and effectiveness.

I was responsible for managing a large portfolio of audits, including the external audit of the International Labour Organization, and all European-based agencies audited under the NAOs work with the United Nations Board of Auditors, including UNOG, UNODC, UNOV, ICTY, UNHCR, OHCHR, ITC, UNITAR, UNCC, International Training Centre Turin, UNFCC, UNCCD, and the United Nations Staff College.

1993 to 1996: Audit Manager, National Audit Office section, Blackpool, Department for Work and Pensions

Initially posted to London as an Audit Professional on the audit of contributory benefits, I was promoted to Audit Manager and transferred to the National Audit Office's Blackpool Office to manage the audit of the United Kingdom's major Welfare Benefits and the Department for Work and Pensions departmental accounts, including its executive agencies. I highlighted the major impact of fraud and error in relation to welfare benefits, which led to a major and ongoing audit qualification of these accounts.

1989 to 1992: Principal Auditor, Rome, FAO and WFP

I was resident in Rome as the lead Principal Auditor on the audit of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Agency accounts, including the Trust Fund accounts, FAO Commissary and Credit Union, and also worked on the audit of the World Food Programme. I also led the United Nations Board of Auditors audit of the UNDP.
