



#### Introduction

- 1. Mindful of its primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security, the Security Council continued to engage on a wide-reaching agenda in accordance with the principles and objectives set forth in the Charter of the United Nations. During the period under review, the Council held 296 formal meetings, of which 282 were public. The Council adopted 61 resolutions and 27 presidential statements and issued 93 statements to the press. During the reporting period, the Council conducted five missions.
- 2. The present report incorporates the changes mandated in the note by the President dated 30 August (S/2017/507), whereby all future reports will cover the calendar year, 1 January to 31 December. This report covers the year 2017.
- 3. During the reporting period, the situation in the Middle East figured prominently on the Council's agenda. Meetings were held on the situations in the Syrian Arab Republic, Iraq and Yemen, the Palestinian question, the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force and Lebanon. The Council also regularly monitored the situation in Afghanistan.
- 4. The situations in Africa remained a focus of the Council. Frequent meetings were held on the Central African Republic, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Guinea-Bissau, Libya, Mali, Somalia and South Sudan.
- 5. Thematic, general and cross-cutting issues remained a priority for the Council, including non-proliferation, threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts, the protection of civilians in armed conflict, children and armed conflict, women and peace and security, peacekeeping and peacebuilding, sanctions, cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations, peace and security in Africa, and the rule of law.
- 6. The Council considered the work of the International Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia and the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals and continued to monitor situations that it had referred to the International Criminal Court concerning the situations in Darfur and Libya.

This introduction does not seek to provide an exhaustive list of meetings, developments or Council responses. It is intended as a succinct and useful overview of key developments. Unless otherwise indicated, resolutions referred to in this introduction were adopted unanimously.

#### Africa

#### Visits of the Security Council to Africa

- 8. The Council undertook three missions to Africa in the reporting period.
- 9. From 1 to 7 March, the Council sent a mission to the countries of the Lake Chad basin region, namely Cameroon, Chad, the Niger and Nigeria. Later in March, the mission's Co-Chairs briefed the Council on the situation in the region and emphasized the need for an enhanced and holistic response to the challenges facing the subregion. The Council also heard from the Deputy Secretary-General, Amina J. Mohammed, who addressed the 15-member organ for the first time in that capacity.
- 10. During the second mission, from 6 to 8 September, the Council visited Ethiopia for the 11th annual joint consultative meeting between the members of the United Nations Security Council and the Peace and Security Council of the African Union at the Headquarters of the African Union, in Addis Ababa. At the meeting there was discussion on the situations in Somalia, South Sudan and the Lake Chad basin. This mission was the first stand-alone visit by the members of the Security Council to the African Union Headquarters in Addis Ababa, and strengthened the partnership and enhanced cooperation between the two Councils.
- 11. The third mission was to the Sahel region and comprised visits to Mali, Mauritania and Burkina Faso, from 19 to 22 October, to assess the operationalization of the Joint Force of the Group of Five for the Sahel. During the visit, Council members met with representatives of the Governments of Mali, Mauritania and Burkina Faso, the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali, international security presences in Mali (including the Joint Force, European Union missions and French forces), civil

society as well as actors involved in the implementation of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali. The Council saw evidence of great determination among regional actors in the Sahel to overcome security challenges through deployment of the regional force.

#### Burundi

- 12. The Council was briefed concerning the political, socioeconomic and humanitarian situation in Burundi. The Council noted that the Arusha Agreement must remain the cornerstone of all efforts, and the first priority was to promote an inclusive dialogue.
- 13. In August, the Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/13), in which it expressed concern over the political and humanitarian situation, noted that the security situation in Burundi had remained generally calm, commended regional efforts to help Burundians to find political solutions and reiterated its support to the facilitation led by the East African Community through the Special Envoy.

#### Central African region

- 14. The activities of Boko Haram continued to have devastating consequences for the political, socioeconomic, humanitarian and human rights situations in the affected areas of Central Africa. While progress continued in the fight against the Lord's Resistance Army, the group continued to demonstrate its intention and capacity to conduct attacks against civilians in the Central African region.
- 15. The Council received briefings on the Central Africa region in June and December. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa (UNOCA), briefed the Council on challenges in the political, security, electoral and humanitarian situations and in upholding human rights in the region and on the implementation of the United Nations regional strategy to combat LRA. The Council urged UNOCA to continue to facilitate coordination among regional actors in addressing the challenges the region faced.

#### Central African Republic

- 16. Despite the efforts made by the Government of the Central African Republic and positive progress in the political process coordinated by the African Union, the security situation in the Central African Republic during 2017 continued to be critical, with an upsurge of violence committed by the armed groups.
- 17. The Council issued statements to the press expressing condemnations of attacks on the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization

- Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA) in January, April, May, July and November. In February, Council members released a press statement, deploring attacks against civilians and incitement to ethnic and religious hatred and violence. They also reaffirmed their support for the African Initiative for Peace and Reconciliation in the Central African Republic as the main framework for a political solution.
- 18. In February, the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations briefed the Council on the latest report of the Secretary-General on the situation in the Central African Republic. The Chair of the Central African Republic configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission and the Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 2127 (2013) concerning the Central African Republic also made statements.
- 19. In March, the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations and the President of the Central African Republic, Faustin Archange Touadera, briefed the Council on the situation in the country. The briefers stressed that international support and partnerships were vital to the stability of the Central African Republic.
- 20. In April, the Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/5), in which it reaffirmed the Council's support for President Touadera, expressed concern at the ongoing violence between armed groups, acknowledged reconciliation efforts, and condemned attacks against civilians.
- 21. In June, the Council received a briefing from the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Central African Republic, on the implementation of the mandate of MINUSCA. The Special Representative described the recent increase in violence in the Central African Republic, and insisted that MINUSCA would maintain a robust posture towards armed groups, and that this would need to be accompanied by increased peacebuilding efforts.
- 22. In July, the Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/9), in which it condemned the ongoing clashes between armed groups and reiterated its support for President Touadera and the Government and people of the Central African Republic.
- 23. The Council had another briefing on the Central African Republic in November, which was followed by consultations in which the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations participated.
- 24. The Council adopted resolution 2339 (2017) in January, by which it renewed the sanctions regime against the Central African Republic until 31 January 2018 and the mandate of the Panel of Experts until

28 February 2018. By resolution 2387 (2017), adopted in November, the Council renewed the mandate of MINUSCA until 15 November 2018 and authorized a troop increase of 900.

#### Côte d'Ivoire

- 25. In February, the Council was briefed by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI) on the latest developments in the country and the Secretary-General's report.
- 26. In June, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of UNOCI delivered her final briefing to the Council ahead of the mission's closure on 30 June. Members of the Council commended the Government, and some stressed that lessons learned in Côte d'Ivoire could be used for future United Nations peacekeeping operations. Later in June, the Council adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/8) welcoming the closure of UNOCI.

#### **Democratic Republic of the Congo**

- 27. The Council held briefings and consultations frequently on the situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In the briefings, the Council was informed that, despite the efforts made by international partners and the Transitional Government, political tensions in the Democratic Republic of the Congo continued to rise, amid continuing challenges to the full implementation of the political agreement of 31 December 2016 and a rising number of displaced people and an increase in human rights abuses, which were prolonging political uncertainty.
- 28. The security situation remained fragile in several areas in the country, notably in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Kasaï region. The United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) continued to readjust itself to best project force and enhance the protection of civilians. The Council issued a statement to the press in February, strongly condemning violence in the Kasaï region, and in March, in another press statement, the Council condemned the killing of two members of the Group of Experts who were monitoring the sanctions regime in the Kasai Central region.
- 29. The Council issued three presidential statements during 2017. In the first (S/PRST/2017/1), in January, the Council welcomed the "comprehensive and inclusive political agreement" signed in Kinshasa on 31 December 2016; in the second (S/PRST/2017/12), in July, the Council stressed the urgent need for swift

- implementation of that political agreement, and condemned the violence in the Kasai region; and in the third (S/PRST/2017/23), issued in November regarding the investigation into the death of the two experts, the Council reiterated the need for the Government to fully investigate the killing of the two experts and bring the perpetrators to justice.
- 30. In March, by resolution 2348 (2017), the Council extended the mandate of MONUSCO until 31 March 2018, reducing its troop ceiling by 3,600 military personnel to 16,215 troops, from 19,815 under its previous mandate. The Council requested that the Secretary-General conduct a strategic review of MONUSCO and examine the continued relevance of its mandated tasks, with a view to providing advice on a further troop-level reduction and on an exit strategy.
- 31. In June, by resolution 2360 (2017), the Council renewed until 1 July 2018 the measures relating to the arms embargo, asset freeze and travel ban affecting the Democratic Republic of the Congo, expanding those sanctions to cover individuals and entities engaging in or providing support for acts that included planning, directing, sponsoring or participating in attacks against MONUSCO peacekeepers or United Nations personnel. It also extended until 1 August 2018 the mandate of the Group of Experts assisting the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1533 (2004) concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In August, the Chair of that Committee gave a briefing on the Committee's work.

#### **Great Lakes region**

- 32. The Council convened an open meeting in April with a briefing by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Great Lakes Region, who described efforts to implement the Peace, Security and Cooperation Framework for the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Region.
- 33. In December, the Council adopted resolution 2389 (2017), in which it reiterated its call for States which had signed the Framework to abide by the commitment to non-interference in the internal affairs of neighbouring countries and the prohibition against abetting armed groups or war criminals. The Council also encouraged enhanced cooperation among all signatory States and urged enhanced regional cooperation in countering armed groups.

#### Guinea-Bissau

34. In February, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Guinea-Bissau briefed the Council on the Secretary-General's latest report and

recent developments in Guinea-Bissau. The Chair of the Guinea-Bissau configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission also briefed the Council and statements were made by the representatives of Guinea-Bissau and Liberia on behalf of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).

- 35. In February, the Council adopted resolution 2343 (2017), by which it renewed the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Guinea-Bissau (UNIOGBIS) until 28 February 2018. The Council fully endorsed the recommendations outlined in the report of the Secretary-General regarding the need for UNIOGBIS to refocus its efforts towards political capacities in support of the Special Representative's good offices and political facilitation role.
- 36. In May, Council members received a briefing in consultations from the Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs on Guinea-Bissau, focusing on the ongoing political crisis. In a statement to the press issued after the meeting, Council members called on relevant stakeholders to strictly respect and comply with the Conakry Agreement and the ECOWAS road map and expressed their readiness to take necessary measures to respond to a further worsening of the situation in Guinea-Bissau.
- 37. In August, the Council received a briefing on the Secretary-General's report on Guinea-Bissau from the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of UNIOGBIS. The Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 2048 (2012) concerning Guinea-Bissau and the Chair of the Guinea-Bissau configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission also gave briefings.
- 38. In September, the Council adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/17) in which it called on the leadership of Guinea-Bissau to implement the Conakry Agreement of 14 October 2016.

#### Liberia

39. In June, the Council held a briefing followed by consultations on the situation in Liberia. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL) briefed the Council on the latest report of the Secretary-General and activities related to the Mission's drawdown. The Chair of the Liberia configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission briefed the Council on his recent visit to the country and developments relating to the Peacebuilding Commission.

- 40. In July, the Council adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/11) on the Liberia peacebuilding plan and the upcoming presidential elections.
- 41. In August, Council members held consultations on the situation in Liberia. The Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations briefed the Council on the preparations for the presidential and legislative elections to be held on 10 October in Liberia, as requested in resolution 2333 (2016).
- 42. In December, the Special Representative for Liberia and Head of UNMIL briefed Council members in consultations. As mandated by resolution 2333 (2016), the Special Representative updated the Council on the presidential elections in Liberia and the drawdown of UNMIL towards its final withdrawal.

#### Libya

- 43. In February, the Council discussed the latest situation in Libya, focusing on the efforts to reach an inclusive and sustainable political settlement in Libya. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya and Head of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL) briefed the Council and said that, despite some important advances in Libya, not enough progress had been made in implementing the Libyan Political Agreement forged in 2015. Terrorism remained a threat, living conditions were poor and armed groups continued to abuse human rights with impunity. During a meeting in April, the Special Representative cautioned that Libya risked a return to widespread conflict and urged parties to adhere to the Libyan Political Agreement.
- 44. In May, the Council issued a statement to the press, in which it condemned the military escalation in southern Libya including the recent attack at Birak al-Shati' and the escalation in violence in Tripoli. The Council called on all parties to exercise restraint, reiterated that there can be no military solution and urged all parties to express their support for national reconciliation.
- 45. In June, the Council adopted resolution 2357 (2017), extending the authorizations under which States, obtaining the consent of the vessel's flag State prior to any inspections, may inspect vessels on the high seas off the coast of Libya believed to be in violation of the arms embargo, as set out in resolution 2292 (2016), for a further 12 months, until 12 June 2018. At the end of June, by resolution 2362 (2017), the Council extended until 15 November 2018 the sanctions measures relating to illicit petroleum exports, adding "attacks against United Nations personnel" as criteria for the ongoing travel ban and asset freeze measures.

- 46. In July, the Council issued a statement to the press, in which it welcomed the appointment of the new Special Representative of the Secretary-General, Ghassan Salamé, and looked forward to supporting his efforts to facilitate a political solution in Libya. The Council also welcomed the meeting of Faiez Serraj, President of the Presidency Council of Libya, and General Khalifa Haftar, Commander of the Libyan National Army, hosted in Paris by the President of France on 25 July, and the resulting joint declaration in which they urged all Libyans to support a negotiated political solution, national reconciliation and an immediate ceasefire.
- 47. In September, the Council extended for one year the mandate of UNSMIL, as an integrated special political mission, by resolution 2376 (2017).
- 48. In October, by resolution 2380 (2017), the Council extended for a third one-year period the authorization, established under resolution 2240 (2015), for Member States to inspect, as permitted under international law, on the high seas off the coast of Libya, vessels that have been, are being, or imminently will be used by organized criminal enterprises for migrant smuggling or human trafficking from Libya.
- 49. In October, the Council adopted a presidential statement on the situation in Libya (S/PRST/2017/19), in which it endorsed the United Nations Action Plan for Libya presented by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General, in support of a Libyan-led transition that would lead to the establishment of stable, unified, representative and effective governance in the framework of the Libyan Political Agreement, which remained the only viable framework to end the Libyan political crisis.
- 50. In November, the Special Representative briefed the Council on the United Nations Action Plan for Libya and UNSMIL efforts to amend the Libyan Political Agreement, organize a national conference, prepare for elections and provide humanitarian assistance. Given the division among Libyans, the Special Representative emphasized the need to rebuild the national polity, without which effective institutions could not form.
- 51. In December, reports of migrants being sold into slavery in Libya were also of grave concern to the Council. In a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/24) issued in December, it condemned such actions as heinous abuses of human rights and possible crimes against humanity. Later that month, the Council reiterated in a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/26) that the Libyan Political Agreement was the only viable framework to end the political crisis and that its

- implementation was essential for holding elections and finalizing the transition.
- 52. Throughout the reporting period, the Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1970 (2011) concerning Libya regularly briefed the Council on the activities and decisions of the Committee.
- 53. The Council heard briefings from the Chief Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, in May and November.

#### Mali

- 54. In January, the Council heard a briefing by the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations, who presented the latest report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Mali, condemned the attack that killed more than 50 people at a military base in Gao, and called for speeding up implementation of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali. The Minister for Foreign Affairs, African Integration and International Cooperation of Mali attended the meeting and addressed the Council.
- 55. In April, the Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations, who presented the Secretary-General's latest report and provided an update on the situation in Mali, including recent positive developments. He called for enhanced efforts to combat transnational organized crime and to implement the peace agreement, emphasized that combating the accelerated activities of terrorists and the transnational networks funding them continued to require international support, and welcomed the decision by the countries of the Group of 5 for the Sahel (G-5 Sahel) to establish a regional force to combat such activities. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of Mali attended the meeting and addressed the Council.
- 56. In June, the Council held a briefing on Mali. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA) reported significant progress on implementation of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation over the past months, but agreed that terrorists and extremists were gaining ground as existing tensions threatened to derail achievements. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of Mali emphasized that the Council's authorization was required to deploy a new joint counter-terrorism force involving the G-5 Sahel States.
- 57. In October, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of MINUSMA briefed the Council. He said that all parties must redouble their efforts to re-establish trust between them and, despite

the prolonged delays in the implementation of the Peace Agreement, engage in necessary reforms and provide a peace dividend to the people. The Minister for Foreign Affairs of Mali addressed the Council.

58. In 2017, the Council adopted two resolutions on Mali, resolution 2364 (2017) in June, by which it renewed the mandate of MINUSMA, and resolution 2374 (2017) in September, by which it established a sanctions regime against individuals or entities that threaten the peace, security or stability of Mali.

#### Somalia

- 59. In 2017, Somalia made significant progress in the political process and security sector reform. At a briefing in January the Council heard that the election of a new Parliament in Somalia marked a milestone. In May, the Deputy Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia added that peaceful presidential elections in Somalia had created a unique opportunity to forge a functional State.
- 60. With Somalia still facing the threat posed by Al-Shabaab, drought and the humanitarian crisis, the Council issued presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/3) in February, in which it called upon the new President of Somalia to focus on the immediate risk of famine and address the consequences of the severe drought, and to accelerate political and security reforms. In statements to the press issued in February and June, the Council condemned terrorist attacks in Mogadishu. In another press statement in August the Council condemned a fatal attack by Al-Shabaab against the Ugandan contingent of the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM), and in a press statement in October it condemned a terrorist attack in Mogadishu in which hundreds of civilians were killed. At a briefing in September the Council was informed that hard-won gains could be swept away without predictable funding for AMISOM.
- 61. By resolution 2355 (2017), adopted in May, the Council authorized States members of the African Union to maintain the deployment of AMISOM until 31 August. On 30 August, by resolution 2372 (2017), the Council extended its authorization of AMISOM until 31 May 2018, and approved a reduction of the level of its uniformed personnel to a maximum of 21,626 by 31 December 2017, amid a transition of responsibilities to Somali security forces. The Council emphasized that the long-term objective for Somalia, with international support, was for the Somali security forces to assume full responsibility for security, recognizing that AMISOM remained critical during the transition.

- 62. In March, the Council adopted resolution 2346 (2017), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSOM) until 16 June. By resolution 2358 (2017), adopted in June, it further extended the mandate of UNSOM until 31 March 2018.
- 63. In November, the Council adopted resolution 2385 (2017), by which it extended the modified arms embargo on Somalia and the authorization for maritime interdiction of illicit arms imports and charcoal exports until 15 November 2018, and renewed the arms ban on Eritrea for the same period. It also extended the mandate of the Somalia and Eritrea Monitoring Group until 15 December 2018. The resolution was adopted by 11 votes in favour, with 4 abstentions.
- 64. Also in November, the Council adopted resolution 2383 (2017), by which it renewed for another year the authorization for international naval forces to help to fight piracy off the coast of Somalia.

#### Sudan and South Sudan

Darfur

- 65. The security situation in Darfur improved in 2017: the armed groups have largely been defeated and there was no new large-scale displacement. However, Darfur still faced challenges in several areas, including the political process and the humanitarian situation. During the briefings held in January and April, the Council was informed that, despite a decline in armed conflict, civilians were still faced with violence and criminality, while long-term solutions for 2.6 million displaced persons remained elusive. It was suggested that the mandate of the African Union-United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur (UNAMID) should be amended. In June, the Council was presented with the findings of a strategic review recommending that the focus of UNAMID should be adjusted.
- 66. In June the Council adopted resolution 2363 (2017), by which it renewed the mandate of UNAMID until 30 June 2018, and endorsed the recommendations in the strategic review, including a two-phase restructuring of the mission that would lower troop and police levels to 8,735 and 2,500, respectively. After that, the Council held several meetings to follow up the situation in Darfur and the reconfiguration of UNAMID.
- 67. The Council, in February, adopted resolution 2340 (2017), by which it extended until 12 March 2018 the mandate of the Panel of Experts charged with monitoring sanctions in Darfur. In 2017, the Council was briefed several times by the Chair of the Committee

established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan.

68. In June and December, the Council was briefed by the Chief Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

#### South Sudan

- 69. Throughout the year, the Council followed the situation in South Sudan closely. There were more than 20 briefings or informal consultations. The Council heard in briefings that progress towards ending hostilities and resuming dialogue was limited, the humanitarian situation was still dire, the national dialogue launched in the was May, Intergovernmental Authority for Development (IGAD) proposed to revitalize the Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan, which would hinge on the degree to which the Government and opposition embraced it. The Council welcomed and strongly supported the establishment by IGAD of the High-level Revitalization Forum for the implementation of the Agreement, and strongly urged all parties to engage constructively in the process without preconditions. As a first priority and a sign of commitment, the Council called on all parties to end hostilities as they had pledged.
- 70. In August, the Council sent letters to South Sudanese parties (Government and opposition leaders) in which the Council outlined its concerns, and in which a message was conveyed to the parties to take steps to cease offensives and engage with the efforts of IGAD supported by the Council.
- 71. The Council issued two presidential statements and several statements to the press. In the presidential statement issued in March (S/PRST/2017/4), the Council called for "immediate adherence to the permanent ceasefire by all forces of the parties to the conflict and all other armed groups", stressed that there was no military solution to the conflict, and condemned reported human rights violations and attacks on humanitarian workers. In the presidential statement issued in December (S/PRST/2017/25) the Council strongly supported the convening of an inclusive forum as proposed by IGAD to get the Agreement back on track and aim for substantive progress on the initiative when it convened at the end of December. In press statements in May and June, the Council condemned attacks on peacekeepers of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) and UNAMID, including one in which a Nigerian peacekeeper serving with UNAMID was killed.

- 72. In May, the Council adopted resolution 2353 (2017), by which it renewed the sanctions measures until 31 May 2018, including the travel ban and asset freeze imposed by resolution 2206 (2015) on those blocking peace, security and stability in South Sudan, and also extended until 30 June 2018 the mandate of the Panel of Experts overseeing sanctions.
- 73. In December, the Council, by resolution 2392 (2017), extended the mandate of UNMISS until 15 March 2018, and authorized the Mission to use all necessary means to carry out its tasks as set out in resolution 2327 (2016).

Sudan, South Sudan and Abyei

- 74. The Council had several meetings throughout the year on the Abyei issue. During a briefing in October, the Council was informed that the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) clearly played a stabilizing role in Abyei.
- 75. In May, the Council adopted resolution 2352 (2017), by which it extended the mandate of UNISFA until 15 November, including its tasks in support of the disputed territory's Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism, while warning that the support would be withdrawn unless the Sudan and South Sudan complied fully with their obligations. It decided to reduce the Force's authorized troop ceiling from 5,326 to 4,791.
- 76. In November, recognizing some progress by the parties, the Council duly responded by adopting resolution 2386 (2017), by which it extended the Force's mandate until 15 May 2018, but limited support for the Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism to a further five months.

#### Western Sahara

77. In April, the Council adopted resolution 2351 (2017), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara until 30 April 2018. Council members made statements after the vote.

#### Peace consolidation in West Africa: United Nations Office for West Africa and the Sahel

78. In January, the Council was briefed by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Office for West Africa and the Sahel (UNOWAS) on the Secretary-General's latest report on the region. The meeting was followed by consultations during which issues discussed included the political crisis in the Gambia, the independent evaluation of the

United Nations Integrated Strategy for the Sahel and Boko Haram.

- 79. The Council adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/2) in January, in which it welcomed the letter from the President of the Council to the Secretary-General regarding UNOWAS, including its annex regarding the extension of the mandate of UNOWAS for three years, until 31 December 2019.
- 80. In July, the Special Representative and Head of UNOWAS briefed the Council on recent developments in the region and the semi-annual UNOWAS report. Further discussions followed in consultations. Later in July, the Council adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/10), in which it welcomed developments in the Gambia and Côte d'Ivoire, highlighting the role of UNOWAS in supporting, as necessary, Côte d'Ivoire following the recent withdrawal of the United Nations peacekeeping operation from the country. In the statement the Council highlighted the terrorism threat in the Sahel and the Lake Chad basin, regional efforts through the Multinational Joint Task Force to combat Boko Haram, and the initiative of the G-5 Sahel to establish a joint force. The Council also emphasized the importance of the United Nations and partners enhancing their programmatic capacity and focusing on cross-border challenges, and reiterated the importance of UNOWAS collaboration.

#### Peace consolidation in West Africa: the Gambia

- 81. The Council followed closely the situation in the Gambia. In January, the Council adopted resolution 2337 (2017) on the presidential elections in the Gambia, in which it endorsed the decisions of ECOWAS and the African Union to recognize Adama Barrow as the legitimate President of the country.
- 82. The Council in January also adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/2) on developments in the region, welcoming among other things the conclusion of the independent evaluation of the United Nations Integrated Strategy for the Sahel. Following the adoption of the statement, the Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs updated members on the quickly evolving situation in the Gambia, under "any other business", during consultations.
- 83. Later in January, the Council received a follow-up briefing on the Gambia from the Special Representative and Head of UNOWAS, which included a discussion of the joint declaration issued by ECOWAS, the African Union and the United Nations following the agreement of the former President, Yahya Jammeh, to transfer power to Mr. Barrow and to leave the country.

#### Peace and security in Africa: Lake Chad basin

- 84. In January, the Council received briefings from the Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs and the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator on the Lake Chad basin crisis precipitated by the Boko Haram conflict. The Council also heard a briefing from a civil society representative. A number of Council members expressed support for a proposed Council mission to the Lake Chad basin region.
- 85. In March, the Council adopted its first resolution (2349 (2017)) addressing the situation in the Lake Chad basin region, including the security, humanitarian and peacebuilding aspects of the crisis.

#### Peace and security in Africa: Sahel

- 86. In June, the Council adopted resolution 2359 (2017), in which it welcomed the deployment of the Joint Force of the Group of Five for the Sahel throughout the territories of its contributing countries, with up to 5,000 military and police personnel, with a view to restoring peace and security in the Sahel region.
- 87. In August, the Council was briefed by the Assistant-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations on the activities of the G-5 Sahel Joint Force; he emphasized that the Joint Force to combat cross-border terrorism and organized crime could make a significant contribution to stabilizing the region by working in tandem with other ongoing initiatives.
- 88. In October, the Council heard briefings on the activities of the G-5 Sahel Joint Force by the Secretary-General, the Minister for Foreign Affairs, African Integration and International Cooperation of Mali, the Chairperson of the African Union Commission, and the European Union Special Representative for the Sahel. Ministers from Burkina Faso, Chad, Mauritania and the Niger also attended the meeting and addressed the Council.
- 89. In December, the Council adopted resolution 2391 (2017), in which it requested the Secretary-General to conclude a technical agreement among the United Nations, the European Union and the G-5 Sahel States, with a view to providing operational and logistical support through MINUSMA to the joint force conducting cross-border counter-terrorist operations across the region.

### Peace and security in Africa: briefing on the African Union

90. In February, the Council held consultations and was briefed by the Secretary-General. The main topic

was the outcome of the Secretary-General's attendance at the African Union summit and his interactions with leaders of African countries on a wide range of issues, including strengthening the United Nations-African Union partnership and United Nations peacekeeping operations in Africa. The members of the Council welcomed the initiative of the Secretary-General to brief the Council on his trip, expressed their full support for such an approach, and stressed the need to ensure African ownership and full engagement of the continent in addressing outstanding issues and challenges faced by the African countries.

### Peace and security in Africa: visit of the Deputy Secretary-General

91. In August, the Deputy Secretary-General briefed the Council on the African Union-United Nations mission to Nigeria and the Democratic Republic of the Congo, with a focus on women and peace and security, conducted from 19 to 27 July. On the visit the Deputy Secretary-General was joined by the Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women), the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on Sexual Violence in Conflict and the African Union Commission's Special Envoy on Women, Peace and Security.

### Peace and security in Africa: enhancing African capacities in the areas of peace and security

92. In July, the Council held an open debate on "Peace and security in Africa: enhancing African capacities in the areas of peace and security". The Council was briefed by the Secretary-General and the African Union Commissioner for Peace and Security. The main topic was how to enhance African peace and security capacities and the partnership between the United Nations and the African Union in the areas of peace and security. In the ensuing debate, consensus was reached by the speakers that deeper cooperation between the United Nations and the African Union needed to be enhanced to help to promote the peacekeeping operations of the African Union.

#### **Americas**

Identical letters dated 19 January 2016 from the Permanent Representative of Colombia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General and the President of the Security Council (\$/2016/53)

93. The Council conducted a three-day visit to Colombia in May and adopted a presidential statement

(S/PRST/2017/6) a few days later, in which it paid tribute to the people of Colombia for embarking on the path to peace after more than 50 years of conflict.

- 94. In July, by its resolution 2366 (2017), the Council authorized the creation of the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia to oversee the next phase of the peace agreement of 2016 that ended half a century of fighting between the Government and the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia-People's Army (FARC-EP).
- 95. The Council approved the recommendations contained in the report of the Secretary-General regarding the size, operational aspects and mandate of the Verification Mission by adopting resolution 2377 (2017) in September.
- 96. In October, by resolution 2381 (2017), the Council decided that the Verification Mission would expand its work to include monitoring a ceasefire recently signed by the Government and the group known as Ejército de Liberación Nacional.
- 97. In October, the President of the Council read out a statement (S/PRST/2017/18), which marked the completion of the 12-month mandate of the United Nations Mission in Colombia by welcoming progress in the country following the Final Agreement for Ending the Conflict and Building a Stable and Lasting Peace reached between the Government of Colombia and FARC-EP.

#### Haiti

- 98. The Council held a debate on the situation in Haiti in April, during which the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH) gave a briefing and informed the Council that constitutional order had been restored in Haiti and called for the gradual drawdown of MINUSTAH in six months. By resolution 2350 (2017), adopted a few days later, the Council extended the mandate of MINUSTAH for a final six months.
- 99. The Council conducted a three-day visit to Haiti in June to reaffirm its support for the Government and people of Haiti in strengthening institutions to contribute to the country's stability and development.
- 100. The Council convened a debate in July and the Special Representative briefed the Council on the latest developments in the country.
- 101. The Council convened a debate in October and a few days later issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/20), marking the end of the mandate of

MINUSTAH, which would be replaced by the United Nations Mission for Justice Support in Haiti with the aim of helping the Government to consolidate stability, implement institutional reforms and enhance the rule of law, human rights and governance.

#### Asia

#### Afghanistan

102. The situation in Afghanistan remained fragile in 2017. It was stressed that Afghanistan needed continued international support in order to face its multitude of challenges.

103. The security situation remained dangerous, and civilians continued to bear the brunt of the violence. The presence of Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL, also known as Da'esh) and foreign terrorist fighters complicated the situation, and a series of terrorist attacks was carried out in Afghanistan.

104. Progress had been made in organizing parliamentary and district council elections scheduled for 2018, and many Council members urged regional support for tackling all of the challenges faced by Afghanistan.

105. On 17 March, the Council adopted resolution 2344 (2017), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan until 17 March 2018.

106. The Council held quarterly debates on Afghanistan in March, June, September and December. In the open debate in December, the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime voiced alarm over the unprecedented high levels of opium poppy cultivation and production in Afghanistan.

#### Democratic People's Republic of Korea

107. In December, the Council held a meeting on the situation in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. The agenda for the meeting was adopted after a procedural vote of 10 in favour to 3 against, with 2 abstentions. The Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs and the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights briefed the Council on the humanitarian and human rights situation in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea during 2017, noting the lack of progress, and expressed their concerns and observations.

#### Myanmar

108. The situation in Rakhine State, Myanmar, deteriorated rapidly after the attacks against Myanmar security forces carried out by the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army on 25 August in Rakhine State.

109. At a briefing in September, the Secretary-General informed the Council that at least 500,000 civilians had fled their homes and sought refuge in Bangladesh. He urged the Government of Myanmar to take three immediate steps: end military operations, allow unfettered access for humanitarian support and ensure the voluntary, safe and dignified return of displaced Rohingya to their homes.

110. The Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/22) in November, in which it condemned the violence and reports of human rights violations and abuses in Rakhine State, expressed alarm at the deteriorating humanitarian situation and called on the Government of Myanmar to ensure no further excessive use of violence and restore civilian administration and intercommunal harmony in Rakhine State. The Council also urged the implementation of agreed mechanisms to allow the voluntary, safe and dignified return of those who had fled and to ensure access for humanitarian aid.

111. As previously requested by the Council, the Secretary-General briefed the Council in December on developments in the situation in Rakhine State.

#### Europe

#### Bosnia and Herzegovina

112. In a debate in May, the High Representative for Bosnia and Herzegovina briefed the Council on his most recent six-month report on the implementation of the peace agreement, expressing concern about the lack of progress in addressing the need for real reforms.

113. In November, the Council held its debate on Bosnia and Herzegovina and adopted resolution 2384 (2017), by which it renewed the authorization of the multinational stabilization force (EUFOR-Althea) for an additional year. The High Representative briefed the Council on the latest developments.

#### Cyprus

114. The Council held meetings on Cyprus twice in 2017, in January and July, and each time extended by six months the mandate of the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus, by resolutions 2338 (2017) and 2369 (2017), respectively. In the latter, the Council extended the mandate until 31 January 2018 and

requested the Secretary-General to conduct a strategic review of the mission and provide recommendations on how it should be optimally configured to implement its mandate, and to report on the results of the review within four months.

# Letter dated 28 February 2014 from the Permanent Representative of Ukraine to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (\$/2014/136)

115. In February, the Council held a meeting during which the Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs gave a briefing on the situation in conflict-affected regions of Ukraine. The Chief Monitor of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) Special Monitoring Mission to Ukraine updated the Council on OSCE-related activities and ceasefire violations arising from the recent surge in fighting. The Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator informed the Council of the grave humanitarian situation in conflict-affected regions of Ukraine.

### Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999), 1244 (1999)

- 116. The Council held four meetings on the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK), in February, May, August and November.
- 117. In February, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of UNMIK briefed the Council and noted that there had been heightened tension between Belgrade and Pristina over the past several months. However, on a positive note, the European Union-facilitated dialogue between Belgrade and Pristina had resumed.
- 118. In May, the Special Representative told Council members that there had been a loss of trust between the two sides as well as an increase in nationalist rhetoric.
- 119. In August, the Special Representative presented the most recent report of the Secretary-General on UNMIK, welcoming the parliamentary elections held in Kosovo in June, and stressed the need to form a new government without delay, resume dialogue with Serbia and quell the rise in inflammatory nationalist rhetoric.
- 120. In November, the Special Representative spoke about the municipal elections held in Kosovo on 19 October and the current state of implementation of the European Union-facilitated dialogue between Belgrade and Pristina. Several Council members noted the improved political and security situation in Kosovo.

#### Middle East

### The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

- 121. The Council held monthly briefings under the agenda item on the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question. The Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, highlevel officials from the Department of Political Affairs of the Secretariat and other invited guests briefed the Council with a general concern for the aggregate situation on the ground.
- 122. Following the adoption of resolution 2334 (2016), the international community did not see the shift in behaviour among the parties that was called for in the resolution. Instead, the international community continued to witness the expansion of settlement activities, the demolition of Palestinian private properties and increasing violence between Israel and Palestine. These assessments were orally reported by the Special Coordinator to the Council in March, June, September and December.
- 123. In mid-July, an emergency consultation was convened by the Secretariat, in response to the immediate and dire humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip. The Special Coordinator briefed the Council on the alarming humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip. Members of the Council called for urgent action by all relevant parties in order to alleviate the suffering of the people in Gaza and welcomed the continued external support provided to Gaza. In November, speaking in reference to an intra-Palestinian reconciliation agreement reached in October, the Special Coordinator said that a genuine change in Gaza, including full Palestinian Authority control over security, would help to restore confidence in the feasibility of a comprehensive peace agreement.
- 124. The Jerusalem situation drew the attention of the Council throughout the year. In July, the Council discussed the situation in Jerusalem in consultations. The Special Coordinator briefed the Council on the latest developments with regard to the Haram al-Sharif. Council members expressed their grave concerns about the extremely fragile situation, the risk of escalation and the unfolding violence in the Old City of Jerusalem. Political and diplomatic efforts and utmost restraint were called for in order to calm the situation and avoid further escalation.
- 125. Late in July, the Council held an open debate, during which the Special Coordinator warned the Council that developments at holy sites in Jerusalem over the previous days had demonstrated the grave risk

of a dangerous escalation, including the transformation of the conflict into a religious one, emphasizing the risk of dragging Israel and Palestine and the rest of the region into a vortex of violence. He called for a focus on the need to restore a political perspective, to bring Israelis and Palestinians back into an environment conducive to negotiations on a final status arrangement and to avoid turning the national Israeli-Palestinian conflict into a religious one. Council members and speakers expressed their views.

126. A briefing was held in December, following the announcement by the United States of America of its decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel and to move its embassy to that city from Tel Aviv. The Special Coordinator reported that the position of the United Nations on the status of Jerusalem had not changed: it remained a final status issue for which a comprehensive, just and lasting solution must be achieved through negotiations between the parties, and on the basis of relevant United Nations resolutions and other agreements. Expressing concern about the potential risk of a violent escalation, he called on all parties to refrain from engaging in provocative actions and rhetoric. Council members exchanged views on the issue.

127. Later in December in a briefing and consultations, the Special Coordinator noted with regret that there had not been significant positive moves towards advancing peace, and the parties remained more divided than ever. Following the consultations, the Council took action on a draft resolution tabled by Egypt on the status of Jerusalem. The Council failed to adopt the draft resolution owing to the negative vote of one permanent member of the Council, leading to a recorded result of 14 in favour and 1 against.

### The situation in the Middle East (Syrian Arab Republic)

128. The Syrian Arab Republic was a significant focus for the Council in 2017. Meetings were held on the chemical weapons track, the humanitarian track and the political track nearly every month.

129. In February, the Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs and the Head of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons-United Nations Joint Investigative Mechanism briefed Council members on chemical weapons in the Syrian Arab Republic. The Council failed to adopt a draft resolution seeking to impose sanctions on individuals and entities associated with the Government of the Syrian Arab Republic. In April, the Council held a briefing on the reports of alleged use of chemical weapons in the Syrian Arab Republic,

following the chemical weapons attack in the Khan Shaykhun area of Idlib. The Council failed to adopt a draft resolution relating to the Khan Shaykhun attack. From August, the renewal of the mandate of the Joint Investigative Mechanism received particular attention by the Council. In October and November, the Council failed to adopt four draft resolutions by which it would have renewed the mandate of the Mechanism before its expiration on 17 November.

130. Throughout the year, a series of meetings was held in Geneva and Astana as part of the intra-Syrian talks and Astana dialogues. Nearly every month, the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General briefed the Council on the progress of the intra-Syrian talks. In January, the Council issued a statement to the press on the international meeting on the Syrian Arab Republic in Astana. The Council issued another statement to the press in March, mainly welcoming the announcement by the Special Envoy of a clear agenda for future negotiations, in accordance with resolution 2254 (2015). At the fourth round of Astana talks in Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran, and signed an agreement to create four "de-escalation zones" in the Syrian Arab Republic, which came into effect on 6 May.

131. The Council continued to receive monthly briefings on the implementation of resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014) and 2191 (2014) from the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and other officials from the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, who introduced the reports of the Secretary-General and detailed the humanitarian situation in the Syrian Arab Republic and the cross-line and cross-border humanitarian assistance. In December, the Council adopted resolution 2393 (2017), which renewed for a further period of one year the authorization established by the Council in resolution 2165 (2014) regarding cross-border and cross-line humanitarian access to the Syrian Arab Republic.

132. In April, the Council released a statement to the press condemning the terrorist attack in Rashidin, Syrian Arab Republic.

#### Iraq

133. In almost every month in 2017, the Council discussed various issues on Iraq, including the fight against ISIL, national reconciliation, chemical weapons issues, the humanitarian situation in Mosul and the plans of the Kurdistan Regional Government to unilaterally hold a referendum.

134. In February and July, the Council issued statements to the press, in which it condemned terrorist

attacks in Iraq. In September, the Council issued a statement to the press expressing concern over the potentially destabilizing impact of the plans of the Kurdistan Regional Government to unilaterally hold a referendum and, in October, it issued another expressing concern over recent reports of violence near the city of Kirkuk, Iraq. In June, the Council issued a statement to the press regarding the Iraq-Kuwait issue.

135. The Council extended the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq until 31 July 2018, by its resolution 2367 (2017) in July.

136. The Council adopted resolution 2390 (2017) in December to welcome the fact that the remaining funds in the escrow accounts established pursuant to resolution 1958 (2010) had been transferred to the Government of Iraq pursuant to resolution 2335 (2016).

#### Lebanon

137. The Council met regularly on Lebanon, including in consultations on resolutions 1559 (2004) and 1701 (2006) and on the operations of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL). In August, by resolution 2373 (2017), the Council extended the mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2018. The Council further authorized UNIFIL to take the steps necessary to ensure that its area of operations was not used for hostile activities of any kind, and requested the Secretary-General to explore ways to enhance the Force's efforts by increasing its visible presence.

138. The Council issued a statement to the press in December in which it welcomed the return of the Prime Minister, Saad Hariri, to Lebanon and his decision to continue his term. The Council also welcomed previous efforts, which contributed to the resumption of the Council of Ministers of Lebanon on 5 December. The Council also reaffirmed its support for the ongoing efforts of the Lebanese authorities to restore normal functioning of institutions and prepare for the holding of legislative elections by May 2018, and encouraged the international community to continue and increase its support for the political, social and economic stability of Lebanon.

#### **United Nations Disengagement Observer Force**

139. The Council met regularly on the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF). It adopted resolution 2361 (2017) in June, renewing the mandate of UNDOF for an additional six months, and resolution 2394 (2017) in December, by which it renewed the mandate for a further six months, until 30 June 2018. In those resolutions, the Council stressed the importance of full adherence to the Agreement on Disengagement of

Forces of 1974 and called upon both sides to exercise maximum restraint. The Council welcomed the progress made in returning UNDOF to its former headquarters at Camp Faouar, on the Bravo side of the area of separation.

#### Yemen

140. Throughout 2017, the continuing and escalated armed conflict in Yemen brought a deteriorating security situation and increased fragmentation and division among parties. As a result, the humanitarian crisis continuously worsened, with an outbreak of cholera and increasing threats of famine, and the expansion of Al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula and ISIL in Yemen was also witnessed. Despite the commitment and tireless efforts of the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen to bring the parties to negotiations with a view to ending the conflict in Yemen, there was unfortunately no significant progress on resuming political talks.

141. In February, by adopting resolution 2342 (2017), the Council renewed for one year, until 26 February 2018, the targeted sanctions measures imposed by resolution 2140 (2014).

142. In June, in presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/7), the Council expressed grave concern about the devastating humanitarian impact of the conflict on civilians and called on all parties to engage constructively with the Special Envoy's proposals for increasing commercial and humanitarian shipments through Red Sea ports, in order to allow safe, rapid and unhindered access for humanitarian supplies and personnel to all affected governorates. The Council also called on the parties to immediately agree on the modalities for a durable cessation of hostilities and to engage in peace talks in a flexible and constructive manner, without preconditions and in good faith.

143. In December, the Council issued a statement to the press, in which it condemned the ballistic missile attack by Houthi forces against Saudi Arabia, stressing that all Member States must fully implement all aspects of the arms embargo, as required.

#### Thematic issues

### **Briefing by the President of the International Court of Justice**

144. In October, the Council was briefed by the President of the International Court of Justice. The President outlined the overall work of the Court, focusing on the contributions of the Court to the

strategic priorities of working for peace, supporting sustainable development and reforming the internal management of the United Nations.

### **Briefing by the United Nations High Commissioner** for Refugees

145. In November, the Council was briefed by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, who said that the number of forcibly displaced people around the world was now approaching 66 million, and stressed that a full response to the prevailing mass displacement could be achieved only through action to restore security, resolve conflict and build peace.

#### Children and armed conflict

146. During the open debate on children and armed conflict held in October, the Council reiterated its strong condemnation of all violations of applicable international law involving the recruitment and use of children by parties to armed conflict, killing and maiming, rape and other forms of sexual violence, abductions, attacks against schools and hospitals and denial of humanitarian access by parties to armed presidential conflict. Issuing a statement (S/PRST/2017/21), the Council stated that the protection of children in armed conflict should be an important aspect of any comprehensive strategy to resolve conflict and sustain peace, and remained deeply concerned over the lack of progress on the ground where parties to conflict continued to violate with impunity the relevant provisions of applicable international law relating to the rights and protection of children. It also called upon all parties to armed conflict to allow and facilitate safe, timely and unhindered humanitarian access to children.

## Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security

147. The Council convened several open briefings and was briefed by the Chair-in-Office of OSCE in February; the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy in May; the Chef de Cabinet of the Executive Office of the Secretary-General, the Commissioner for Peace and Security of the African Union and the African Union High Representative for the Peace Fund in June; and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General to the African Union and Head of the United Nations Office to the African Union in September.

### **Election of five members of the International Court of Justice**

148. In November, following several simultaneous rounds of voting in the Council and in the General Assembly, the President of the Council announced that both the Council and the General Assembly had agreed on the following four candidates: Mr. Ronny Abraham, Mr. Antônio Augusto Cançado Trindade, Mr. Nawaf Salam and Mr. Abdulqawi Ahmed Yusuf. Thus they were elected as members of the International Court of Justice for a term of office of nine years, beginning on 6 February 2018.

149. After several further rounds of voting, the President of the Council was notified by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland of its decision to withdraw the nomination of Mr. Christopher Greenwood. The Council and the General Assembly then simultaneously held one further round of voting, also in November, and elected Mr. Dalveer Bhandari to the International Court of Justice for a term of office of nine years, beginning on 6 February 2018.

#### General issues relating to sanctions

150. In August, the Council held a briefing on general issues relating to sanctions. The Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs addressed the meeting, and Council members expressed views on the subject.

### International Tribunals for Rwanda and the Former Yugoslavia

151. In June, the Council heard a briefing by the President of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991, the President of the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals and the Prosecutor of the Tribunal and the Mechanism, during which concerns about war crimes denial and failure to cooperate with national authorities were expressed. Some Council members called for bolstered efforts to apprehend the eight fugitives indicted by the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda.

152. In December, the Council was briefed by the President of the International Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia, the President of the Mechanism and the Prosecutor of the Tribunal and the Mechanism on their work. Some Council members commended the accomplishments of the Tribunal; one member raised the issue of double standards in the Tribunal.

153. The Tribunal completed its work on 31 December and the Council issued a press statement to mark that closure.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: conflict prevention and sustaining peace

154. The Council convened an open debate on conflict prevention and sustaining peace in January, during which the Secretary-General gave his first address to the Council since taking office, setting restoring trust and preventing crises as United Nations priorities.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: conflicts in Europe

155. In February, the Council held an open debate on the maintenance of international peace and security. With the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Ukraine presiding, the meeting sought to assess existing threats to regional and international peace and security caused by conflicts in Europe. It was also intended to review responses to ongoing instability and to dangerous developments within European countries in post-conflict or protracted conflict situations. The Secretary-General, the Secretary-General of OSCE and the Secretary-General of the European External Action Service of the European Union briefed the Council.

#### Maintenance of international peace and security: destruction and trafficking of cultural heritage by terrorist groups and in situations of armed conflict

156. In March, the Council held a briefing on the unlawful destruction of cultural heritage, religious sites and artefacts and the smuggling of cultural property by terrorist groups during armed conflict. The Council adopted resolution 2347 (2017) before the briefing, in which it recalled its condemnation of any engagement in trade involving ISIL, the Nusrah Front and all other individuals or groups associated with Al-Qaida.

157. In November, the Council held a briefing on destruction of world heritage sites and illicit trafficking in cultural objects to finance terrorism and criminal networks by terrorists, particularly in armed conflict situations.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: general issues

158. The Council convened two meetings in March and October, highlighting the alarming levels of food insecurity and threat of famine in north-eastern Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan and Yemen and issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/14) in August, in which it expressed its grave concern about the

unprecedented level of global humanitarian needs and the threat of famine currently facing more than 20 million people in those countries or areas. The Council further emphasized that ongoing conflicts and violence have devastating humanitarian consequences and hinder an effective humanitarian response in the short, medium and long term and are therefore a major cause of famine in the above-mentioned situations, and called upon all parties to urgently take steps that would enable a more effective humanitarian response.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: human rights and prevention of armed conflict

159. In April, the Council heard a briefing on maintenance of international peace and security by the Secretary-General, with a focus on human rights and prevention of armed conflict.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: mine action

160. In June, there was a briefing by the Assistant Secretary-General for Rule of Law and Security Institutions and an official of the Mine Action Service in Colombia on a comprehensive approach to mine action and explosive hazard threat mitigation. Council members called upon all parties to work together to address the humanitarian concerns arising from landmines, explosive remnants of war and improvised explosive devices.

161. In June, the Council adopted resolution 2365 (2017), in which it expressed grave concern over the threat that landmines, explosive remnants of war and improvised explosive devices posed to civilians and stressed the need to take appropriate measures to mitigate that danger effectively.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: preventive diplomacy and transboundary waters

162. The Council convened an open debate in June highlighting the scarcity of water and the need for cooperation in managing transboundary water resources.

### Maintenance of international peace and security: trafficking in persons in situations of conflict

163. The Council held two open debates on trafficking in persons in situations of conflict, in March and November, adopted resolution 2388 (2017) in November and convened two briefings on the matter in November.

## Maintenance of international peace and security: addressing complex contemporary challenges to international peace and security

164. The Council held an open debate in December to discuss how it could better address complex contemporary challenges to international peace and security. The Secretary-General briefed the Council.

#### Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction

165. In March, the Council was briefed by the Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004) on the work of the Committee. Council members expressed concern about the likelihood that non-State actors, particularly terrorist groups, could acquire, manufacture or use weapons of mass destruction.

166. In June, the Council held an open debate on the global effort to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction by non-State actors. The Council heard statements highlighting proliferation threats, including relevant developments in science and technology, intangible technology transfer and proliferation financing.

167. In September, the Council held a ministerial-level meeting on the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. Council members discussed ways to strengthen efforts to prevent proliferation of weapons of mass destruction.

#### Non-proliferation: Islamic Republic of Iran

168. In January, June and December, the Council held three open briefings. The Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs gave a briefing on the reports of the Secretary-General on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015). The Security Council Facilitator for the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015) gave a briefing on his reports on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015). A representative of the European Union delegation to the United Nations gave a briefing on the implementation of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action.

169. In January and April, two informal consultations were held by the Council members on the ballistic missile test and space launch conducted by the Islamic Republic of Iran.

### Non-proliferation: Democratic People's Republic of Korea

170. In April and December, the Council held two ministerial-level meetings on the theme "Non-proliferation: Democratic People's Republic of Korea". In September, the Council had one open

briefing on the nuclear test conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. In July and November, the Council had two open briefings on the missile launches conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

171. Urgent informal consultations were held in February, March, May, August and September, following the continuation of ballistic missile launches conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, in violation of relevant Council resolutions.

172. The Council adopted resolution 2356 (2017) in June in response to a series of ballistic missile launches and other activities conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea since 9 September 2016.

173. The Council adopted resolution 2371 (2017) in August in response to the ballistic missile launches by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 3 July and 28 July, which the Democratic People's Republic of Korea had stated were launches of intercontinental ballistic missiles.

174. The Council adopted resolution 2375 (2017) in September in response to the nuclear test conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 2 September.

175. The Council adopted resolution 2397 (2017) in December in response to the ballistic missile launch conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 28 November.

176. On 29 August, the Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/16) in response to the ballistic missile launch conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 28 August, as well as the multiple ballistic missile launches conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on 25 August.

177. The Council issued eight press statements throughout the year on the ballistic missile launches and engine test conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

178. The Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) gave briefings to Council members on the work of the Committee in February, May and September. The Council adopted resolution 2345 (2017) in March, by which it extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts and expanded it to include the new measures adopted in resolution 2321 (2016).

#### Peacebuilding and sustaining peace

179. In June, the Council held the annual briefing on peacebuilding and sustaining peace. The Chair of the

Peacebuilding Commission briefed the Council on the work of the Peacebuilding Commission.

#### Protection of civilians in armed conflict

180. The Council convened an open debate in May, with a focus on protection of civilians and medical care in armed conflict, following the submission of the report of the Secretary-General on the protection of civilians in armed conflict.

#### Small arms

181. In December, the Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs gave a briefing on small arms. The Council members stressed the importance of global action to prevent and combat the illicit trade in small arms and light weapons and supported the full implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects and the International Tracing Instrument.

### Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts

182. In February, the Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs on United Nations counter-terrorism efforts in support of Member States against ISIL, followed by consultations. The briefing was based on the strategic-level report of the Secretary-General, submitted pursuant to resolution 2253 (2015).

183. In February, the Council held an open debate on the protection of critical infrastructure against terrorist attacks and called upon Member States to address the risk of terrorist attacks against critical infrastructure. The Council adopted resolution 2341 (2017) before the open debate.

184. In May, the Council adopted resolution 2354 (2017), in which it welcomed the new framework developed by its Counter-Terrorism Committee and urged Member States to follow a number of concrete guidelines aimed at countering the narratives used by terrorist groups and amplifying positive and credible alternatives to audiences vulnerable to extremist messages.

185. In July, the Council adopted resolution 2368 (2017), by which it renewed and updated the ISIL and Al-Qaida sanctions regime, pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015). The resolution is an update to resolution 2253 (2015), in which the Council decided that it would review the sanctions

measures "with a view to their possible further strengthening" within 18 months of adoption.

186. In August, the Council held a briefing on the theme "Threats to international peace and security: preventing terrorists from acquiring weapons". The Council adopted resolution 2370 (2017), in which it reaffirmed its previous decision in resolution 1373 (2001) that all States should refrain from providing any form of support to those involved in terrorist acts, including by eliminating the supply of weapons to terrorists.

187. In August, the Council issued a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/15), in which it affirmed that, having reviewed the implementation of the measures outlined in resolution 2255 (2015) on its sanctions against Taliban affiliates, no further adjustments were necessary at that time.

188. In September, the Council adopted resolution 2379 (2017), in which it requested the Secretary-General to establish an independent investigative team headed by a Special Adviser, to support domestic efforts to hold ISIL accountable for its actions in Iraq.

189. In September, the Chair of the Counter-Terrorism Committee and the Secretary-General of the International Civil Aviation Organization, briefed the Council on security in civil aviation at an open meeting.

190. In September, the Council held a briefing on strengthening the coordination and coherence of counter-terrorism efforts through the Office of Counter-Terrorism. The Under-Secretary-General for Counter-Terrorism, the Chair of the Counter-Terrorism Committee and the Officer-in-Charge of the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate briefed the Council on related issues.

191. In November, the Council held a briefing on returning foreign terrorist fighters and called upon the international community to step up cooperation to address the complex problem of foreign terrorist fighters returning home or travelling to other regions.

192. In December, the Council adopted resolution 2395 (2017) to renew the mandate of the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate, the expert body that supports the Council's counter-terrorism architecture, until 31 December 2021.

193. In December, the Council adopted resolution 2396 (2017), expressed concern about the issue of foreign terrorist fighters connected to ISIL, the Nusrah Front and other cells, affiliates, splinter groups or derivatives, and urged Member States to step up implementation of resolution 2178 (2014).

#### United Nations peacekeeping operations

194. In 2017, the Council held five briefings and two open debates on United Nations peacekeeping operations and adopted two resolutions, resolutions 2378 (2017) and 2382 (2017). The Council also adopted a presidential statement (S/PRST/2017/27) on peacekeeping operations, as well as a press statement on environmental management of peacekeeping operations.

195. In April, the Council was briefed by the Secretary-General on the United Nations peacekeeping operations review. In October and December, the Council was briefed on strategic force generation and on capacity gaps in United Nations peacekeeping operations by the Under-Secretary-General and the Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations, respectively. In May and November, the Council held its annual dialogues with United Nations peacekeeping operations Force Commanders and Police Commissioners, respectively.

196. In August, the Council held an open debate to discuss the potential contribution of United Nations peacekeeping operations to the overarching goal of sustaining peace. The Deputy Secretary-General, the former Chair of the Advisory Group of Experts on the Review of the Peacebuilding Architecture and a member of the High-level Independent Panel on Peace Operations briefed the Council.

197. In September, the Council held a high-level open debate on United Nations peacekeeping operations reform and was briefed by the Secretary-General, the Chairperson of the African Union Commission and the former Chair of the High-level Independent Panel on Peace Operations.

#### Women and peace and security

198. In May, the Council held an open debate on sexual violence in conflicts. The Deputy Secretary-General and the Under-Secretary-General and Special Adviser to the Secretary-General on the Prevention of Genocide briefed the Council. The objective of the debate was to raise awareness of the issue of sexual violence in conflict as a tactic of war and terrorism, focusing particularly on patterns and trends identified in the annual report of the Secretary-General on conflict-related sexual violence.

199. In October, the Council held its annual open debate on women and peace and security. The Chef de Cabinet of the Secretary-General, the Executive Director of UN-Women, the Secretary-General of the International Organization of la Francophonie and a civil society representative briefed the Council. Member

States welcomed the progress made since the adoption of resolution 1325 (2000) regarding the normative frameworks to empower and protect women, called for further implementation of the women and peace and security agenda and emphasized the importance of women's participation.

#### Other matters

#### **Annual report of the Security Council**

200. On 9 August, the Council adopted its annual report for the period from 1 August 2015 to 31 December 2016. The delegation of Japan, as the President of the Council for the month of July 2016, was responsible for coordinating the preparation of the introduction to the draft report and noted that it covered the 17-month period as a transitional arrangement and that, as stipulated in the note by the President dated 10 December 2015 (S/2015/944), the period of coverage for all future reports would be from 1 January to On 28 August, 31 December. the Permanent Representative of Egypt, in his capacity as President of the Council for the month, presented the annual report to the General Assembly.

### Implementation of the note by the President of the Security Council (\$/2010/507)

201. The Council held two formal wrap-up sessions in February and August, to review its work and consider how it could improve its efficiency and effectiveness, in particular in dealing with country-specific situations, conflict prevention and its working methods.

202. By the end of August, the Council had reached agreement on a new version of the compendium of its working methods, commonly referred to as "note 507". The document was prepared under the leadership of Japan, in its capacity as Chair of the Informal Working Group on Documentation and Other Procedural Questions, in which most discussions on the Council's working methods are held. On 30 August, the Council issued a press statement on the adoption of the revised note (S/2017/507).

#### Subsidiary bodies

203. In May, the three Chairs of the terrorism-related committees briefed the Council on their ongoing duties, cooperation and goals for the future.

204. In December, the six outgoing non-permanent members (Egypt, Italy, Japan, Senegal, Ukraine and Uruguay) briefed the Council on the work of the committees that they had chaired.

# Part IV Report of the Military Staff Committee

# I. Introduction

1. The present report of the Military Staff Committee covers the period from 1 January to 31 December 2017.

# II. Background

2. The Military Staff Committee was established pursuant to Article 47 of the Charter of the United Nations and Security Council resolution 1 (1946). The Committee has a mandate to advise and assist the Security Council on all questions relating to the Council's military requirements for the maintenance of international peace and security, the employment and command of forces placed at its disposal, the regulation of armaments, and possible disarmament.

# III. Summary of the activities of the Committee

- 3. The Committee functioned continuously under its revised draft statue and revised draft rules of procedure, contained in document S/115 of 1 August 1946, during the period under review. The Committee held a total of 30 meetings and discussed a total of 37 topics (55 agenda items). During the reporting period, the Committee conducted two field missions to current United Nations peacekeeping operations.
- 4. Military representatives of the elected members of the Security Council participated in 25 meetings. Representatives of Secretariat departments participated in discussions: the Department of Peacekeeping Operations on 21 topics, the Department of Political Affairs on 4 topics and the Department of Field Support on 1 topic.
- 5. Current United Nations peacekeeping and special political missions were the focus of 23 meetings:
  - (a) African Union Mission in Somalia: one meeting;
  - (b) United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara: one meeting;
- (c) United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic: one meeting;
- (d) United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali: one meeting;
  - (e) United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti: two meetings;
- (f) United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo: one meeting;
  - (g) United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan: one meeting;
  - (h) United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq: one meeting;
  - (i) African Union-United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur: one meeting;
  - (j) United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF): two meetings;
  - (k) United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP): two meetings;
  - (1) United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL): one meeting;

- (m) United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei: two meetings;
- (n) United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS): one meeting;
- (o) United Nations Military Observer Group in India and Pakistan: one meeting;
- (p) United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire: one meeting;
- (q) United Nations Support Mission in Libya: one meeting;
- (r) United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia: one meeting;
- (s) United Nations Truce Supervision Organization (UNTSO): one meeting.
- 6. Eleven meetings included various thematic debates:
  - (a) Challenges in the planning of peacekeeping operations;
  - (b) Command and control in peacekeeping operations;
- (c) Communication of United Nations peacekeeping operations with the civilian population;
  - (d) Improvised explosive device defeat within peacekeeping operations;
- (e) Intelligence in the context of peacekeeping operations: assessment capabilities in the Department of Peacekeeping Operations;
  - (f) Military components in modern peacekeeping operations;
  - (g) Partnership with the European Union Military Staff;
  - (h) Predeployment training: striving for uniformity;
  - (i) Protection of civilians in armed conflict;
  - (j) Strategic force generation;
  - (k) United Nations peacekeeping operations budget.
- 7. The Committee conducted two missions to areas of current United Nations peacekeeping operations.
- 8. During the first mission, the Committee visited South Sudan from 1 to 5 March. The primary purpose of the visit was to gain an in-depth understanding of UNMISS and its capabilities.
- 9. During the second mission, the Committee visited the Mediterranean, with stops in Israel, Cyprus, Lebanon and Italy, from 14 to 22 November. The primary objectives of the mission were to gain an in-depth understanding of UNTSO, UNDOF, UNFICYP, UNIFIL and the Global Service Centre in Brindisi, Italy, and to assess the military challenges and opportunities for those missions in executing mandates, the appropriate allocation of resources and infrastructure, plans for the future of the missions and conditions that might prompt a change in the structure of the forces.
- 10. The Committee continued to announce all meetings and provisional agendas in the Journal of the United Nations and on its website (www.un.org/sc/suborg/en/subsidiary/msc), which is available in the six official languages of the United Nations and offers swift and easy access to the programme of work and current information on the Committee.
- 11. In accordance with paragraph 178 of General Assembly resolution 60/1 entitled "2005 World Summit Outcome", the Committee continued to consider its composition, mandate and working methods.
- 12. The Committee remained prepared to carry out the functions assigned to it under the terms of Article 47 of the Charter.
