Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

The present report contains information received from Member States on their military expenditures for the latest fiscal year for which data are available. The Secretary-General has, to date, received reports from 28 Governments.

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I. Introduction

1. In paragraph 2 of its resolution 72/20, the General Assembly called upon Member States to provide the Secretary-General, by 30 April annually, with a report on their military expenditures for the latest fiscal year for which data were available, using, preferably and to the extent possible, one of the online reporting forms, including, if appropriate, a nil report or the “single-figure” report on military expenditures or any other format developed in the context of similar reporting on military expenditures to other international or regional organizations.

II. Actions taken by the Secretariat

2. In a note verbale dated 7 February 2019 addressed to Member States, the Secretariat sought the above-mentioned information. The Secretariat followed up on the matter through an email reminder on 11 May and reminders posted on social media and on the website of the Office for Disarmament Affairs in May. The replies received are reproduced in section III below. Any additional replies received after 30 April will be posted on the website of the Office in the original language received.

3. The Office continued to maintain the online database for military expenditures and the online reporting tool (available from www.un.org/disarmament/milex). During the reporting period, the Office began the process of upgrading those online tools, which is expected to be concluded by November 2019. The use of the online tool by Member States to submit their reports has further increased (see table 1).

4. The Office continued its efforts to promote the instrument among Member States, including through briefings held on the margins of the meetings of the First Committee and the Third United Nations Conference to Review Progress Made in the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects.

III. Replies received from Governments

Explanatory notes

5. As at the date of submission of the present report, the Secretary-General had received national reports from 28 Governments, 2 of which had submitted single-figure reports and 1 a nil report. Some States provided clarifications and additional information on defence planning to explain their military expenditures. Those are also included in the present report.

6. The originals of the replies from States, if received by means other than the online reporting system, are on file with the Office for Disarmament Affairs.

7. As at the date of submission of the present report, the following Member States had submitted replies to the questionnaire circulated by the Office, pursuant to paragraph 8 (c) of General Assembly resolution 72/20: Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czechia, Dominican Republic, Finland, France, Hungary, Jamaica, Liechtenstein, Madagascar, Philippines, Switzerland and Turkey.

Related policies

Fiscal year 2018

The State budget of Czechia for fiscal year 2018 was approved by Parliament in Act No. 474/2017 for a total of 1,364,497,641,000 koruny. The Ministry of Defence budget for fiscal year 2018 was approved for a total of 58,893,351,000 koruny. The actual outlays under the Ministry budget totalled 59,799,438,000 koruny, and the 2018/17 index was 1.12. The military expenditures for fiscal year 2018, based on the definition of the Vienna document and in line with United Nations methodology, represented a total of 59,703,838,670 koruny.

Fiscal year 2019

The State budget of Czechia for fiscal year 2019 was approved by Parliament and published in Act No. 336/2018. The total amount of State budget expenditures is 1,505,359,072,000 koruny, and the 2019/18 index is 1.10.

The 2019 Ministry of Defence budget amounts to 66,734,801,000 koruny, and the 2019/18 index is 1.13.

The military expenditures, defined in the Vienna document based on the United Nations methodology, represent 66,638,171,520 koruny for fiscal year 2019.

Related policies

In the white paper on defence of March 2018 we outlined our plans to modernize the armed forces and regain the trust of our personnel. We are investing in our people, resources and means. In 2019, an additional structural €1.2 billion will be made available, of which approximately €300 million will go towards improving support for the armed forces and more than €200 million will be spent on employment practices and occupational safety. More than €700 million will be invested in modernizing the armed forces.

As set out in the white paper, the defence organization will invest in its people, resources and means over the coming years. Important elements in that regard are the execution of the plan of action for a safe defence organization and the plan of action for retention and recruitment.

During the Government's current term of office we will also continue our efforts to increase the operational readiness of the armed forces (are we ready to do what is needed?) and to modernize our striking power. This will put the armed forces in order with the aim of becoming a high-tech, information-driven organization.

The priorities relating to armed forces resources are:

- (a) The armed forces remain versatile because threats vary greatly in nature and intensity and the security situation is in a state of flux;
- (b) First we will modernize the weapons systems that we currently own. Our adversaries have access to increasing number of high-quality, technically sophisticated weapons. We must be able to reciprocate to keep our own people as safe as possible;
- (c) We will become increasingly information-driven with a solid information technology infrastructure.

We will enhance our striking power and sustainability by investing in the modernization and replacement of our resources. We will also innovate. We are investing in capabilities to improve our intelligence position and our situational awareness. A solid information technology infrastructure is one of the aspects that will make information-driven operations more feasible. Furthermore, we are investing in capabilities that will help us to deal with present-day and future threats in the cyberspace and information domains. We always invest in accordance with a defence materiel selection process that ensures that the efficacy and efficiency of our investments are taken into account. For many non-mandated projects, the defence organization also compares a number of alternatives as part of a cost-benefit analysis.

We are reserving a minimum of 20 per cent of the defence budget for expenditure on investments, which meets the guidelines of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The moving five-year average of the estimated investment quotient will develop as follows during this budget period: moving five-year average of the estimated investment quotient. This five-year average is calculated from the average of the current and four prior years.
