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Introduction

1. Mindful of its primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security, the Security Council continued to engage on a wide-reaching agenda in accordance with the principles and objectives set forth in the Charter of the United Nations. During the period from 1 January to 31 December 2019, the Council held 258 meetings. The Council adopted 52 resolutions and 15 presidential statements and issued 67 statements to the press. During the reporting period, the Council conducted five missions. The Council visited Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea-Bissau in February; Burkina Faso and Mali in March; Iraq and Kuwait in June; Colombia in July; and Ethiopia and South Sudan in October. On 22 October, during the visit to Ethiopia, the Council and the Peace and Security Council of the African Union held their thirteenth annual joint consultative meeting, which was focused on the Central African Republic, Libya, South Sudan and the Sahel.

2. In 2019, the international situation remained quite turbulent. The Council continued to focus on a number of serious unresolved conflicts, in particular in the Middle East, Africa and Latin America. During the reporting period, the situations in Iraq, Libya, the Syrian Arab Republic and Yemen and the Palestinian question drew the attention of the Council. The impact of those conflicts remained severe. Common ground was not always within reach, especially on the most sensitive and high-profile issues.

3. The situations in Africa remained a focus of the Council. Frequent meetings were held on the Central African Republic, Libya and South Sudan. The importance of close cooperation with the African Union was a key theme of many Council discussions on Africa in 2019.

4. The Council considered the situation in Cyprus and continued to monitor the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) and the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

5. The Council considered the situation in Haiti, with a specific focus on the transition from the United Nations Mission for Justice Support in Haiti (MINUJUSTH) to its successor, the United Nations Integrated Office in Haiti (BINUH). The Council continued to monitor the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia.

6. The Council continued addressing a broad range of threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts. Special attention was paid to countering the financing of terrorism and other related challenges, including eliminating the supply of weapons and other

resources to terrorists, the impact of terrorism on humanitarian assistance and addressing the potential nexus between terrorism and organized crime.

7. The Council continued to discuss issues related to non-proliferation, the protection of civilians in armed conflict, peacekeeping and peacebuilding, sanctions and cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations.

The present introduction does not seek to provide an exhaustive list of meetings, developments or Council responses and actions. It is intended as a succinct and useful overview of key developments. Unless otherwise indicated, resolutions referred to in this introduction were adopted unanimously.

Africa

9. The Council was briefed concerning the political, socioeconomic and humanitarian situation in Burundi in February, June and October. According to the briefers, the security situation in the country remained generally calm, with a trend towards improvement, although a number of human rights violations continued to be reported. Some progress had been made in repatriating refugees and the Government had initiated serious preparatory efforts for the elections planned for 20 May 2020. The socioeconomic and humanitarian situation in the country remained difficult, with about 1.8 million people in need of humanitarian assistance. In October, the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Burundi, Michel Kafando, declared the end of his mission and stepped down. At the same time, the United Nations maintained its presence in Burundi.

10. The Council acknowledged the role of the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa in promoting inclusive political dialogue in non-mission settings such as Cameroon, Chad, the Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon and Sao Tome and Principe. In June, August and December, the Council discussed the multifarious challenges facing Central Africa and ways to assist the countries of the subregion in consolidating peace, resolving tensions and preventing political crises.

11. During 2019, the Council focused its work on support for regional and international efforts to assist the implementation of the Political Agreement for Peace and Reconciliation in the Central African Republic, which had been negotiated in Khartoum under the auspices of the African Union and signed by representatives of the authorities of the Central African Republic and 14 armed groups in Bangui on 6 February 2019. In February, in a statement to the press, the Council welcomed the signing of the Agreement and urged the stakeholders to implement it. In March, in a statement to the press, the Council welcomed the consensus reached by the signatory parties regarding the formation of an inclusive Government. During 2019, the security and humanitarian challenges in the Central African Republic also remained in the focus of the Council.

12. In November, the Council adopted resolution [2499 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA) until 15 November 2020 and authorized MINUSCA to support the implementation of the Political Agreement for Peace and Reconciliation and assist the authorities of the Central African Republic in the preparation and delivery of the presidential, legislative and local elections in 2020 and 2021.

13. With regard to the sanctions regime, in January, the Council adopted resolution [2454 \(2019\)](#), in which it decided to extend the sanctions regime in relation to the Central African Republic until 31 January 2020. In April, the Council issued a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/3](#)), in which it established benchmarks and conducted a review of the arms embargo, which led to the adoption of resolution [2488 \(2019\)](#), in which the Council eased the arms embargo measures on the Government of the Central African Republic.

14. In Darfur, although the security situation improved overall, the region witnessed local clashes between government forces and the armed opposition, in addition to displacement and criminality. The Council closely monitored the political developments in Khartoum, including the establishment of transitional institutions, and their possible implications for the Darfur region. In June, the Council issued a statement to the press strongly condemning the recent violence in the Sudan and expressing regret for the loss of lives and injuries among civilians. In August, the Council issued a statement to the press commending the commitment of the people of the Sudan to a peaceful transition and encouraged the parties to resume negotiations towards peaceful solutions to the conflicts in Darfur, Southern Kordofan and Blue Nile.

15. In February, in its resolution [2455 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended until 12 March 2020 the mandate of the Panel of Experts on the Sudan. Also in that resolution, the Council expressed its intention to establish benchmarks that could serve in guiding it to review the measures on Darfur. The drawdown of the African Union-United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur (UNAMID) and the process of moving from peacekeeping to peacebuilding activities in the region in the light of the overall developments in the country was the focus of Council discussions on Darfur in 2019. In June, the Council adopted resolution [2479 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of UNAMID for four months. In October, by its resolution [2495 \(2019\)](#) and in response to the request by the Government of the Sudan, the Council further extended the mandate of UNAMID until 31 October 2020 and expressed its intention to decide by 31 March 2020 on courses of action regarding the responsible drawdown and exit of UNAMID and on establishing a follow-on presence to UNAMID.

16. The Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court briefed the Council in relation to the situation in Darfur in June and December.

17. The situation in South Sudan remained a focus of the Council, which maintained its firm support for the efforts of the African Union and the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) to address the crisis and assist the South Sudanese parties in implementing the Revitalized Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in South Sudan of 12 September 2018. The Council remained concerned by sporadic armed clashes across the country and repeatedly called upon the parties to uphold the Agreement on Cessation of Hostilities, Protection of Civilians and Humanitarian Access of 21 December 2017.

18. In March, by 14 votes in favour and with 1 abstention, the Council adopted resolution [2459 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan until 15 March 2020.

19. In May, the Council adopted resolution [2471 \(2019\)](#), by 10 votes in favour and with 5 abstentions. By that resolution, the Council renewed the sanctions measures until 31 May 2020 and the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 30 June 2020.

20. In October, the Council issued a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/11](#)), in which it underlined that the Revitalized Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in South Sudan was an important step forward in the peace process in the country. The Council welcomed the initial progress in implementing the Agreement and called upon the parties to form a transitional Government of national unity, as required

by the Agreement. The Council also called upon the parties to expedite the implementation of transitional security arrangements and to continue consultations towards a common solution regarding the number and boundaries of states.

21. In November, the parties to the Agreement decided to extend the pre-transitional period by 100 days, which was approved by IGAD. In that regard, the Council issued a statement to the press in which it expressed disappointment that the parties had failed to form a revitalized transitional Government of national unity by the 12 November deadline, and emphasized that full implementation of all provisions of the Agreement would set the country towards the goals of peace, stability, justice and development.

22. The Council continued to lend its support to the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) as an essential tool for the stability of the border regions between the Sudan and South Sudan. In April, by its resolution [2465 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended until 15 October 2019 the support provided by UNISFA to the Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism. In May, by its resolution [2469 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended the mandate of UNISFA until 15 November 2019 and reduced the troop ceiling to 3,550, while increasing the police ceiling to 640 personnel. In October, by its resolution [2492 \(2019\)](#), the Council renewed until 15 November 2019 the support provided by UNISFA to the Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism. In November, by its resolution [2497 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended the UNISFA mandate, including the support to the Mechanism, until 15 May 2020, maintained the troop ceiling at 3,550 and decided to postpone the withdrawal of the additional 295 troops.

23. The situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and its implications for security in the Great Lakes region was a focus of the work of the Council. The Council followed closely the situation in the country after the presidential elections, which were held at the end of December 2018. In January, in a statement to the press, the members of the Council welcomed the peaceful holding of the elections. Noting the disputes lodged before the Constitutional Court, they encouraged all concerned stakeholders to take up any reservations through the proper mechanisms and processes provided for in the Constitution of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and its electoral law. In August, in another statement to the press, the Council welcomed the efforts of the President, Félix Tshisekedi, towards reconciliation, the steps he had taken to open political space and his initiatives to promote regional cooperation. In a statement to the press in October, the

members of the Council welcomed the inauguration of the new coalition Government and encouraged it to place the needs of the Congolese people above the pursuit of partisan interests. In addition, the members of the Council called on the Armed Forces of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (FARDC) to strengthen their efforts to tackle armed groups and called upon FARDC and the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) to work together more effectively.

24. The security situation remained fragile in the east of the country, notably in North Kivu, South Kivu and Ituri provinces. On 30 October, after concentrating over 20,000 troops in Beni territory, FARDC launched a unilateral offensive operation against the Allied Democratic Forces (ADF), to which the ADF responded with attacks against civilians and Ebola response teams. The significant number of civilian casualties resulting from the ADF attacks was one of the main triggers of the violent demonstrations against MONUSCO that took place in Beni in mid-November and December. The Council reviewed the situation in Beni in closed consultations twice. In March, the Council adopted resolution [2463 \(2019\)](#), in which it requested the Secretary-General to conduct and provide it with an independent strategic review of MONUSCO by 20 October 2019, and reaffirmed that the Mission's strategic priorities should remain the protection of civilians and support to the stabilization and strengthening of State institutions and to governance and security reforms. It also extended the mandate of the Mission for nine months.

25. In October, the Secretary-General submitted to the Council the independent strategic review report prepared by a team of experts headed by Youssef Mahmoud ([S/2019/842](#)). The report contained recommendations on adjustments to the Mission and the responsible and phased drawdown of MONUSCO. It also included best- and worst-case scenarios for the situation on the ground and options for the future configuration of MONUSCO.

26. In December, the Council adopted resolution [2502 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of MONUSCO, including its Intervention Brigade, until 20 December 2020. Also in that resolution, the Council took note of the independent strategic review and requested the Government and the Secretary-General to articulate a joint strategy to specify the conditions needed for the drawdown of MONUSCO and its eventual exit from the country. The Council also reduced the troop ceiling of the Mission to 14,000 military personnel and decided that protection of

civilians should remain one of the strategic priorities of MONUSCO, including its Intervention Brigade. It also welcomed the Secretary-General's decision to send an evaluation mission to assess the ability of the Intervention Brigade to effectively deliver on its mandate to protect civilians.

27. The Council continued to support the sanctions regime against the Democratic Republic of the Congo. On 26 June, the Council adopted resolution [2478 \(2019\)](#), renewing until 1 July 2020 the sanctions imposed against the designated individuals and entities. It also decided to extend the mandate of the Group of Experts on the Democratic Republic of the Congo until 1 August 2020.

28. The Council continued to monitor the humanitarian situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo closely, including a new outbreak of Ebola. On 31 July, it held an informal interactive dialogue on the matter. On 2 August, the Council adopted a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/6](#)), in which it expressed grave concern about the Ebola virus outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and emphasized the need for broad cooperation in the response. Also in that presidential statement, the Council expressed its serious concern regarding the attacks on humanitarian and medical personnel engaged in medical duties and stressed the need for Governments and civil society in affected and at-risk countries to improve their preparedness, as well as to implement optimal vaccine strategies.

29. The Council continued to follow relations between Djibouti and Eritrea. In February and August, the Secretary-General updated the Council on the developments towards the normalization of relations between the two countries. During the reporting period, the situation on the border remained stable and the two countries refrained from any negative rhetoric and continued maintaining diplomatic relations. The remaining differences should be solved through dialogue.

30. The Council followed the political, humanitarian and security situation in Somalia closely. It noted, in particular, the importance of security sector, economic and political reforms. The significance of strengthening the cooperation between the Federal Government of Somalia and the federal member states was a consistent theme of Council discussions throughout the year. In a statement to the press in January, the Council expressed its regret at the decision of the Federal Government of Somalia to declare the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia, Nicholas Haysom, *persona non grata*, underlined its full support for the

United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSOM) and its mandate and underscored the strong and continued commitment of the international community to supporting peace, stability and development in the country.

31. The security situation in Somalia remained a source of deep concern for the Council. In statements to the press in March and December, the Council condemned terrorist attacks in Mogadishu. In July, the Council condemned a similar attack in the port city of Kismayo.

32. In March, the Council adopted resolution [2461 \(2019\)](#), by which it renewed the mandate of UNSOM until 31 March 2020.

33. The Council remained committed to supporting a conditions-based transition of security responsibilities from the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM) to Somali security institutions. In May, the Council adopted resolution [2472 \(2019\)](#), in which it decided to reduce the authorized number of uniformed AMISOM personnel to a maximum of 19,626 by 28 February 2020 and expressed its intention to follow closely the implementation of the transition plan and handover of security responsibilities, with the aim of Somali security institutions taking the lead by December 2021.

34. In November, the Council adopted resolution [2498 \(2019\)](#), by which it renewed the sanctions and arms embargo on Somalia and the ban on the import and export of Somali charcoal. It also introduced restrictions on transfers to Somalia of components of improvised explosive devices and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts on Somalia until 15 December 2020. The Council expressed its full support for the work of the Panel of Experts throughout the year and called upon the Somali authorities to work with the Panel.

35. In a statement to the press on 25 November, the Council underlined the importance of holding a peaceful, inclusive, credible and transparent one-person-one-vote election and called upon the Federal Government of Somalia and the federal member states to resume dialogue in order to resolve outstanding issues.

36. On 4 December, the Council adopted resolution [2500 \(2019\)](#), by which it renewed for 12 months the authorizations for States and regional organizations cooperating with Somalia to use all necessary means to fight piracy off the coast of Somalia. While noting the improvements in the country, the Council recognized that piracy exacerbated instability in the country and stressed the need for an international response to tackle the underlying causes of the phenomenon. While piracy

attacks continue to occur, the Council and Member States should pay serious attention to the problem and continue coordinated counter-piracy efforts, including through the Contact Group on Piracy off the Coast of Somalia.

37. The situation in Libya remained a source of concern for the Council. In January, March, April, May, July, September and November, the Council was briefed on the situation in Libya by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya and Head of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL), Ghassan Salamé, and the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1970 \(2011\)](#) concerning Libya, Juergen Schulz.

38. On 26 March, the Council issued a statement to the press in which it welcomed Mr. Salamé's announcement that the national conference on the future of Libya would be held in Ghadames, Libya, from 14 to 16 April 2019.

39. On 5 April, the Council was briefed in consultations by the Special Representative about the escalation in violence around Tripoli, followed by a briefing by the Secretary-General in consultations on 10 April.

40. In July, the Council met in consultations after an airstrike on a detention centre near Tajoura in Tripoli, on 2 July, in which 53 people were killed and over 130 people were injured. On 5 July, the Council members issued a statement to the press condemning the attack and stressing the need for all parties to urgently de-escalate the situation and commit to a ceasefire. It also called for full respect for the arms embargo by all Member States.

41. On 5 August, the Council issued a statement to the press in which it expressed its support for the call of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya for a truce between the parties to be declared for Eid al-Adha.

42. On 10 August, the Council members met and held consultations after the attack on a United Nations convoy in Benghazi. The Council issued a statement to the press on 11 August in which it condemned the attack in the strongest terms.

43. On 10 June, the Council held a meeting and adopted resolution [2473 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate pursuant to resolution [2292 \(2016\)](#), concerning the strict implementation of the arms embargo on the high seas off the coast of Libya for one year, until 10 June 2020.

44. In September, by its resolution [2486 \(2019\)](#), the Council renewed the mandate of UNSMIL until 15 September 2020.

45. In October, the Council adopted resolution [2491 \(2019\)](#), by which it renewed the authorizations related to the smuggling of migrants and trafficking in persons as set out in resolution [2240 \(2015\)](#).

46. On 2 December, in a statement to the press, the members of the Council reiterated their call on all parties to urgently de-escalate the situation and commit to a ceasefire. They also reaffirmed their full support for the leadership of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya and for his work to resolve the conflict in Libya. They expressed particular concern regarding reported breaches of the arms embargo, as well as the growing involvement of mercenaries.

47. The Council continued to follow closely political and security developments in Mali. The progress of the peace process, in particular the implementation of the Agreement on Peace and Reconciliation in Mali, remained a major focus of the Council in 2019. In March, the Council held a briefing at the ministerial level on the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA), aimed at discussing the way forward regarding the implementation of the Agreement and the future of MINUSMA.

48. In June, by its resolution [2480 \(2019\)](#), the Council renewed the mandate of MINUSMA until 30 June 2020, specifying five priority areas in the implementation of the Agreement: constitutional reform, decentralization, security sector reform, the development of northern Mali and the participation of women. In the same resolution, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit a letter to the Council every six months on the performance and transition planning of MINUSMA. The first letter was submitted to the Council in December ([S/2019/1004](#)).

49. On several occasions, the Council expressed its concern about security developments in Mali, in particular the terrorist attacks against civilians, MINUSMA and the Malian armed forces and the deterioration of the situation in central Mali. In August, by its resolution [2484 \(2019\)](#), the Council renewed the sanctions regime and the mandate of the Panel of Experts on Mali for one year.

50. There was broad agreement in the Council that the situation in Mali could not be dealt with in isolation, and that a comprehensive approach to security challenges and instability in the Sahel was needed. In that context, the Council carried out a mission to Burkina Faso and

Mali in March, expressing its interest in preventing a further destabilization of the security situation and adapting its support to the evolving needs on the ground. The Council reaffirmed the centrality of the United Nations integrated strategy for the Sahel in providing a comprehensive framework to strengthen governance, security and development in the Sahel region.

51. The Council monitored the progress towards the full operationalization of the Joint Force of the Group of Five for the Sahel (Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania and the Niger) and underlined the importance of international support for the Force. In June, in its resolution [2480 \(2019\)](#), the Council expressed its support for the use of life support consumables provided by MINUSMA to the Force by all contingents of the Group of Five for the Sahel operating in the framework of the Force under the conditions that the Force or other partners undertook the responsibility of ensuring their delivery to their respective areas of operations when outside of Malian territory and that provision of consumables was undertaken in strict compliance with the human rights due diligence policy on United Nations support to non-United Nations security forces. In statements to the press in May and November, the Council welcomed the counter-terrorism operations of the Force and encouraged the States of the Group of Five for the Sahel to ensure that the Force continued to scale up its level of operation to demonstrate tangible operational results.

52. In February, the Council adopted resolution [2458 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Guinea-Bissau (UNIOGBIS) until 28 February 2020. Under the new mandate, the Council agreed on a three-phase approach to the reconfiguration of UNIOGBIS and the reprioritization of its tasks in preparation for its transition and its prospective withdrawal by 31 December 2020. As a part of its mission to West Africa, the Council visited Guinea-Bissau in February, where it held meetings with various interlocutors. In March, the Council issued a statement to the press congratulating Guinea-Bissau on the peaceful conduct of legislative elections. In November, in view of the unfolding political developments in Guinea-Bissau, the Council issued a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/13](#)) expressing concern over the social and political situation, reiterating the need to hold presidential elections on time, urging the defence and security forces not to interfere in politics and expressing support for the mediation efforts of the Economic Community of West African States and the African Union.

53. The Council expressed its support for the work of the United Nations Office for West Africa and the Sahel (UNOWAS) in a presidential statement in August ([S/PRST/2019/7](#)). In November, the Secretary-General presented a letter to the President of Council transmitting the independent strategic review of UNOWAS ([S/2019/890](#)). In December, the Council agreed a technical rollover of the UNOWAS mandate for one month, until 31 January 2020 ([S/2019/1010](#)).

African Union

54. The importance of close cooperation with the African Union was a key theme of many Council discussions on Africa in 2019, and especially during the ministerial-level meeting on peace and security in Africa held in September and the Council briefings in October. During the latter, the Council considered the annual report of the Secretary-General on strengthening the partnership between the African Union and the United Nations on issues of peace and security in Africa, including the work of the United Nations Office to the African Union.

55. In October, the members of the Council and the Peace and Security Council of the African Union met in Addis Ababa for thirteenth annual joint consultative meeting and fourth informal joint seminar. The members of the Council also conducted a visit to Juba. The meetings in Addis Ababa focused on the situations in the Central African Republic, Libya, South Sudan and the Sahel. There was also an opportunity for an informal exchange of views on the modalities of joint field missions and the African Union initiative Silencing the Guns in Africa by 2020.

Americas

56. In 2019, the Council met six times to discuss the situation in Colombia, and extended its full and unanimous support for the peace process in that country. In its five statements to the press issued over the year, the Council welcomed the continued affirmation by the Colombian parties of their continued commitment to the peace process and the development of programmes with a territorial focus and others that contributed to the implementation of the Final Agreement for Ending the Conflict and Building a Stable and Lasting Peace. It stressed the urgency of further accelerating efforts to secure full socioeconomic, political and legal reintegration of former members of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia-People's Army (FARC-EP) and reiterated its call for full respect for the

independence and autonomy of the Special Jurisdiction for Peace. At every opportunity, the Council expressed serious concern over insecurity in some of the conflict-affected areas of the country and the continued killings of community and social leaders, including women, and of former FARC-EP members. It called for those responsible for those killings to be brought to justice.

57. In July, the Council conducted a mission to Colombia, which allowed members to get first-hand perceptions of the progress in the peace process from various government, society and United Nations stakeholders, as well as to reconfirm the Council's full support therefor.

58. The Council continued to support the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia and in September it adopted resolution [2487 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of the Mission for one year.

59. In Haiti, 2019 became the year of transition from a peacekeeping presence into a special political mission: BINUH was established by the Council in its resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#), adopted on 25 June. The new Mission was mandated to advise and assist the Government of Haiti in assuming full responsibility for the situation in the country in several key areas and, in its resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#), the Council stressed the primary responsibility of the Government of Haiti in those areas. In 2019, there were four Council meetings on Haiti, during which members expressed concern over conditions in the country and called for a national dialogue to urgently address the existing challenges.

60. After one procedural vote, the Council held four meetings in 2019 focused on the situation in the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, including the political, humanitarian and security situation in the country. The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs, Rosemary DiCarlo, and the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, Mark Lowcock, briefed the Council. On 28 February 2019, two competing draft resolutions were presented for the Council's consideration; both failed to be adopted.

Asia

61. The Council continued to monitor closely the latest developments in Afghanistan. The security situation remained volatile and dangerous, with high levels of violence and large numbers of civilian casualties throughout 2019. The Council was united in stressing the need for continued international support to tackle the multitude of challenges facing Afghanistan. Some Council members stressed the importance of

regional support for tackling the challenges facing Afghanistan.

62. The continued presence of terrorist organizations such as Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL, also known as Da'esh) and their affiliates, in particular Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant-Khorasan, and other terrorist groups, and foreign terrorist fighters, along with brutal terrorist attacks in different parts of Afghanistan, complicated the security situation. The Council issued six statements to the press on terrorist attacks in Afghanistan, in which it condemned the cowardly terrorist attacks.

63. The Council focused on the peace reconciliation process in Afghanistan. Council members flagged their support for an Afghan-led and Afghan-owned inclusive peace process. Direct intra-Afghan talks remained essential for achieving long-term peace and stability in Afghanistan. Reaching that goal was at the heart of all regional and international efforts and formats.

64. The Council issued a statement to the press on the presidential elections that had been held in Afghanistan on 28 September. In the statement, it applauded the courage of Afghan voters, poll workers, election observers and security forces, who had made the presidential election possible despite technical challenges and security threats.

65. The Council held quarterly meetings, including debates and consultations, on Afghanistan, in March, June, September and December. The Council held an additional meeting on Afghanistan in July, with the participation of the Deputy Secretary-General, Amina Mohammed, and the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs. The members of the Council stressed the importance of the issue of women and peace and security in Afghanistan and the need for the Afghan peace process to be inclusive, with the participation of all Afghan political forces, including women. The challenges to Afghanistan and the region posed by illicit drugs and terrorism were also addressed, as was the presidential election process in the country. During the debate in September, the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, Yury Fedotov, expressed concern about opium poppy cultivation and production in Afghanistan.

66. In 2019, the Council reaffirmed its support for the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA). By its resolution [2460 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended the mandate of UNAMA until 17 September 2019. By its resolution [2489 \(2019\)](#), the Council again extended the mandate of UNAMA, until 17 September 2020. The members of the Council demonstrated their

readiness and ability to find compromise solutions, despite all the disagreements.

67. In 2019, the Council was briefed twice in consultations (in January and July) by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy for Central Asia, Natalia Gherman, on developments in Central Asia and the work of the Centre. She highlighted the Centre's efforts in promoting regional cooperation to combat terrorism, drug trafficking and organized crime and in tackling the shared management of the region's water resources, the roles of women and youth and energy. Council members expressed support for the work of the Special Representative and welcomed the Centre's efforts to address the challenges facing the countries of Central Asia.

68. The Council held a number of meetings on Myanmar throughout the year in order to stay up to date with developments on the ground.

69. The situation in Myanmar remained a source of concern for many members of the Council. During the meetings of the Council, discussions were mainly focused on issues such as recommendations of the Advisory Commission on Rakhine State, the provision of protection and assistance to refugees in Bangladesh and the creation of conditions allowing for the safe, voluntary, sustainable and dignified repatriation of refugees.

70. The members of the Council expressed grave concern about the current situation. They also expressed their deep appreciation to the Government of Bangladesh for its efforts to provide protection and assistance to refugees and expressed their determination to continue supporting Bangladesh. The members of the Council noted the efforts taken by the Governments of Bangladesh and Myanmar to prepare for the repatriation of refugees and urged both Governments to step up their efforts to implement bilateral agreements regarding repatriation and to create conditions conducive to the safe, voluntary and dignified return of Rohingya refugees.

71. The members of the Council highlighted the importance of undertaking transparent investigations into allegations of human rights abuses and violations.

72. On 16 August, the Council held consultations on the situation in Jammu and Kashmir. The Assistant Secretary-General for Peacebuilding Support, Oscar Fernández-Taranco, and the Military Adviser for Peacekeeping Operations, General Carlos Humberto Loitey, briefed the Council.

Europe

73. The Council held debates on Bosnia and Herzegovina in May and in November. During the course of each meeting, it received a briefing from the High Representative for the Implementation of the Peace Agreement on Bosnia and Herzegovina, Valentin Inzko. The High Representative presented his most recent reports on the latest situation in the field, the prolonged provocation between the parties and the importance for the authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina to comply with the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina (Dayton Peace Agreement). He also urged Bosnia and Herzegovina to respect the Agreement and hold elections in Mostar.

74. On 5 November, the Council adopted resolution [2496 \(2019\)](#), extending the mandate of the multinational stabilization force in Bosnia and Herzegovina for 12 months. During the meetings on Bosnia and Herzegovina, some Council members expressed their concern at the very slow progress in forming a State-level Government, the weakening of the rule of law and the prolonged provocation and divisive rhetoric between the parties.

75. The Council continued to encourage a settlement in Cyprus in accordance with its resolutions, based on a bizonal, bicomunal federation with political equality, as set out in the relevant Council resolutions, including paragraph 4 of resolution [716 \(1991\)](#). The Special Representative of the Secretary-General in Cyprus and Head of Mission, United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus, Elizabeth Spehar, briefed the Council on prospects for a settlement. The Council adopted two resolutions by which it extended the mandate of the Mission and also adopted two statements to the press. In those resolutions and statements, the situation around hydrocarbon exploration, developments in Varosha, the increase in violations in the buffer zone and the lack of progress in broadening intercommunal confidence-building, including on establishing a direct military contact mechanism, were indicated as obstacles for the dialogue. The Council welcomed the Secretary-General's readiness to extend his efforts to assist in achieve a starting point for meaningful negotiations, and encouraged the leaders of the two communities and all parties involved to renew their political will to reach a settlement, including by engaging with the Secretary-General and the United Nations consultant Jane Holl Lute to agree on a way forward.

76. On 12 February 2019, the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas Single Regional Political-Operational Structure,

Miroslav Jenča, the Assistant Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Deputy Emergency Relief Coordinator, Ursula Mueller, the Chief Monitor of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) Special Monitoring Mission, Ertugrul Apakan and the Special Representative of the Chairperson-in-Office of OSCE, Martin Sajdik, briefed the Council on the implementation of its resolution [2202 \(2015\)](#), in which the Council had endorsed the Package of Measures for the Implementation of the Minsk Agreements. They stressed that the Minsk Agreements, despite being largely underimplemented, remained the only agreed framework for a negotiated peace in eastern Ukraine. The members of the Council reaffirmed their unanimous support for the Package of Measures, encouraged implementation of the obligations contained therein, including respect for a lasting ceasefire, and exchanged further views on the challenges in that regard.

77. On 20 May, the Council members considered and rejected by vote a proposal by one delegation to discuss the signing in Ukraine of the law on the use of Ukrainian as the State language. Instead, on 16 July, the Council discussed the entry into force of the above-mentioned law when the Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs and by the High Commissioner on National Minorities of OSCE, Lamberto Zannier. Both presented their views with respect to the above-mentioned law and called for a fair correlation between the protection of the rights of minorities and the preservation of the State language as a tool for integration within society. The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs welcomed the statement by the President of Ukraine, Volodymyr Zelenskyy, that a thorough analysis of the law would be conducted and expressed hope that that would pave the way for further measures to safeguard the rights of minorities. The Under-Secretary-General also noted that the political transition in Ukraine was taking place against the backdrop of the ongoing conflict in Donbas and expressed regret at the persistent failure to agree on a ceasefire under the Minsk Agreements. The Council members expressed gratitude for the briefings and exchanged their own views on the matter (see [S/PV.8575](#)).

78. On 25 April 2019, following a request to discuss the facilitation of obtaining foreign citizenship for residents of certain areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk regions of eastern Ukraine, the Council heard a briefing by the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs and by the Assistant Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Deputy

Emergency Relief Coordinator, who presented the views of the Secretariat on the serious humanitarian conditions facing Ukrainians in certain areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk regions of eastern Ukraine. An exchange of opinions between the Council members and the representative of Ukraine followed (see [S/PV.8516](#)).

Security Council resolutions [1160 \(1998\)](#), [1199 \(1998\)](#), [1203 \(1998\)](#), [1239 \(1999\)](#), [1244 \(1999\)](#)

79. In 2019, the Council convened a debate on UNMIK three times: in February, June and October. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of UNMIK briefed the Council on recent developments.

80. Council members expressed concern at the political stalemate, urged political leaders to reach an agreement quickly and underscored the need to resume the dialogue for the normalization of relations between Belgrade and Pristina.

81. Council members also called for the implementation of the related agreements and called for continued engagement from both sides in resolving outstanding issues, including the establishment of an association or community of Serb majority municipalities of Kosovo. The members of the Council emphasized that the immunity of the staff of United Nations missions should not be violated under any circumstances. The Council agreed to reduce briefings to two in 2020, in April and October.

Middle East

82. In 2019, the key focus of the Council's discussion on the situation in Iraq was to support the country's continued post-conflict recovery, stabilization, reconstruction and reconciliation efforts to meet the needs of all Iraqis. In February, the new Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI), Jeanine Hennis-Plasschaert, briefed the Council on recent developments in the country. She expressed concern over the slow pace of completing the process of formation of the new Government and called for a shift from factional politics to a focus on addressing the immediate needs of the country.

83. On 19 February, the Council adopted a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/1](#)) welcoming the cooperation between Iraq and Kuwait on the issue of missing Kuwaiti and third-country nationals and the return of Kuwaiti property, including the national archives.

84. In May, the Council adopted resolution [2470 \(2019\)](#), renewing the mandate of UNAMI until 31 May 2020. Following the adoption of that resolution, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq briefed the Council on the Secretary-General's latest reports on UNAMI ([S/2019/365](#)) and on the issue of missing Kuwaiti and third-country nationals and missing Kuwaiti property, including the national archives ([S/2019/352](#)).

85. On 28 and 29 June, the members of the Council visited Iraq and Kuwait in a mission co-led by Kuwait and the United States of America. The members noted that the visit had underscored their support for the continued post-conflict recovery of Iraq and the stabilization, reconstruction and reconciliation efforts to meet the needs of all Iraqis. The members welcomed the strong bilateral relations between Iraq and Kuwait and commended the continued support by the Government of Kuwait of Iraq in its efforts to achieve stability and prosperity. On 30 June, the Council adopted a statement to the press in that regard.

86. In December, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq briefed the Council on the situation concerning Iraq. On 13 December, the Council issued a statement to the press on demonstrations in Iraq. The members of the Council acknowledged the right to peaceful assembly in Iraq and called for the Iraqi authorities to promptly conduct transparent investigations into the violence against those demonstrating.

87. The Council continued to monitor closely the situation in Lebanon throughout 2019 and maintained its commitment to the stability, security, sovereignty and political independence of the country. The members also expressed concern at the limited progress made towards the establishment of a permanent ceasefire and other key provisions connected with Council resolutions [1559 \(2004\)](#) and [1701 \(2006\)](#).

88. In that context, in March, the Council held consultations on the implementation of resolution [1701 \(2006\)](#), in which it had called for a cessation of hostilities between Hizbullah and Israel. The Council was briefed by the newly appointed Special Coordinator for Lebanon, Ján Kubiš; the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations, Jean-Pierre Lacroix; and the Head of Mission and Force Commander, United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL), Major General Stefano Del Col.

89. In February, the Council held closed consultations on the implementation of resolution [1559 \(2004\)](#). The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs gave a briefing on the latest report

of the Secretary-General and the most recent developments in Lebanon. After the meeting, Council members agreed on elements for the press in which they reaffirmed the Council's strong support for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Lebanon, welcomed institutional progress following the formation of the new Government and recalled that the Lebanese Armed Forces were the only legitimate armed forces in the country.

90. In August, the Council adopted resolution [2485 \(2019\)](#), extending the mandate of UNIFIL in its current configuration for another year (until 31 August 2020), and held consultations with the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific, Mohamed Khaled Khiari.

91. In October, the Council held its regular closed consultations on the implementation of resolution [1559 \(2004\)](#). The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs briefed the Council, including on the findings of her visit to Lebanon.

92. In November, the Council held closed consultations on the implementation of resolution [1701 \(2006\)](#). The Special Coordinator for Lebanon and the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific briefed the Council. After the meeting, Council members agreed on elements for the press commending the role of UNIFIL in maintaining calm along the Blue Line and stressing the importance of UNIFIL being able to fulfil its mandate. The members of the Council also called on all actors to maintain the peaceful character of the protests by avoiding violence and respecting the right to peaceful assembly and protest. They commended the role of the Lebanese Armed Forces and other State security institutions in protecting that right. The members of the Council emphasized the need for the Lebanese authorities to implement meaningful economic reforms in a timely manner and under a Lebanese-owned and Lebanese-led process.

93. The situation in the Syrian Arab Republic remained one of the most discussed matters on the Council's agenda. The Council met on a monthly basis to discuss the humanitarian situation, political process and chemical dossier.

94. During the year, the Council was briefed by the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and other officials of the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, who introduced the reports of the Secretary-General and detailed the humanitarian situation in the Syrian Arab Republic and cross-border humanitarian assistance.

95. At the request of the pen holders on the humanitarian situation in the Syrian Arab Republic (Belgium, Germany and Kuwait), the Council discussed the humanitarian situation in the Syrian Arab Republic on a number of occasions. In September, the Council failed to adopt a resolution on a ceasefire in Idlib. In December, the Council failed to adopt a resolution to renew the cross-border mechanism. The Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Syria, Geir Pedersen, who assumed his position on 7 January, regularly briefed the Council on developments in the political process pursuant to resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#). On 23 September, the Secretary-General announced the agreement of the Government of the Syrian Arab Republic and the Syrian Negotiations Commission for a credible, balanced and inclusive Constitutional Committee facilitated by the United Nations in Geneva. In that regard, in October, the Council issued a statement ([S/PRST/2019/12](#)) in which it expressed its determination that the launch of the Syrian-owned and Syrian-led Constitutional Committee should be the beginning of the political process to end the Syrian conflict in line with Council resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#) that met the legitimate aspirations of all Syrians.

96. With regard to the implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#), the Council continued to hear briefings on a monthly basis in closed consultations by the Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs, Izumi Nakamitsu. In November, the Council held a private meeting at which the Director General of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), Fernando Arias, briefed the Council.

97. Throughout 2019, the Council met frequently to discuss the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question.

98. During the year, the Council held its quarterly open debates on the Middle East, with the Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General to the Palestine Liberation Organization and the Palestinian Authority, Nickolay Mladenov, as briefer. The Special Coordinator urged continued attention to “dangerous dynamics” on the ground, including the deteriorating humanitarian and economic situation in the Gaza Strip, highlighting in particular the impact of Israeli settlements, condemned violence, including rocket attacks, and stressed the importance of intra-Palestinian reconciliation efforts.

99. In March, the Council met on the Middle East twice; the Council also met under “any other business” to discuss an ongoing disagreement between Israel and the State of Palestine on tax collection, as requested by

Indonesia and Kuwait. The Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process stressed that the actions being taken could have economic and security implications, as well as an effect on any political dialogue. On 26 March, the Special Coordinator presented to the Council the second written report ([S/2019/251](#)) on the implementation of resolution [2334 \(2016\)](#) since its adoption. He presented the second written report for 2019 ([S/2019/938](#)) to the Council on 18 December.

100. In May and June, the Council met once under “any other business” and again in closed consultations under the agenda item “Middle East”, to discuss the situation in the Persian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman.

101. Throughout 2019, the Council met regularly to maintain its support for the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF). The Council continued to call for the immediate implementation of resolution [338 \(1973\)](#). In June and December, the Council adopted resolutions [2477 \(2019\)](#) and [2503 \(2019\)](#), respectively, by which it extended the mandate of UNDOF for a period of six months. Also in those resolutions, the Council welcomed the efforts by UNDOF to consolidate its presence and to intensify its operations in the area of separation and its intention to resume inspections in the area of limitation on the Bravo side, expressed concern regarding violations of the Agreement on Disengagement between Israeli and Syrian Forces of 1974 and stressed the importance of exercising maximum restraint and of the liaison function of UNDOF to prevent escalation.

102. During 2019, the Council followed closely the conflict in Yemen and remained deeply concerned by the high levels of violence in the country and the continued deterioration of the humanitarian situation. In that regard, the Council, during its monthly sessions, heard briefings by the Under-Secretary-General and Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen, Martin Griffiths; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs; the Head of the United Nations Mission to Support the Hudaydah Agreement (UNMHA) and Chair of the Redeployment Coordination Committee, Michael Lollesgaard, succeeded by Abhijit Guha; and the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [2140 \(2014\)](#), Gustavo Meza-Cuadra.

103. In January, the Council adopted resolution [2452 \(2019\)](#), by which it established UNMHA, to support the implementation of the Agreement on the City of Hudaydah and the Ports of Hudaydah, Salif, and Ra's Isa, as set out in the Stockholm Agreement. In July, the Council adopted resolution [2481 \(2019\)](#), by which it renewed the mandate of UNMHA for six months, until 15 January 2020. In February, the Council adopted

resolution [2456 \(2019\)](#), by which it extended the asset freeze and travel ban and sanctions measures, as well as the mandate of the Panel of Experts on Yemen.

104. In August, the Council adopted a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/9](#)), in which it expressed its concern at the escalation in violence across Yemen.

105. In 2019, the Council continued to receive briefings on Western Sahara in consultations from the Personal Envoy of the Secretary-General for Western Sahara, Horst Köhler, and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Western Sahara and Head of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO), Colin Stewart. Members of the Council reaffirmed the objective of a just, lasting and mutually acceptable political solution that would provide for the self-determination of the people of Western Sahara.

106. In that context, in April and October, the Council adopted resolutions [2468 \(2019\)](#) and [2494 \(2019\)](#), respectively. By its resolution [2494 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended the mandate of MINURSO until 31 October 2020.

107. In May, Mr. Köhler announced that he was resigning for personal reasons. The post of Personal Envoy of the Secretary-General for Western Sahara has remained vacant since that time.

Thematic issues

108. The Council continued its consideration of several thematic issues in 2019.

109. Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction continued to remain an important priority for the Council. In March, the Permanent Representative of Indonesia, Dian Triansyah Djani, briefed the Council in his capacity as Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#), on the work of the Committee since October 2018.

110. In April, the Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs of Germany, Heiko Maas, chaired a meeting to discuss the importance of supporting the Non-Proliferation Treaty ahead of the 2020 Review Conference. During that meeting, the Council was also briefed by the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency, Yukiya Amano. The Council met on two occasions under the agenda item “Non-proliferation” to discuss the implementation of resolution [2231 \(2015\)](#), on the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action on the Iranian nuclear issue, and two reports from the Secretary-General in that regard ([S/2019/492](#) and [S/2019/934](#)).

111. On 22 August, the Council met under the agenda item on threats to international peace and security. The

High Representative for Disarmament Affairs briefed the Council on the issue of missiles in the context of the dissolution of the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty.

112. On 22 November, the Council adopted a presidential statement ([S/PRST/2019/14](#)), in which it reaffirmed its strong support for the Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on Their Destruction and for the work of OPCW in accordance with the Convention.

113. The Council continued to monitor the situation in the Democratic People’s Republic of Korea closely under the agenda item “Non-proliferation/Democratic People’s Republic of Korea”. In April, by its resolution [2464 \(2019\)](#), the Council extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts established pursuant to Security Council resolution [1874 \(2009\)](#) until 24 April 2020. Also in that resolution, the Council urged all States, relevant United Nations bodies and other interested parties to cooperate fully with the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#) and the Panel of Experts.

114. In December, the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific briefed the Council on the recent troubling developments pertaining to the agenda item on non-proliferation/Democratic People’s Republic of Korea.

115. The Council continued to focus on threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts. On 28 March, the Council adopted resolution [2462 \(2019\)](#), which was its first decision devoted specifically to the issues of preventing and suppressing the financing of terrorism.

116. In the first half of 2019, the Council and its subsidiary bodies also focused on the threat posed by the nexus between international terrorism and transnational organized crime. A thematic open debate on that subject held in early July was later followed by the adoption of resolution [2482 \(2019\)](#), in which the Council addressed various means to disrupt financial or logistical support to terrorists through trafficking in persons, drugs, artefacts and cultural property.

117. In August, the Secretary-General issued the ninth report on the threat to international peace and security posed by ISIL. The Council briefing on the report was largely focused on the challenges related to repatriation, prosecution, rehabilitation and reintegration of foreign terrorist fighters and their family members in the aftermath of the military defeat of the ISIL core in Iraq and the Syrian Arab Republic.

118. The Council also received a periodic briefing by the Chairs of the Security Council Committee pursuant

to resolutions [1267 \(1999\)](#), [1989 \(2011\)](#) and [2253 \(2015\)](#) concerning Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (Da'esh), Al-Qaida and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1373 \(2001\)](#) concerning counter-terrorism and the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) on the work undertaken by those subsidiary organs with regard to counter-terrorism.

119. On 20 September 2019, the Council adopted resolution [2490 \(2019\)](#), renewing the mandate of the United Nations Investigative Team to Promote Accountability for Crimes Committed by Da'esh/Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant until 21 September 2020. The Special Adviser and Head of the Team briefed the Council in November.

120. In October, the President of the International Court of Justice briefed the Council.

121. The President and the Prosecutor of the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals briefed the Council in July and December.

122. Under the agenda item on the promotion and strengthening of the rule of law in the maintenance of international peace and security, two meetings of the Council (on 1 April and 13 August) were devoted to international humanitarian law. On 20 August, the Council adopted a presidential statement to mark the seventieth anniversary of the Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949 ([S/PRST/2019/8](#)).

123. Under the agenda item on threats to international peace and security, the Council held a thematic meeting on mercenary activities as a source of insecurity and destabilization in Africa.

124. The Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court briefed the Council on the investigation of the situation in Libya, in May and November.

125. The Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court briefed the Council on the investigation of the situation in Darfur, in June and December.

126. United Nations peacekeeping operations remained at the heart of the Council's agenda. In April, the Council held an open debate on women in peacekeeping operations. The Secretary-General, António Guterres, presented his uniformed gender parity strategy 2018–2028. Member States discussed issues related to the deployment of female personnel in United Nations peacekeeping operations, including the various challenges faced by troop- and police-contributing countries in deploying women.

127. In May, the Council held an open debate on training and capacity-building with regard to United Nations peacekeeping operations. Members of the

Council highlighted the importance of training in preparing peacekeepers for effective fulfilment of vital tasks and improving their performance. The Council adopted a presidential statement on the issue ([S/PRST/2019/4](#)).

128. In June and July, the Council held meetings on cooperation with host States and strengthening triangular cooperation. The Council reaffirmed the need to improve the relationship among the Council, troop-contributing countries and the Secretariat and host Governments. The meetings were held to foster a spirit of partnership and cooperation and enhance collaboration and planning between the United Nations and relevant international, regional and subregional organizations and arrangements.

129. In September, the Council held its annual debate on reform of United Nations peacekeeping operations. Member States agreed on the necessity of close cooperation between all relevant stakeholders. They also emphasized the importance of well-equipped and capable contingents, as well as clear, focused, sequenced, prioritized and achievable mandates, reaffirming the primacy of politics.

130. The Council continued to pay attention to the issue of conflict prevention. In June, the Council heard briefings from the Secretary-General, the Chair of the Elders, Mary Robinson, and the Vice-Chair of the Elders, Ban Ki-moon, who highlighted the importance of mediation and good offices in conflict prevention and resolution. In October, the Council discussed the central role of preventive diplomacy for conflict prevention and resolution in Africa.

131. In July and November, the Council held meetings on peacebuilding and sustaining peace, during which it discussed the need to strengthen partnerships for successful nationally owned transitions and the importance of reconciliation in maintaining international peace and security.

132. In July, the Council held an open debate on the role of youth in maintaining of international peace and security. In December, the Council adopted a presidential statement on the role of youth in silencing the guns in Africa ([S/PRST/2019/15](#)), following the debate on the issue in October.

133. In 2019, Council members continued to emphasize the importance of advancing and strengthening cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations, in particular with regard to issues related to peace and security.

134. On 7 and 12 March 2019, the Council was briefed by the Chairperson-in-Office of OSCE and by the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, respectively.

135. On 16 May, the Council held a briefing on peace and security in Africa to discuss the operationalization of the Joint Force of the Group of Five for the Sahel. The Assistant Secretary-General for Africa, Bintou Keita, presented the latest report of the Secretary-General on the Joint Force ([S/2019/371](#)).

136. On 25 September 2019, a high-level debate was held on cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security, focusing on the contribution of the Collective Security Treaty Organization, the Commonwealth of Independent States and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization in countering terrorist threats.

137. On 26 September 2019, the Council held a meeting on peace and security in Africa, focusing on partnership to strengthen regional peace and security. The Council members, in their statements, reaffirmed the special place that African issues occupied on the Council's agenda and underscored that ensuring peace and security on the continent was of utmost importance for the entire international community. They also emphasized the need for strengthened partnership in that regard between the United Nations and the African Union.

138. On 2 October 2019, the Council held a debate on peace and security in Africa, on the theme "Mobilizing youth towards silencing the guns by 2020", during which it focused on the positive role played by African youth in peace processes. The meeting was enriched by the contributions of African youth leaders, including the Special Envoy on Youth of the African Union, Aya Chebbi.

139. The Council continued its consideration of women and peace and security agenda. In April, in an open debate, the Secretary-General presented the Council his annual report on sexual violence in conflict ([S/2019/280](#)). The Council subsequently adopted resolution [2467 \(2019\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, with 2 abstentions.

140. In October, the Council adopted, in an open debate, resolution [2493 \(2019\)](#), which focused on the implementation of the women and peace and security agenda in preparation for the commemoration of the twentieth anniversary of Council resolution [1325 \(2000\)](#).

141. On 11 June, the Council adopted resolution [2474 \(2019\)](#) and held an open debate on the issue of missing persons in armed conflict. On 20 June, the Council adopted resolution [2475 \(2019\)](#), on the issue of persons with disabilities in armed conflict.

142. The Council explored the various aspects of the issue of protection of civilians in armed conflict and

emphasized the twentieth anniversary of the first Council resolution on the protection of civilians, resolution [1265 \(1999\)](#). In May, the Council held an open debate and discussed the annual report of the Secretary-General on the protection of civilians in armed conflict ([S/2019/373](#)).

143. In August, the Council held an open debate on children and armed conflict. The Under-Secretary-General and Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict, Virginia Gamba de Potgieter, briefed the Council on her activities. The members of the Council emphasized the twentieth anniversary since the adoption of resolution [1261 \(1999\)](#), the first resolution on children and armed conflict, and the thirtieth anniversary of the entry into force of the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

144. On 25 January, the Council held an open debate on addressing the impacts of climate-related disasters on international peace and security under the agenda item "Maintenance of international peace and security". The debate was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Dominican Republic, Miguel Vargas. Briefers included the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs; the Under-Secretary-General and Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, Achim Steiner; the Chief Scientist of the World Meteorological Organization, Pavel Kabat; and a Research Assistant with the Environmental Security Program of the Stimson Center, Lindsay Getschel.

Other matters

145. The Council continued its consideration of its working methods, including through the implementation of the note by the President of the Council ([S/2017/507](#)). In June, the Council held an open debate on that issue. In December, the Council adopted eight notes by the President of the Council.

146. On 20 August, the Council adopted its annual report ([S/2018/797](#)).

147. Throughout the year, the Council continued to receive regular briefings from the Chairs of its subsidiary bodies, including the regular briefing by the outgoing Chairs in December.

148. In 2019, 10 Presidents of the Council held briefings with the broader membership at the end of their presidency.

Part IV

Report of the Military Staff Committee

I. Introduction

1. The present report of the Military Staff Committee covers the period from 1 January to 31 December 2019.

II. Background

2. The Military Staff Committee was established in accordance with Article 47 of the Charter of the United Nations and Security Council resolution 1 (1946). The Committee has a mandate to advise and assist the Security Council on all questions relating to the Council's military requirements for the maintenance of international peace and security, the employment and command of forces placed at its disposal, the regulation of armaments, and possible disarmament.

III. Summary of the activities of the Committee

3. The Committee functioned continuously under its revised draft statute and revised draft rules of procedure, contained in document S/115 of 1 August 1946, during the period under review. The Committee held a total of 27 meetings and discussed a total of 42 topics. During the reporting period, the Committee had planned to conduct two field missions to current United Nations peacekeeping operations.
4. Military representatives of elected members of the Security Council participated in 26 meetings. Representatives of Secretariat departments were invited to brief the Committee and contributed to discussions: the Department of Peace Operations on 31 topics, the Department of Political and Peacebuilding Affairs on 8 topics and the Department of Operational Support on 2 topics.
5. Current United Nations peacekeeping and special political missions were the focus of 27 meetings, and various thematic issues were discussed at 14 meetings (see appendix IV.A).
6. During the reporting period, the Committee planned and was prepared to conduct two field missions to current United Nations peacekeeping operations but had to postpone them owing to visa issues for the Committee members from the Russian delegation.
7. The Committee continued to announce all meetings and provisional agendas in the Journal of the United Nations and on its website (www.un.org/securitycouncil/subsidiary/msc), which is available in the six official languages of the United Nations and offers swift and easy access to the programme of work and current information on the Committee.
8. In accordance with paragraph 178 of General Assembly resolution 60/1 entitled "2005 World Summit Outcome", the Committee continued to consider its composition, mandate and working methods.
9. Military representatives of Equatorial Guinea and Kuwait have not yet been appointed to the Committee.
10. The Committee amended some of its working methods, for example, military representatives of the elected members began to take their seats at the start of meetings.
11. The Committee remained prepared to carry out the functions assigned to it under the terms of Article 47 of the Charter.
