## I. Introduction

1. The General Assembly, in paragraph 1 of its resolution 74/24, called upon Member States to provide the Secretary-General, by 30 April annually, with a report on their military expenditures for the latest fiscal year for which data were available, using, preferably and to the extent possible, one of the online reporting forms, including, if appropriate, a nil report or the “single-figure” report on military expenditures or any other format developed in the context of similar reporting on military expenditures to other international or regional organizations.

## II. Actions taken by the Secretariat

2. On 18 February 2021, the Secretariat sent a note verbale to Member States seeking their views on the subject, followed by email reminders sent in February to national points of contact and permanent missions of Member States in New York. The replies received are reproduced in section III below. Additional replies received after the processing of the present report will be posted on the website of the Office for Disarmament Affairs<sup>1</sup> in the original language received.

3. The Office for Disarmament Affairs continued to maintain the online database for military expenditures and the online reporting tool. During the reporting period, the Office continued the process of upgrading those online tools, which is nearing finalization, and Member States will be notified upon its completion. The use of the online tool by Member States to submit reports to the United Nations Report on Military Expenditures decreased during the reporting period (see table 1).

4. The Office for Disarmament Affairs continued its efforts to promote the tool among Member States. Owing to the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, which slowed activities worldwide in 2020 and during the reporting period, such efforts consisted mainly of circulating notes verbales to Member States. Briefings planned to be held on the margins of the meetings of the First Committee of the General Assembly at its seventy-fifth session and of the seventh biennial meeting of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects were deferred.

### III. Replies received from Governments

#### Explanatory notes

5. As at the date of submission of the present consolidated report, the Secretary-General had received national reports from 40 Governments, including 5 single-figure reports and 1 nil report (see table 2). Some States provided clarifications and additional information on defence planning to explain their military expenditures. Those are also included in the present report.

6. The originals of the replies from States, if received by means other than the online reporting system, are on file with the Office for Disarmament Affairs.

## Fiscal year 2020

The State Budget of Czechia for fiscal year 2020 was approved by Parliament in Act No. 355/2019 for a total of 1,864,818,724,000 koruny. The 2020/19 index was 1.24. The Ministry of Defence budget for fiscal year 2020 was approved for a total of 72,600,366,000 koruny. The actual outlays under the Ministry budget totalled 74,310,589,000 koruny. The 2020/19 index was 1.09. The military expenditures for fiscal year 2020, based on the definition of the Vienna document and in line with United Nations methodology, represented a total of 74,213,726,000 koruny.

## Fiscal year 2021

The State budget of Czechia for fiscal year 2021 was approved by Parliament and published in Act No. 600/2020. The total of the Ministry of Defence budget expenditures was 75,359,897,000 koruny. In January 2021, the total of the expenditures increased to 80,359,897,000 koruny. On the basis of a government pledge, the amount of 5,000,000,000 koruny was allocated to the government budget reserve and released to increase the Ministry budget. The Ministry budget for fiscal year 2021 amounts to 85,359,897,000 koruny. The 2021/20 index was 1.18. The military expenditures for fiscal year 2021, defined in the Vienna document and based on United Nations methodology, represent 85,273,560,000 koruny.

#### *Explanatory remarks*

In the first quarter of 2020, the Netherlands, like the rest of the world, was struck by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic. Developments associated with COVID-19 had, and will have, a serious impact on plans and policy and on their implementation. Planned international exercises have been discontinued, changed or cancelled altogether, and various activities have been discontinued or will not be carried out. Financial obligations associated with such activities will be affected as a result. The defence organization will be assigned tasks to combat the crisis, and military and civilian personnel will be tasked with supporting the national crisis team and handling emergencies.

The Netherlands will face unexpected crises more often in the future. The world is in a constant state of flux, which greatly affects the focus and structure of the Ministry of Defence and the country's national and international partners. The Netherlands therefore agreed in 2014 that, in the following 10 years, defence spending would increase to 2 per cent of its GDP, which will make it possible for the country to develop into a military organization that contributes its fair share to NATO objectives. The process of growth to strengthen the foundation of NATO in concert with the country's partners has been set out in the national plan, which shows how defence spending will rise to 2 per cent of GDP in the period until 2024. If all the allies do so, the Netherlands can defend shared freedom and security. The Netherlands has not met that target, and therefore its allies expect more from it. The country is being called to account internationally. With a defence budget of approximately 1.33 per cent of GDP, the Netherlands falls below the European average (1.58 per cent in 2019).
