Carta de fecha 19 de julio de 2022 dirigida al Secretario General por el Encargado de Negocios Interino de la Misión Permanente de la Federación de Rusia ante las Naciones Unidas

Quisiera señalar una vez más a su atención la actividad ilegal y escandalosa del proyecto en línea Mirotvorets (“Pacificador”, sitio web: <https://myrotvorets.center>), dirigido por nacionalistas y radicales ucranianos con el apoyo claro e inequívoco de funcionarios de Kiev. El proyecto se puso en marcha en 2014 para divulgar los datos personales de supuestos “enemigos de Ucrania” con el objetivo de que activistas de ultraderecha los intimidaran, amenazaran o incluso asesinaran. En estos últimos años, más de 240.000 personas, entre ellas políticos, periodistas y defensores de los derechos humanos, han sido incluidas en una lista negra en el marco de este proyecto. En contra de lo dispuesto por el derecho internacional y nacional, los propietarios de este sitio web publicaron los datos personales de estas personas, incluidos la información que figura en sus pasaportes, sus direcciones permanentes, sus números de teléfono y los enlaces a sus cuentas en las redes sociales, lo que pone sus vidas en peligro.

Es especialmente indignante que los niños y los adolescentes también se hayan convertido en objetivos del proyecto Mirotvorets. Planteamos esta cuestión en las cartas que dirigimos a Henrietta Fore, Directora Ejecutiva del Fondo de las Naciones Unidas para la Infancia (UNICEF), de fecha 18 de octubre de 2021 y 4 de enero de 2022. En aquel entonces, expresamos nuestra profunda preocupación por el caso de Faina Savenkova, una escritora de 13 años de Lugansk, cuyos datos personales, incluida la dirección de su casa, fueron publicados en el sitio web de Mirotvorets. La propia Faina le dirigió una carta al respecto. Desgraciadamente, solo podemos constatar que la intervención del UNICEF fue muy formal y aparentemente no cambió la situación, que pone en riesgo la seguridad y el bienestar de una niña. Se adjuntan como referencia todos los archivos mencionados (véase el anexo).

Además, nos vemos obligados a constatar que la escasa intervención de las Naciones Unidas ha contribuido a agravar la situación. Organizaciones no gubernamentales rusas han descubierto recientemente que los nombres de al menos 327 niños y adolescentes están incluidos ahora en la base de datos de Mirotvorets. En realidad, la cifra real podría ser incluso más elevada. Los resultados de la investigación realizada por nuestras ONG figuran en el anexo.



Reiteramos que la práctica malintencionada de divulgar datos personales de menores, ante la que las autoridades de Kiev hacen la vista gorda, es absolutamente inaceptable y debe ser condenada por las Naciones Unidas, ya que supone una amenaza inmediata para la seguridad de los niños.

Por lo tanto, le pedimos que adopte las medidas necesarias para señalar a la atención de las autoridades ucranianas las actividades delictivas llevadas a cabo en el marco del proyecto Mirotvorets y les obligue a cerrarlo.

Agradecería que tuviera a bien hacer publicar la presente carta y su anexo como documento de la Asamblea General, en relación con el tema 70 del programa, y del Consejo de Seguridad.

Teniendo en cuenta la información sensible contenida en los archivos adjuntos al anexo, le ruego que publique esta carta sin el anexo que contiene datos personales.

Please find attached a letter addressed to H.E. Mr. António Guterres, Secretary-General UN, by Faina Savenkova, a child writer from Eastern Ukraine (Donbass). Despite being only 12 years old she is already quite well known for a number of her fairy-tales and science-fiction books. She lives in Lugansk. This city didn't recognize 2014 coup in Ukraine and had to face, together with Donetsk, a large-scale Ukrainian military operation which resulted in ongoing civil war.

Faina had nothing to do with this, she is just a normal kid going to school. She like other kids of Donbass lives under the threat of a possible shelling by Ukrainian army which has already took the life of dozens of kids in her neighborhood.

Being a writer, she describes what she sees in her posts on social media. In June this year on the occasion of the World children day

she recorded an appeal to the members of the Security Council asking them not to forget about the children of Donbass. She is not engaged in politics, she just wants peace for her land.

The reason she wrote to the Secretary General is that she suddenly discovered that her name was included into the infamous “Mirotvorets” (Peacemaker) web-site, managed by Ukrainian nationalists and radicals with a clear support from officials in Kiev. This site was launched in 2014 to provide personal data of alleged “enemies of Ukraine” so that any extremist could find them and their relatives and intimidate or threaten their life. And Faina’s home address is now on display at this site. It means that her life is in danger, and this threat is real. Hundreds of people were persecuted or even killed by Ukrainian radicals after appearing in the database of this site.

The fact that a 12-year old girl is being treated as an enemy of Ukraine is very illustrative. It shows with whom Kiev is in reality waging a war in Donbass: with children, women, peaceful civilians. They suffer most from Ukraine’s refusal to implement Minsk agreements.

Faina has already submitted relevant questionnaire at the UNICEF web-site.

I hope that the UN will pay attention to this scandalous situation.

Dear Mr. Guterres,

My name is Faina Savenkova, I am 12 (twelve) and I live in the city of Lugansk, Donbass.

Unfortunately, more than a half of my life has been spent in the conditions of war (sometimes more active, sometimes almost invisible for an outsider). Just like many children of my generation, I hardly remember the pre-war life of my region and the word "peaceful life" sounds as something unattainable.

This is the subject of my many essays and prose works which are published in Russia and, thanks to my friends, sometimes get translated into foreign languages.

In my texts I advocate the end of the war in Donbass, which I know mostly through the suffering of peaceful citizens, children in the first place.

Hence I decided to turn to the UN on the Day of Protection of Children. My plea to your Organization is to ask you to stop the shootouts, to save human lives, that are still lost in Lugansk and Donetsk every day.

But the war does not limit itself to shootouts and bombings. Just recently a Ukrainian self-styled site Mirotvorets (Peacemaker) declared me an unwanted person in Ukraine and published my personal data in the Internet. The Ukrainian government does not condemn or cut short the activity of this site, so the "Peacemaker" declared me an enemy of Ukraine. I am accused of participating in anti-Ukrainian public affairs campaigns and of spreading "fake" information.

This is not true, it is a lie whose aim is to make Ukrainian population hate me, to intimidate and denigrate me.

But now I am afraid for my life, and I am worried about my life, my health and the security of my family.

On October 13 I made a public appeal to Vladimir Zelensky, the president of Ukraine. I asked him to outlaw and block the "Peacemaker" site – there is more than enough legal reasons for such a move.

But the "Peacemaker" continues to operate. What is worse, it updates and makes more detailed the information on my family, deeply hurting me and my loved ones.

Unfortunately, I am not the only child who became a victim of the "Peacemaker"'s aggression. This site often publishes the personal data of the children like me.

I read about the activity of the UNICEF foundation, so I turn to you asking to influence the Ukrainian government pushing pushing it towards the fastest possible blocking of the Peacemaker's site in Ukraine, as well as its possible "mirror offsprings". Please, help me to force the Ukrainian government to fulfill its own laws. Children are protected by the law in almost every country in the world now. Now, please, add this "protection by action". Children should not become victims of harassment and psychological violence on the part of the adults.



Dear Ms. Fore,

I would like to draw your attention to ongoing violations of the rights of the children in Ukraine whose personal data is being published on the infamous website “Myrotvorets” (Peacemaker), managed by Ukrainian nationalists. This website was launched in 2014 to publicly reveal private information of alleged “enemies of Ukraine” to keep them intimidated, threatened and even killed by ultra-right supporters or sympathisers.

We have already raised this issue following the public disclosure of data of Ms. Faina Savenkova, a 13-year old writer from the Eastern Ukraine. We very much appreciate your heartfelt reaction to this scandalous case in your letter dated October 29, 2021 (attached). Officials and media both in Russia and Ukraine took great interest in UNICEF’s engagement in this situation. We talked to Faina and she was very much looking forward to meeting Mr. Murat Sahin, UNICEF’s representative

in Ukraine, as was envisaged in your letter. Unfortunately this meeting still hasn't taken place, which is the reason of big disappointment for those who promote rights of children in Russia and Ukraine.

We have been recently informed that the personal data of at least three more children is on display at "Myrotvorets" (respective screenshots are attached to this letter, please handle this data confidentially).

Clearly this is only a tip of the iceberg and a meticulous search will produce many more results. It means that the case of Faina is not an isolated episode but rather an evidence of a consistent trend.

This is deeply concerning and is a clear violation of Article 16 of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) which states that "no child shall be subjected to arbitrary or unlawful interference with his or her privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to unlawful attacks on his or her honour and reputation". Since CRC is at the heart of UNICEF's work we strongly believe that this violation shouldn't go unnoticed.

In this respect we would like to request UNICEF to publicly address this issue and appeal to the removal of any data of children from "Myrotvorets".

We would also like to ask your personal engagement in the case of Ms. Faina Savenkova in order to organize her in person meeting with one of the designated representatives of UNICEF office in Ukraine.

Please accept, Ms. Fore, the assurances of my highest consideration.
