Addendum

Since the completion of the Secretary-General's report, a reply has been received from the Government of Barbados. The substantive paragraph of the reply is reproduced herewith.

BARBADOS

[Original: English]

The Government of Barbados has no objection in principle to the establishment, within the framework of the International Atomic Energy Agency, of an international service for nuclear explosions for peaceful purposes under appropriate international control, but would wish to reserve its position until further details are available on the structure of the body which is to be set up. The Government of Barbados would favour more equitable representation of non-nuclear States in the operation of such a service.
