

APPLICATION OF ISRAEL FOR MEMBERSHIP
IN THE UNITED NATIONS

Letter from the President of the Security Council
to the President of the General Assembly

Lake Success, 7 March 1949

I have the honour to request you to transmit to the General Assembly the following resolution on the admission of Israel to membership in the United Nations, adopted by the Security Council at its 414th meeting on 4 March 1949:

"THE SECURITY COUNCIL,

"HAVING RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED the application of Israel for membership in the United Nations,

"DECIDES that in its judgment Israel is a peace-loving State and is able and willing to carry out the obligations contained in the Charter, and accordingly

"RECOMMENDS to the General Assembly that it admit Israel to membership in the United Nations."

In accordance with rule 60, paragraph 2, of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, I also request you to transmit to the General Assembly, for its information, a letter* from the Chairman of the Committee on the Admission of New Members to the President of the Security Council and the verbatim records** of the Council's 383rd to 386th and 413th to 414th meetings at which the application of Israel was discussed.
