#### SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON PALESTINE

COMMUNICATION FROM THE JEWISH AGENCY ON HOFRNING THE APPLICATION FOR HEARING OF DR. GRINBERG

The following letter has been received from the Jewish Agency for Palestine enclosing a letter from Dr. Zalman Grinberg requesting a hearing:

"11 July 1947

The Chairman, UNSCOP.

Dear Sir,

Dr. Z. Grinberg wishes me to apply on his behalf for an opportunity to appear before the Special Committee to give evidence on behalf of the Jewish Displaced Persons in Europe.

Dr. Grinberg has been a leader of the Displaced Persons for many years and has survived all the experiences of the massacres and persecution of the Jews in Europe. His evidence, therefore, will in a sense represent tens of thousands of Jews who have survived and millions of those who have perished.

Dr. Grinberg submitted a letter to you but I understand from your secretary that it has been mislaid. May this letter therefore be taken in lieu of his formal request.

Sir,

As one of the survivors of Hitler's extermination camps, may I request the privilege of presenting evidence before your committee.

Following my liberation from the infamous camp of Dachau in 1945, I became the chairman of the Central Committee of the Liberated Jews of the American Zone in Germany. Grateful that I succeeded in escaping death at Hitler's hands, I feel it my duty to speak on behalf of those who fell and to present a plea for those who survived but who remain homeless in displaced persons camps two years after Hitler's defeat and their liberation.

The Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry granted me the opportunity of an appearance in Munich, a year ago, and I would be deeply grateful if I were permitted a further opportunity to be of service to my people.
