AD HOC COMMITTEE ON THE PALESTINIAN QUESTION

Communications Received during the Period

4 November - 10 November 1947

- A. COMMUNICATIONS REQUESTING HEARINGS BEFORE THE AD HOC COMMITTEE.
No communications received.
- B. COMMUNICATIONS SUBMITTING MEMORANDA.
1. Letter dated 22 October from the United Kingdom Delegation forwarding, at the request of the Central Camp Committee, Caracolos Camps, Cyprus, a copy of a memorandum submitted by the Central Camp Committee to the British Government. The Memorandum urges that the Cyprus Camps be immediately abolished and their inmates transferred forthwith to Palestine.
- C. COMMUNICATIONS REQUESTING UNITED NATIONS ACTION OR INTERVENTION.
1. Letter dated 26 October from the President of the Syrian and Lebanese American Federation of the Eastern States (of the United States), Boston, enclosing a resolution adopted by the Federation. The resolution demands that the present population of Palestine be allowed to determine their country's future; protests that the United Nations has no right, under its Charter, to partition Palestine; and affirms that the United Nations should solve the problem of the displaced persons by promoting their emigration to countries willing to receive them.
 2. Cable dated 31 October from a group of natives of Palestine in Mexico, Nogales, protesting against the suggested partition of Palestine and proposing that Palestine should be granted independence through a treaty between the United Nations and the Arab League "forcing the latter to guarantee order and equity" between Jews and Arabs in Palestine. It is requested that the letter be read to the delegates to the United Nations.
- D. OTHER COMMUNICATIONS.
1. Two letters dated 4 and 8 October from the Secretaries of branches of the Moslem Brothers, Alexandria, rejecting the UNSCOP majority recommendations and declaring that 70 million Arabs backed by 300 million Moslems will defend the rights of Arab Palestine.
