GEINERAL COMMITTEE<br>ORGANIZATION OF THE THIRD REGULAR SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY<br>Memorandum by the Secretary-General

The Secretary-General has the honour to place before the General Committee certain ouggestions regarding the arrangements for the meetinge of the General Assembly and its Main Committees during the third session.

## Schedule of Moetings

1. It is suggested that both plenary and committee meetings should be acheduled to begin at 10.30 a.m. and at 3 p.m.
2. The Secretary-General has made arrangementa for the servicing of four Main Committess eeeting simultaneously. He wishes to suggest that in the initial stages of the Committees' work four Main Comittees be scheduled to meet each morning and four each afternoon.
3. The schedule will be so arranged us to provide two meetings per dey for committees that have the heaviest scnedule. Other Committees will meet either once per dey or less frequently. Simultaneous meetings of the Second, Third, and Joint Second and Third Committees, on the one hand, and of the Fourth and Sixth Committees, on the other, will be avoided. However, owing to the great pressure of work, other combinations of Committees meeting at the same time will be unavoidable.
4. Plenary meatings will be held in the General Assembly Hell in the Palais de Chaillot. The Main Committees will meet in the Committee Roons, three of which are located in the "Aile Passy" and one in the "Aile Paris" of the Palaia de Chaillot. The General Committee will usually be ocheduled to meet in Committee Room No. 3.
5. It is proposed that a six-day working week be established but that as a general rule there should be no night meetings. In view of the beavy programme it is urged that delegations make every effort to arrive at the scheduled meeting place on time.

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## Seating Arrangements

6. At a recent Secretary-General's staff meeting lots were drawn to choose the Member to occupy the first desk on the Assembly Floor from which the alphabetical seating order will begin. Liberia was the name drawn and consequently Liberia will ait at the firgt desk at the extrems right of the President. At the initial meetings of the Main Compittees the same seating order will be observed. There will be, however, a daily rotetion of one place in the Main Committees thereafter.
