Statement on the proposed shipment of hazardous and
radioactive material through the Caribbean

The Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) expressed their grave concern at the proposed shipment of hazardous and radioactive material through the Caribbean subregion and waters falling under the jurisdiction of CARICOM member States.

In this regard they recognized the serious dangers such shipments could present both for the environment as well as for the health and safety of the people of the region.

The Ministers decided to initiate immediate consultations with the appropriate United Nations agencies and other relevant international bodies as well as with the countries concerned with or involved in the transport of such material in order to determine what action may be required to ensure the safety and security of the region.
