

Allocation of agenda items to the First Committee

Letter dated 19 September 2001 from the President of the General Assembly to the Chairman of the First Committee

I have the honour to transmit to you herewith the decisions taken by the General Assembly at the 3rd plenary meeting of its fifty-sixth session pertaining to the allocation of items to the First Committee.

I wish to draw your attention to the recommendations on the organization of the session contained in section II of the report of the General Committee (A/56/250). Those recommendations were also approved by the General Assembly at its 3rd plenary meeting.

May I also draw your attention to the paragraphs of sections III and IV of the report concerning the agenda of the Main Committees.

I earnestly request your cooperation in these matters.
