1. The CHAIRMAN, on behalf of the Committee, expressed his most sincere condolences to the Belgian delegation on the death of Queen Elisabeth.
2. Mr. LEFEVRE (Belgium) said that the Belgian delegation was deeply touched by the sympathy that had been expressed.

3. The CHAIRMAN said that for that meeting there were no names on the list of speakers in the general debate on agenda item 30, doubtless because the relevant draft resolution had not yet been circulated. He hoped that the sponsors would agree on a final text as soon as possible, in order to facilitate the consideration of the question. Since the same situation was liable to arise in connexion with other agenda items relating to disarmament, he asked all members of the Committee to be good enough to prepare themselves so that the Committee could continue the consideration of its agenda without interruption.
