STATUS OF THE CONVENTION ON THE ELIMINATION OF ALL FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN

Bulgaria, China, Costa Rica, Cuba, Denmark, Egypt, Ethiopia, Finland, German Democratic Republic, Iceland, Nigeria, Norway, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Yugoslavia: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Considering that one of the purposes of the United Nations, as stated in articles 1 and 55 of the Charter, is to promote universal respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms without distinction of any kind, including any distinction as to sex,

Affirming that women and men should participate and contribute on a basis of equality in the social, economic and political processes of development and should share equally in improved conditions of life,

Recalling its resolution 34/180, by which it adopted the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women,

Recalling also its resolution 35/140,

<u>Having noted</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the status of the nvention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women $\frac{1}{36}$ and Add.1),

1. <u>Notes</u> with appreciation that a significant number of Member States have ^{lready} ratified or acceded to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of ^{lisc}rimination against Women;

2. <u>Welcomes</u> with great satisfaction that, as a result, the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women entered into force on September 3, 1981;

3. <u>Notes</u> further that an important number of Member States have signed the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women;

4. <u>Invites</u> all States, which have not yet done so to become parties to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women by ratifying or acceding to it;

5. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its thirty-seventh session a report on the status of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women.
