PROPOSED PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1988-1989

WORLD DISARMAMENT CONFERENCE

Programne budget implications of draft resolution A/C, 1/42/L. 53

Statement eubmitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly

A, Request contained in the draft resolution

- 1. At its 44th meeting, on 16 November 1987, the First Committee adopted without a vote draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.53. A statement of programme budget implications of the draft resolution was before the Committee in document A/C.1/42/L.79.
- 2. Under the terms of operative paragraph 3 of draft resolution A/C.1/42/L. 53, the General Aeeembly would renew the mandate of the Ad Hoc Committee on the World Disarmament Conference.
- 3. By operative paragraph 6, the General Assembly would request the Ad Hoc Committee to hold one session in 1988 of two days' duration for the preparation and adoption of its report to the General Assembly at its third special session devoted to disarmament.

B. Relationship of proposed requset to the approved programme of work

4. The activities proposed fall under chapter 1, Political and Secur i ty Council Affairs activities, programme 2, Activities of the Department for Disarmament Affairs, subprogramme 1, Deliberation and negotiation, of the medium-term plan for the period 1984-1989 1/. It should also be recalled that since 1971, the

General Assembly has annually requested the Ad HoC Committee to continue its activities, most recently under resolution 41/61 of 3 December 1986.

c. Activities by which the proposed requests would be implemented

5. Should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution, the Secretary-General would undertake the necessary preparations for and servicing of one session of two days' duration of the Ad Hoc Committee in 1388, including the preparation of all necessary background documentation.

D. Modif ications required in the approved programme of work

6. The substantive servicing of the Ad Hoc Committee on the World Disarmament Conference by the Secretariat has been included as an output under programme element 1.5 of subprogramme 1, Deliberation and negotiation, of section 2B of the proposed Programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989. 2' Accordingly, no modification of the proposed programs of work for the biennium under section 2B would be required.

E. Additional requirements at full cost

7. Should the General Assembly decide to adopt draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.53, the related full cost of servicing one session of two days' duration of the Ad Hoc Committee is estimated at \$83,000. The meetings would require the provision of interpretation into six languages; translat ton of pre-session documentation of 2 pageo (one document) in five languages (Arabic, English, French, Russian, Spanish); in-eeseion documentation totalling 30 pages (five documents) in five languages (Arabic, English, French, Russian and Spanish)) and translation of poet-session documentation totalling 30 pages (one document) in the six languages of the General Assembly. The related conference-servicing requirements can be broken down as follows:

F. Potential for absorption

8. These cost estimates are **based** on the theoretical assumption **that** no part of the conference-servicing requirements would be met from within the permanent capacity of the Department of Conference Services and would require additional resources for temporary assistance for meetings. The extent to which the permanent capacity of the Department needs to be supplemented by temporary assistance resources can only be determined in the light of the calendar. of conferences to be approved by the General Assembly. However, as indicated in paragraph 29.6 of the proposed programme budget, 3/ the 1988-1989 requirements under temporary assistance for meetings have been estimated on the basis of a five-year average of appropriations and actual expenditure for the period 1982-1986, and included in the Z&rotary-General's initial estimates. In other words, provision has been made in the proposed programe budget not only for meetings known at the time of budget preparation but also for meetings that would be authorized subsequently, provided that the number and distribution of meetings and conferences in the next biennium is consistent with the pattern experienced over the past five years, On that basis, it is estimated that no additional cost would **be incurred** under section 29 of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989 as **a** result **of** the adoption of draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.53.
