

# Contingency fund: consolidated statement of programme budget implications and revised estimates

#### Report of the Secretary-General\*

- 1. The consolidated statement of programme budget implications and revised estimates is hereby submitted in accordance with the guidelines for the contingency fund contained in the annex to General Assembly resolution 42/211. Potential new charges, which amount to \$5,991,700, are detailed in the annex to the present report. The amounts indicated in respect of each item correspond to those recommended by the Fifth Committee upon its consideration of individual statements and proposals for revised estimates and have been subjected to recosting based on the updated parameters applied to the first performance report on the programme budget for the biennium 2010-2011 (A/65/589).
- Concerning the revised estimates under section 23, Human rights, of the programme budget for the biennium 2010-2011, resulting from the increase in the membership of the Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (A/65/400), the cost of the one-day induction course in Geneva in the amount of \$12,400 has been identified for absorption within the approved level of resources under section 23 for the biennium 2010-2011. In addition, the amount of \$967,500 has been identified for absorption in respect of the revised estimates resulting from the resolutions and decisions adopted by the Human Rights Council at its fifteenth session under the approved appropriation for the biennium 2010-2011 under section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council affairs and Conference Management (\$609,300); section 23 (\$357,300); and section 28E, Administration, Geneva (\$900). In respect of the programme budget implications relating to the total elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and the comprehensive implementation of and follow-up to the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action, and the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases, the amounts of \$116,100 and \$208,000, respectively, have been identified for absorption.

- 3. In its resolution 63/266 of 24 December 2008, the General Assembly decided that the level of the contingency fund for the biennium 2010-2011 should be set at the level of \$36,532,900. The balance in the contingency fund for the biennium 2010-2011, as noted in resolution 64/245 of 24 December 2009, was \$31,331,900, after taking into account charges approved during the main part of the sixty-fourth session. At the resumed sixty-fourth session, pursuant to resolutions 64/288 of 24 June 2010 and 64/260 of 29 March 2010, the Assembly approved additional charges totalling \$2,932,100 to the contingency fund in respect of the Emergency Preparedness and Support Unit/Office of Human Resources Management (\$2,745,000) and the financing of the United Nations Office to the African Union (\$187,100). After the approved charges at the resumed sixty-fourth session are taken into account, the balance of the contingency fund for the biennium 2010-2011 would amount to \$28,399,800. The amount of new and potential charges of \$5,991,700, as detailed in the annex to the present report, is therefore within the approved balance of the contingency fund.
- 4. The Fifth Committee, in accordance with paragraph 5 of the annex to resolution 42/211, may proceed to recommend to the General Assembly the appropriation of the required amounts under the relevant sections of the programme budget as follows:
