PROGRAMME AND THEREAFTER UNTIL 31 MARCH 1994

1. In the Final Act of the Eleventh United Nations Pledging Conference for the United Nations Disarmament Information Programme (A/CONF.170/1), the Secretary-General was requested to maintain, until 31 March 1994, a list incorporating pledges made or announced at the Conference and those made thereafter until that date, and to issue that list as part of the records of the Conference.
2. The present document is issued pursuant to that request.
