**Report on the status of the Assistance Fund under Part VII
of the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions
of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of
10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and
Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly
Migratory Fish Stocks**

Note by the Secretariat

1. By its resolution 58/14, the General Assembly decided to establish an Assistance Fund under Part VII of the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks to assist developing States parties in the implementation of the Agreement. Pursuant to that resolution, the Fund is jointly administered by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), which acts as the implementing office for the Fund, and the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea of the Office of Legal Affairs of the Secretariat. The terms of reference for the Assistance Fund provide that, in addition to the submission of an annual report on activities of the Fund, a report on the activities of the Fund, including a financial statement of the contributions to and disbursements from the Fund, shall be presented to the Review Conference provided for under article 36 of the Agreement.

2. Pursuant to that requirement, the Secretariat hereby transmits the FAO report on the activities of the Fund, dated March 2016.

I. Introduction

1. In November 2003, the General Assembly, in its resolution 58/14, established the Assistance Fund under Part VII of the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement), to assist developing States parties in the implementation of the Agreement. It also decided that the Fund would be administered by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), in collaboration with the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea of the Office of Legal Affairs of the Secretariat. On 19 April 2005, the Fund was established. It is managed in accordance with its terms of reference and the FAO Financial Regulations, as well as other applicable rules.

II. Contributions to the Assistance Fund

2. The United Nations and FAO have continued to make calls for contributions to the Assistance Fund at international forums, including at sessions of the General Assembly and the FAO Committee on Fisheries, as well as on the web page of the Assistance Fund. A call for contributions was also made at the tenth to twelfth rounds of informal consultations of States parties to the 1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement (New York, 7-8 April 2014, 16-17 March 2015 and 22-23 March 2016). Other fundraising activities include a joint letter dated 11 December 2014 from the Division and FAO addressed to permanent representatives and permanent observer missions to the United Nations in New York, calling for contributions.

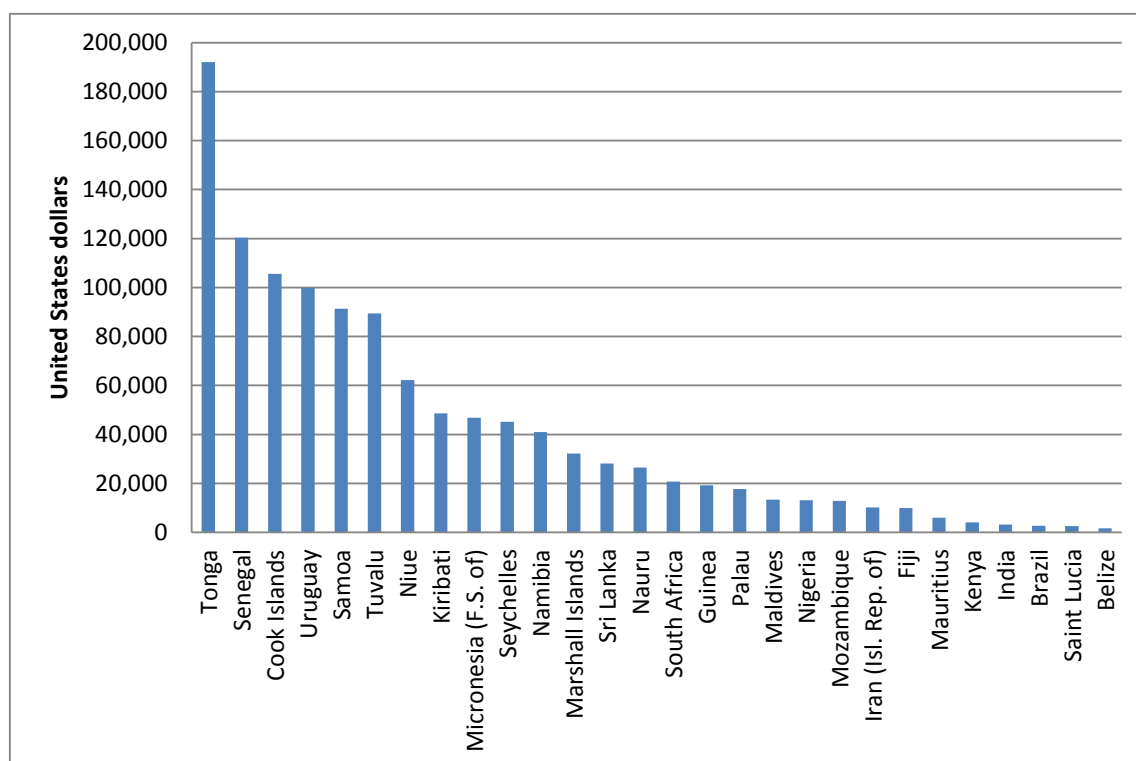
3. As at 31 December 2015, the Governments of Canada, Iceland, Lebanon, New Zealand, Norway and the United States of America, all States parties to the 1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement, had made financial contributions to the Assistance Fund totalling \$1,667,455. Annex I shows contributions to the Fund together with accrued interest. As at 31 December 2015, the Fund's total receipts amounted to \$1,716,953. Since the Review Conference on the 1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement resumed in 2010, contributions totalling \$531,800 and \$296,798 have been received from the Governments of Australia and Norway, respectively.

III. Requests for assistance and use of the Fund

4. Information about the existence and purpose of the Assistance Fund has been disseminated widely by the United Nations and FAO, including through electronic means, international meetings and contacts with relevant regional fisheries bodies. Owing to the near depletion of the Fund, States parties were informed in October 2014 that its use had to be temporarily suspended. Applications for assistance were accepted again following the replenishment of the Fund in April 2015 with a contribution of \$200,000 from the Government of Norway.

5. As at 31 December 2015, the total expenditure from the Fund was estimated at \$1,575,537. Since 2011, the Assistance Fund has been used exclusively for travel-related expenses. Annex II provides details of expenditure from the Assistance Fund as at 31 December 2014.¹ Expenditure is categorized according to the purposes for which assistance is permitted and administrative expenses, as reflected, respectively, in paragraphs 14 and 21 of the Fund's terms of reference. The figure below shows the allocation of travel expenditure by State party for the period from 2006 to 2014;² further details of this expenditure by category (under para. 14 of the terms of reference) are provided in annex III.

¹ At the time of writing, the financial report for the year 2015 was still under preparation. Total expenditure for the year 2015 is estimated at \$83,012.

² Bangladesh benefited for the first time from the Assistance Fund in 2015.

6. The panel of experts, established pursuant to paragraph 15 of the terms of reference to review applications and make recommendations on the amount of financial assistance to be given in each case, has not been convened since the Review Conference resumed in 2010, as only travel-related expenses were supported by the Fund. Details of Fund allocations under FAO letters of agreement³ since 2009 are provided in annex IV.

IV. Assistance Fund balance

7. As at 31 March 2016, the balance of the Assistance Fund was \$107,987.

³ A letter of agreement is an instrument setting forth the terms of agreement between FAO and a recipient organization for the production of specified outputs, which will contribute to the achievements of specific objectives through the supply of services and/or other work product(s). A recipient organization is a governmental, regional, intergovernmental, parastatal or other non-profit institution that will, whenever possible, be located in the country where the services are to be rendered or the materials used.
