

50/... Technical assistance and capacity-building to improve human rights in Libya

The Human Rights Council,

Guided by the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Reaffirming the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and relevant international human rights treaties,

Confirming the primary responsibility of States to promote and protect human rights,

Reaffirming its strong commitment to the sovereignty, independence, unity and territorial integrity of Libya,

Reaffirming also its previous resolutions on Libya, in particular Human Rights Council resolutions 43/39 of 22 June 2020 and 48/25 of 11 October 2021,


Commending the continued positive cooperation and constructive engagement of the Libyan authorities with the fact-finding mission, which allowed the mission to carry out its mandate in a comprehensive and impartial manner, notably by facilitating recent missions and sharing information about their own investigative and prosecution efforts,

Commending also the Government of Tunisia for hosting and facilitating the work of the fact-finding mission,

Noting with appreciation all the work done to date by the fact-finding mission,1

Acknowledging that the fact-finding mission was delayed in the commencement of its work by administrative and logistical challenges, and that more time will be needed for it to complete its remaining activities,

- 1. *Decides* to extend the mandate of the fact-finding mission on Libya for a final, non-extendable period of nine months, to present its concluding recommendations;
- 2. *Requests* the fact-finding mission to present, to the Human Rights Council at its fifty-second session, its final report on the situation of human rights in Libya, during an

interactive dialogue, with a particular focus on its concrete and concluding recommendations for the Libyan authorities in the priority areas of:

- (a) Achieving transitional justice and national reconciliation;
- (b) Strengthening national human rights institutions and the national action plan for human rights to follow-up on the investigation of the fact-finding mission and recommendations made by the treaty bodies and in the context of the universal periodic review;
- (c) Strengthening the rule of law, including supporting judicial processes and law enforcement;
- 3. Renews its request to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to provide more comprehensive and sustainable technical assistance and capacity-building to empower the Libyan authorities to follow up on the recommendations made by the fact-finding mission to protect and promote human rights, to prevent human rights violations and abuses and to ensure accountability, in accordance with the State's priorities;
- 4. *Requests* the Libyan authorities to continue to cooperate and engage with the fact-finding mission, including by granting it access without delay;
- Requests the Secretary-General to provide the Office of the High Commissioner with the resources necessary for the full implementation of the present resolution;
 - 6. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter.

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
