

## **Empowering Girls Technologically: an Action to Advance Gender Equality**

Beijing NGO Association for International Exchanges and its member organizations have long been focusing on issues including gender equality and women empowerment.

The COVID-19 pandemic has posed unprecedented challenges to economic development and global governance, making gender inequality even more prominent. We believe that the equal participation of women is of great significance to economic recovery, governance improvement, and a bright future for common development. We need to take immediate action to give support from different levels and provide solutions for different groups of women.

As women's organizations in Beijing and members of the Beijing NGO Association for International Exchanges, the Beijing Women's Federation and the Beijing Women's International Center have noticed the widening gender gap in emerging fields of science and technology. There is an urgent need to empower women technologically in the technology-driven digital age to ensure women's equal participation. They are looking forward to exploring the universe, paying attention to difficulties in the fight against the pandemic, and advocating green development. The Action has allowed girls to see their future in technology, and their active participation and impressive performance have also shown us the possibility of achieving gender equality in the future development.

Currently the gender gap is widening around the world, but people from different sectors are also making unremitting efforts to overcome difficulties and bridge the gap. We are looking forward to more resources to support the "Technology Empowering Girls for Gender Equality" Beijing Action so that we can strive to build a high-quality learning platform for girls to improve their scientific literacy.

We call on partners across the world to join the Action to enhance cooperation in the field aiming to cultivate more female talents in science and technology and increase the diversity and inclusiveness of solutions so that more girls can benefit.
