FINAL DOCUMENT

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I. INTRODUCTION

1. Article 13 of the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996 (Amended Protocol II), annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects (CCW), provides for a conference of the High Contracting Parties to the Protocol to be held annually for the purpose of consultations and cooperation on all issues related to the operation of the Protocol.

2. The Ninth Annual Conference held on 6 November 2007 agreed to recommend to the Tenth Annual Conference a provisional agenda, as contained in Annex III of the Final Document of the Conference (CCW/AP.II/CONF.9/2). It also considered the estimated costs of the Tenth Annual Conference and recommended them for adoption at the time of the Conference in 2008 (CCW/AP.II/CONF.9/2, Annex IV). The Meeting of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention, held from 7 to 13 November 2007, decided, as contained in paragraph 40 of its Report (CCW/MSP/2007/5), that the Tenth Annual Conference of the High Contracting Parties to Amended Protocol II be held on 12 November 2008 at Geneva.

II. ORGANIZATION OF THE TENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

3. The Tenth Annual Conference was opened on 12 November 2008 by the Deputy Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and Director of the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs, Geneva Branch, Mr. Tim Caughley.

4. The Conference held two plenary meetings. At its first plenary meeting on 12 November 2008 the Conference confirmed the nomination of Ambassador Jürg Streuli of Switzerland as President of the Tenth Annual Conference. It also confirmed the nominations of Mr. Cheng Jingye of China, Mr. Valery Semin of the Russian Federation, and Mr. Johann Kellerman of South Africa as Vice-Presidents.

5. Also at its first plenary meeting, the Conference appointed Mr. Peter Kolarov, Head of Section “Humanitarian Conventions”, United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs, Geneva Branch, as Secretary-General of the Conference. Mr. Bantan Nugroho, Political Affairs Officer, served as Secretary of the Tenth Annual Conference.

6. The following States, which have notified the Depositary of their consent to be bound by Amended Protocol II, participated in the work of the Conference: Albania, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Guatemala, Holy See, Honduras, Hungary, India, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Malta, Monaco, Morocco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, Senegal, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Switzerland, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, and Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of).

7. The following States parties to the Convention participated as observers: Benin, Cuba, Georgia, Lao People’s Democratic Republic and Saudi Arabia.

8. The following Signatory State to the Convention also participated in the work of the Conference: Egypt.

9. The following States not parties to Amended Protocol II participated as observers: Angola, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Brunei Darussalam, Chad, Côte d’Ivoire, Ghana, Guinea, Haiti, Kuwait, Lebanon, Mozambique, Oman, Rwanda, Singapore, and Syrian Arab Republic.

10. The representatives of the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research (UNIDIR), United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS) and United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA) also participated in the work of the Conference.

11. The representatives of the Geneva International Centre for Humanitarian Demining (GICHD) and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) attended public meetings of the Conference.

12. The representatives of the following non-governmental organisations also took part in the work of the Conference as observers: Actiongroup Landmine.de, Cluster Munition Coalition, Geneva Call, Handicap International, Human Rights Watch, International Campaign to Ban Landmines (ICBL), and Landmine Action.

III. WORK OF THE TENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

13. At its first plenary meeting, the Conference adopted its agenda, as contained in Annex I, and noted that the Rules of Procedure for Annual Conferences of the States Parties to Amended Protocol II, adopted by the First Annual Conference held in 1999 and amended on 11 December

2002, as contained in CCW/AP.II/CONF.6/2, were applicable, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Tenth Annual Conference.

14. At the same meeting the Conference adopted the arrangements for meeting the costs of the Conference, as contained in document CCW/AP.II/CONF.9/2, Annex IV.

15. At the same meeting the Conference received a message from the Secretary-General of the United Nations, Mr. Ban Ki-moon, which was delivered by Mr. Tim Caughley, Deputy Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and Director of the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs, Geneva Branch.

16. The following delegations participated in the General Exchange of Views and the discussions on the Review of the Operation and Status of the Protocol and Consideration of Matters Arising from Reports by High Contracting Parties, according to paragraph 4 of Article 13: Azerbaijan, Australia, Belarus, Brazil, Canada, China, France (on behalf of the EU, Croatia, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, and Turkey, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro and Serbia, as well as Armenia, Republic of Moldova, and Ukraine), Georgia, India, Ireland, Japan, Lithuania, Pakistan, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, and the United States of America. The representatives of UNMAS (on behalf of the United Nations Mine Action Team) and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), as well as Human Rights Watch and International Campaign to Ban Landmines (ICBL) also took the floor. The statements made during the general exchange of views are reflected in the summary records of the Conference, which will be issued at a later date.

17. The Conference considered the issue on the deferral of compliance with paragraphs 2 (b) and 3 (a) and/or (b) of the Technical Annex of Amended Protocol II, as permitted under paragraphs 2 (c) and 3 (c) of the Technical Annex. The Conference took note that, as Amended Protocol II entered into force on 3 December 1998, the permitted deferral period expired on 3 December 2007.

18. In accordance with Article 13 (4) of the Protocol, the Conference had before it national annual reports from the following States: Australia, Austria, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Croatia, Czech Republic, Ecuador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Guatemala, Holy See, Hungary, India, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, , Morocco, Norway, Pakistan, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and United States of America. The reports contained information on:

- (a) Dissemination of information on the Protocol to armed forces and to the civilian populations;
- (b) Mine clearance and rehabilitation programmes;
- (c) Steps taken to meet technical requirements of the Protocol and any other relevant information pertaining thereto;
- (d) Legislation related to the Protocol;

- (e) Measures taken on international technical information exchange, on international cooperation on mine clearance, and on technical cooperation and assistance;
- (f) Other relevant matters; and
- (g) Information provided to the database on mine clearance established within the United Nations System.

IV. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

19. At its second plenary meeting, the Conference decided to issue an appeal on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of Amended Protocol II. The appeal also calls upon all States that have not yet done so to take all measures to accede to Amended Protocol II as soon as possible. The appeal is contained in Annex II.

20. The Conference recommended that the Secretary-General of the United Nations, as Depositary of Amended Protocol II, and the President of the Conference, on behalf of the High Contracting Parties, exercise their authority to achieve the goal of universality of Amended Protocol II. To this effect, the Conference requested the President to consider reporting to the sixty-fourth session of the United Nations General Assembly on his endeavours. The Conference also called on the High Contracting Parties to promote wider adherence to Amended Protocol II in their respective regions, pursuant to Actions 2 to 5 of the Plan of Action to Promote the Universality of the Convention and its annexed Protocols adopted by the Third Review Conference of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention.

21. In light of the decision taken at the Fourth Annual Conference in 2002 to designate the President and Vice-Presidents at the end of the Conference in order to assure the continuity of the preparatory work by the presidency, the Conference decided to nominate Ambassador Jānis Mažeiks of Latvia as President designate of the Eleventh Annual Conference of the High Contracting Parties to be held in 2009 and the representatives of China, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of), and Germany as Vice-Presidents designate.

22. The Conference addressed the issue of holding the Eleventh Annual Conference in 2009 and decided that the issue of the date of the Conference would be addressed at the Meeting of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention to be held on 13 and 14 November 2008. The Conference decided that a preparatory meeting for the Eleventh Annual Conference was not required. The Conference agreed to recommend to the Eleventh Annual Conference a provisional agenda, as contained in Annex III. It also considered the estimated costs of the Eleventh Annual Conference, as contained in Annex IV, and recommended them for adoption at the time of the Conference in 2009.

23. The Conference decided to establish an informal open-ended Group of Experts. Under the overall responsibility of the President-designate of the Eleventh Annual Conference, the Group of Experts shall review the operation and status of the Protocol, consider matters arising from reports by High Contracting Parties according to paragraph 4 of Article 13 of Amended

Protocol II, as well as development of technologies to protect civilians against indiscriminate effects of mines. The Group shall also address the issue of improvised explosive devices.

24. The Conference also decided that the 2009 session of the Group of Experts shall take place on 20 and 21 April 2009 and adopted the estimated costs of the Group of Experts, as contained in Annex V. The work of the Group of Experts shall be considered by the Eleventh Annual Conference.

25. At its second plenary meeting, the Tenth Annual Conference adopted its final document as contained in document CCW/AP.II/CONF.10/CRP.1, as orally amended, which is being issued as document CCW/AP.II/CONF.10/2.

**AN APPEAL BY THE TENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE
HIGH CONTRACTING PARTIES TO AMENDED PROTOCOL II
ON THE OCCASION OF THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE
ENTRY INTO FORCE OF THE PROTOCOL**

(as adopted at the second plenary meeting on 12 November 2008)

We, the States which have notified the Depositary of their consent to be bound by Amended Protocol II to the CCW, meeting in Geneva on 12 November 2008 for our Tenth Annual Conference:

Bearing in mind the important contribution of Amended Protocol II to international efforts to alleviate the suffering caused by certain conventional weapons which may be deemed to be excessively injurious or to have indiscriminate effects;

Noting that Amended Protocol II is the only international legal instrument which covers all types of mines, booby-traps and other devices;

Having reviewed the operation and status of Amended Protocol II, in accordance with paragraph 3 (a) of Article 13;

Having considered the national annual reports presented by States which have notified the Depositary of their consent to be bound by Amended Protocol II;

Welcome the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of Amended Protocol II on 3 December 1998 and the fact that 92 States have notified the Depositary of their consent to be bound by Amended Protocol II;

Welcome the adoption by the Third Review Conference of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention of the Plan of Action to Promote the Universality of the CCW and its annexed Protocols;

Emphasize the importance of achieving the widest possible adherence to Amended Protocol II;

Urge all States that have not yet done so to take all measures to accede to Amended Protocol II as soon as possible.

**ESTIMATED COSTS OF THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE

CERTAIN CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS WHICH MAY BE DEEMED TO BE
EXCESSIVELY INJURIOUS OR TO HAVE INDISCRIMINATE EFFECTS**

(as recommended at the second plenary meeting on 12 November 2008)

1. The Tenth Annual Conference of the States Parties to Amended Protocol II to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed To Be Excessively Injurious or To Have Indiscriminate Effects, held in Geneva on 12 November 2008, decided to convene a one-day meeting of the Eleventh Annual Conference of the States Parties in November 2009.
2. This document is submitted pursuant to the above-mentioned decision of the States Parties and provides estimated costs in the amount of US\$250,400 for convening that meeting. A breakdown of these costs is provided in the attached table.
3. It should be noted that the costs are estimated on the basis of past experience and anticipated workload. The actual costs will be determined after the closure of the meeting and completion of related work, with all relevant expenditures recorded in the accounts. At that time, any adjustments in contributions by the participants sharing the costs will be determined accordingly.
4. With regard to the financial arrangements, it will be recalled that, in accordance with the practice followed on the occasion of previous multilateral disarmament conferences and related meetings, and as reflected in their Rules of Procedure, the costs are shared among the States Parties participating in the conferences, based upon the United Nations scale of assessment prorated to take into account the number of States Parties participating in the meetings. States that are not States Parties but that have accepted the invitation to take part in the meetings share in the costs to the extent of their respective rates of assessment under the United Nations scale of assessments.
5. Subject to the States Parties' approval of the estimated costs and cost-sharing formula, assessment notices will be prepared based on the overall estimated costs and applicable cost-sharing formula. Since the above-mentioned activities shall have no financial implication for the regular budget of the Organization, States Parties should proceed with the payment of their share of the estimated costs as soon as assessment notices have been received.
