## **Letter dated 17 January 2011 from the Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament, on behalf of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, addressed to the President of the Conference on Disarmament transmitting the resolutions and decisions on disarmament and international security matters adopted by the General Assembly at its sixty-fifth session**
