Item 2
Financial, budgetary and administrative matters

The report on the annual review of the financial situation undertakes a comprehensive review and analysis, from the financial perspective, of UNDP activities at the global and aggregate levels. Item 5 **Funding commitments to UNFPA**

Item 7
Country programmes and related matters

In accordance with decision 2006/36 of the Executive Board, country programme documents reviewed at the annual session 2014 will be approved by the Board on a no-objection basis, unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing before the session of their wish to bring a particular country programme before the Executive Board. The final country programme documents for approval by the Board at the second regular session 2014 are as follows: Afghanistan, Angola, Comoros, Sierra Leone, Timor-Leste, Tunisia and Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of).

The Executive Board will also have before it a request for a two-year programme extension for Botswana in the East and Southern Africa region.

In accordance with decision 2014/7, the Executive Board will discuss and approve country programme documents at a single session, starting with the second regular session 2014. The Board will have before it, for discussion and approval, five country programme documents: Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ecuador, Guatemala and Paraguay, and State of Palestine.

The Executive Board may wish to approve: (a) the two-year programme extension Botswana; and (b) the country programme documents for Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ecuador, Guatemala, Paraguay and State of Palestine.

Item 9
Implementation of the QCPR

The session will focus on (i) elaboration of a specific proposal on critical mass in alignment with other Funds and Programmes, (ii) highlight and discuss measures by UNFPA to broaden its donor base and to improve communication and contribution incentives, and (iii) to continue dialogue with Member States on concrete options to enhance the quality of contributions towards full financing of development results.

United Nations Office for Project Services

In its resolution 39/220 the General Assembly established the need for recurrent reporting of statistical data on procurement by United Nations agencies on operational activities. As of 2008 and pursuant to Executive Board decision 2007/38, the Executive Director of UNOPS has assumed the responsibility of compiling and submitting the report. The 2013 report features a comprehensive trend analysis of United Nations procurement from developing countries and countries with economies in transition, including a category analysis of procurement of goods and services. The report also features a supplement on implementing innovative solutions in procurement. The supplement provides an overview of the benefits and challenges of innovative procurement, as well as case studies and contributions from practitioners and experts globally.

Financial, budgetary and administrative matters

The rationale for establishing joint procurement activities in the United Nations system is based on a shared understanding of the benefits of consolidating and standardizing procurement practices. Since January 2011, the United Nations organizations based in Copenhagen have been developing and implementing

opportunities for common procurement initiatives. Collaborative procurement projects led by UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS have delivered significant improvements and savings across the United Nations system. Many of these projects have also eliminated duplication, increased consistency and strengthened country office procurement. Since the first report on these activities in 2013, the organizations have derived continuing savings and benefits from their common procurement efforts, and additional initiatives were developed and delivered throughout 2013. A number of projects are under way in 2014, seeking to consolidate and standardize practices within the United Nations system. The report presents key findings and outcomes from the joint procurement work conducted in 2013, and sets out the initiatives under way in 2014. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the present report and comment on the progress made in collaborative procurement activities.

Item 12
Follow-up to UNAIDS Programme Coordinating Board meeting

Under this item, the Executive Board will have before it a joint UNDP and UNFPA report that addresses the implementation of the decisions and recommendations of the Programme Coordinating Board of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS). The report focuses on the implementation of decisions from the 32nd and 33rd meetings of the Programme Coordinating Board, respectively. The report highlights UNDP and UNFPA contributions in responding to HIV.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the present report and recommend ensuring that the critical roles of UNDP and UNFPA in working towards the end of the HIV epidemic, as articulated in their strategic plans, are fully reflected in a new strategy for UNAIDS.

Other matters

The Fifth Global Environment Facility (GEF) Assembly held in Cancún on 28-29 May 2014 approved five amendments to the Instrument for the Establishment of the Restructured Global Environment Facility (GEF Instrument). In accordance with paragraph 34 of the GEF Instrument, these amendments may become effective only after adoption by the three GEF Implementing Agencies: UNDP, United Nations Environment Programme and the World Bank. The Administrator has received a letter from the GEF Chief Executive Officer (annexed to the Note by the Administrator) informing her of the amendments and requesting her to facilitate the adoption of the amendments in accordance with the rules and procedural requirements of UNDP. A similar letter was sent to the heads of UNEP and the World Bank. The United Nations Environment Assembly of UNEP approved the amendments in full at its meeting in June 2014. The World Bank Board of Directors is scheduled to consider the amendments in September 2014. The Note by the Administrator describes the five amendments proposed for adoption and outlines their rationale and key implications for UNDP.
