Item 2

Structured funding dialogue

As requested by the Executive Board in its decision 2014/24 and in line with the implementation of the quadrennial comprehensive policy review of operational activities for development, UNDP will continue the structured dialogues with Member States to monitor and follow up the predictability, flexibility and alignment of resources provided for the implementation of the Strategic Plan, 2014-2017, including information on funding gaps.

Financial, budgetary and administrative matters

The report on the annual review of the financial situation undertakes a comprehensive review and analysis, from the financial perspective, of UNDP activities at the global and aggregate levels. The overview assesses the performance of the organization against the various sources for programming: UNDP regular resources, other resources, and UNCDF, and provides the financial position at the end of 2014 with illustrative comparators to the previous year. The financial data in both years are in accordance with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards.

Item 4 Funding commitments to UNDP

In line with Executive Board decision 98/23, the Board will have before it a report on the status of regular funding commitments for 2015 and a summary of the contributions to regular and other resources received in 2014. This year's report highlights a continuing decline in UNDP regular ('core') resources, a growing imbalance between regular and other resources with a high concentration of highly earmarked other resources, the lack of predictability of regular resources, and outlines UNDP efforts to diversify the donor base through its '100 partners' campaign and partnerships with the private sector and foundations.

**Item 6
Evaluation**

An evaluation was undertaken to assess the extent to which the UNDP gender equality strategy for the period 2008-2013 functioned as an ‘integrating dimension’ in the implementation of the strategic plan. It answers three broad evaluation questions, namely: (a) has UNDP contributed to gender equality and women’s empowerment results; (b) has UNDP integrated gender equality across the institution at the programme, policy, technical and cultural levels during the period 2008-2013; and (c) where have UNDP institutional change results been the most and least successful in improving gender equality and women’s empowerment development results. The evaluation is accompanied by the management response. The Board may wish to consider the conclusions and recommendations from the evaluation and may urge UNDP to factor the evaluation recommendations into future programming.

Item 12 United Nations Office for Project Services

Under this item, the Executive Board will have before it the UNOPS budget estimates for the biennium 2016-2017 which are rooted in the UNOPS strategic plan, 2014-2017 (DP/OPS/2013/3). UNOPS management resources are targeted to strengthen its ability to provide partners with advisory, implementation and transactional support services in the areas of its mandate.
