Item 1 Organizational matters

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2006/14 and rule 7 of the rules of procedure of the Executive Board of UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS, the Board will elect a new Bureau consisting of a President and four Vice-Presidents. The election will take place on 11 January 2016. According to the established pattern of rotation of posts among the various regional groups, the President of the Executive Board for 2016 should be elected from the Board members of the Eastern European group.

Under this item, the Executive Board will adopt the agenda and agree on the workplan for the session as presented by the Secretary of the Board. The Board will also approve the report of its second regular session 2015. A draft report was distributed to Board members for their comments; the final report contains comments received by or before the deadline.

In accordance with decision 96/25, a workplan for 2016 was prepared by the secretariat in consultation with the Bureau of the Executive Board and is submitted to the Board for adoption.

Item 3 Evaluation

An evaluation of the UNDP contribution to mine action is presented to the Board for consideration at the present session. The objective of the evaluation was to determine, to the fullest degree possible, the UNDP contribution to mine action, taking into account its global programme and considering evidence at country and community levels. The evaluation includes a global portfolio analysis covering all UNDP global, regional and country-based mine action programmes and projects since the beginning of UNDP involvement in mine action in the mid-1990s. The evaluation then considers a small sample of UNDP interventions at the country and community level, from which a more detailed exploration of UNDP contribution to mine action is undertaken, including some consideration of impact. The evaluation is accompanied by the management response. The Board may wish to consider the conclusions and recommendations from the evaluation and may urge UNDP to factor the evaluation recommendations into future programming.

Recommendations of the Board of Auditors

The UNDP and UNCDF report on the implementation of the recommendations of the United Nations Board of Auditors for 2014 reviews the notable progress made in addressing the top eight audit-related management priorities for 2014-2015 (as presented in document DP/2015/8 and supported by the Board in its decision 2015/5); presents the ongoing management efforts to fully address the top eight audit-related priorities; and reports on the implementation status of the recommendations of the United Nations Board of Auditors for the year ended 31 December 2014 and prior years for UNDP and UNCDF. Pursuant to Executive Board decision 2010/9, details of the implementation status of the audit recommendations and the full audit report of the United Nations Board of Auditors for UNDP and UNCDF (A/70/5/Add.1 and Add.2, respectively) are available on the Executive Board website.

Pursuant to decision 97/2 of the Executive Board, the Executive Director of UNFPA reports on the implementation of the recommendations contained in the report of the United Nations Board of Auditors for the financial period that ended on 31 December 2014 (A/70/5/Add.8). The United Nations Board of Auditors acknowledges that UNFPA is in good financial health, and provides an unqualified audit opinion for the organization's financial statements for the year that ended on 31 December 2014. A separate table, available on the UNFPA website, provides an updated status of the implementation of the audit recommendations. UNFPA also provided a management response to the issues mentioned in the report of the Director, Office of Audit and Investigation Services, on UNFPA internal audit and
