Annotations

1. Election of the Bureau

Rule 18 of the rules of procedure of the Council provides that, each year at the commencement of its 1st meeting, the Council shall elect a President and four Vice-Presidents from among the representatives of its members. The membership of the Council in 2003 is given in the annex below. According to the rotation of the office of President among the regional groups, the President for 2003 should be the representative of a member of the Latin American and Caribbean States group. The four Vice-Presidents of the Council shall be elected on the basis of equitable geographical distribution from the other four regional groups.

The President and Vice-Presidents shall constitute the Bureau. The Council, upon the recommendation of the President, shall decide on the special responsibilities of each Vice-President.

Pursuant to Council resolution 1988/77, a meeting of the Council will be held on 15 January 2003 for the election of the Bureau.

2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

Rule 13 of the rules of procedure of the Council provides that, at the beginning of each session, after the election of the Bureau when required under rule 18, the Council shall adopt the agenda for the session.

The present provisional agenda has been prepared in conformity with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 48/162 and with other relevant legislative decisions, including, in particular, the provisions of Assembly resolution 50/227.

Ad Hoc Advisory Group on African Countries Emerging from Conflict: Guinea-Bissau

Pursuant to Council resolution 2002/1 of 15 July 2002 and Council decision 2002/304 of 25 October 2002, the Council established an Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Guinea-Bissau to examine its humanitarian and economic needs, and review relevant programmes of support and prepare recommendations for a long-term programme of support, based on its development priorities through the integration of relief, rehabilitation, reconstruction and development into a comprehensive approach to peace and stability.

Application of intergovernmental organizations for observer status with the Council

By its decision 2002/207, the Council decided to include in the agenda of its substantive session of 2002 the application of an intergovernmental organization, namely, the Intergovernmental Institution for the Use of Micro-alga Spirulina against Malnutrition, for observer status with the Council. At its substantive session, the Council postponed consideration of this application.

The Council will also have before it the applications of two intergovernmental organizations requesting observer status, namely, the Islamic Development Bank and the Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

3. Basic programme of work of the Council

In accordance with rule 8 of the rules of procedure of the Council, the Council shall draw up, at its organizational session, with the assistance of the Secretary-General, its basic programme of work.

The Council will have before it the proposed basic programme of work of the Council for 2003 and 2004 prepared by the Secretariat in accordance with the relevant decisions of the Council and of the General Assembly.

In its decision 2002/309, the Council decided that the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2003 would be devoted to consideration of the following theme: "Promoting an integrated approach to rural development in developing countries for poverty eradication and sustainable development".

In the same decision, the Council decided that the coordination segment of its substantive session of 2003 would be devoted to consideration of the following theme: "The role of the Economic and Social Council in the integrated and coordinated implementation of the outcomes of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits".

The Council's attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 52/12 B by which the Assembly decided to create a humanitarian affairs segment of the Council. At its organizational session for 1999, the Council decided, in its decision 1999/208, to select a theme for the humanitarian affairs segment of its substantive session of 1999. The Council may wish to follow a similar procedure for its humanitarian affairs segment in 2003.

Pursuant to Council decision 1982/174 on the rationalization of the work of the Council, the Council decided to identify, at its organizational session, a subject relating to interregional cooperation, of common interest to all regions, for detailed consideration under the agenda item on regional cooperation, and to request the executive secretaries of the regional commissions to submit their joint recommendations in that regard to the Council at its annual organizational session.

Pursuant to Council resolution 1988/77 on the revitalization of the Council, the President, prior to the organizational session, and with the cooperation of the other members of the Bureau, will arrange for consultations with members of the Council on the draft programme of work and provisional agenda prepared by the Secretary-General and make proposals thereon for consideration by the Council.

The Council will hold elections to fill vacancies in its subsidiary bodies.
