## 4. Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

1. The Council is to take action with respect to the following bodies:

Statistical Commission (E/2004/L.1/Add.6)
Eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Two members from Asian States;
One member from Eastern European States;
Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Three members from Western European and other States.
Commission on Population and Development (E/2004/L.1/Add.6)
Fourteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States;
Three members from Asian States;
One member from Eastern European States;
Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States; 4
Four members from Western European and other States.

In addition, there remain five unfilled vacancies on the Commission as follows: two vacancies in the Asian States group for members whose terms would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2005; and one vacancy in the Asian States group, one vacancy in the Eastern European States group and one vacancy in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for members whose terms would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2007.

## Commission for Social Development (E/2004/L.1/Add.6)

Seventeen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Four members from African States;
Four members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Four members from Western European and other States.
In addition, there remains one unfilled vacancy in the Eastern European States group for a member whose term would begin on the date of election and expire at the close of the forty-sixth session of the Commission in 2008.

Sixteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Four members from African States;
Three members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Committee for Programme and Coordination (E/2004/L.1/Add.7)
Seven members are to be nominated for election by the General Assembly according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States;
Three members from Asian States;
One member from Latin American and Caribbean States.
Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (E/2004/L.1/Add.8)
Nine members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Two members from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Two members from Western European and other States.

Eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;
One member from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund (E/2004/L.1/Add.9)
Eleven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
One member from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Four members from Western European and other States.

## Executive Committee of the Programme of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees

In accordance with General Assembly resolution 58/152, the Council is to elect two additional members to the Executive Committee, thereby increasing the membership from 64 to 66 .

Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund (E/2004/L.1/Add.10)

Eleven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
One member from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Four members from Western European and other States.

Executive Board of the World Food Programme (E/2004/L.1/Add.11)
Six members are to be elected from the States included in Lists A, B, C and D contained in the annex to the above-referenced document in accordance with the following pattern:

Two members from the States included in List A;
One member from the States included in List B;

One member from the States included in List C;
Two members from the States included in List D.

International Narcotics Control Board (E/2004/L.1/Add.3, Add. 4 and Add.14)
The Council is to elect six members to the Board for a five-year term beginning on 2 March 2005. In accordance with articles 9, paragraph 1 (a) and (b), and 10 of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, one member is to be elected from a list of at least three persons nominated by the World Health Organization. The other five members are to be elected from a list of persons nominated by States Members of the United Nations and by parties to the Single Convention that are not members of the United Nations. The names of the candidates, together with their biographical information, will be before the Council.

## Programme Coordination Board of the Joint United Nations Programme on Human Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (HIV/AIDS) (UNAIDS) (E/2004/L.1/Add.12)

Eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Two members from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
One member from Eastern European States;
One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Two members from Western European and other States.

## Governing Council of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) (E/2004/L.1/Add.13)

Nineteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
Five members from African States;
Four members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Five members from Western European and other States.
2. The attention of the Council is also drawn to the following bodies which have unfilled vacancies from previous sessions:

## Intergovernmental Working Group of Experts on International Standards of Accounting and Reporting

Two vacancies in the Asian States group, two vacancies in the Latin American and Caribbean States group and three vacancies in the Western European and other States group for members whose terms would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2005;

One vacancy in the Eastern European States group and one vacancy in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for members whose terms would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2006.

## Executive Board of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women

Two vacancies in the Eastern European States group for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 2006.

## Committee for the United Nations Population Award

One vacancy in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for a member whose term would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2006.
