#### 4. Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

1. The Council is to take action with respect to the following bodies:

##### **Statistical Commission (E/2005/9)**

Eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States;

One member from Eastern European States;

One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Three members from Western European and other States.

##### **Commission on Population and Development (E/2005/9)**

Sixteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States;

Four members from Asian States;<sup>1</sup>

Two members from Eastern European States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Three members from Western European and other States.

In addition, there remains one unfilled vacancy on the Commission in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for a member whose term would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2007.

**Commission on Human Rights (E/2005/9)**

Fifteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States;

Three members from Asian States;

One member from Eastern European States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Four members from Western European and other States.

**Commission on the Status of Women (E/2005/9)**

Thirteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Five members from African States;

Five members from Asian States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States.

**Commission on Narcotic Drugs (E/2005/9)**

Twenty members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States;

Four members from Asian States;

Three members from Eastern European States;

Four members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Five members from Western European and other States.

**Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (E/2005/9)**

Twenty members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Eight members from African States;

Four members from Asian States;

Two members from Eastern European States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Three members from Western European and other States.

**Commission on Sustainable Development (E/2005/9)**

Sixteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States;

Three members from Asian States;

Two members from Eastern European States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Four members from Western European and other States.

**Committee for Programme and Coordination (E/2005/9/Add.2)**

Twenty members are to be nominated for election by the General Assembly according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States;

Four members from Asian States;

Three members from Eastern European States;

Four members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Five members from Western European and other States.

**Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals: Subcommittee of Experts on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS Subcommittee)**

The Council will be called upon to approve the application of Zambia for full membership in the Subcommittee.

**Intergovernmental Working Group of Experts on International Standards of Accounting and Reporting (E/2005/9/Add.3)**

Twenty-one members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Five members from African States;

Three members from Asian States;<sup>2</sup>

One member from Eastern European States;

Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;<sup>3</sup>

Nine members from Western European and other States.<sup>4</sup>

**Committee of Experts on Public Administration**

In accordance with its resolution 2001/45 of 20 December 2001, the Council is to consider the nomination of 24 experts by the Secretary-General who will serve on

the Committee in their personal capacity for a four-year term beginning 1 January 2006.

**Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (E/2005/9/Add.8)**

The Council will be called upon to fill a vacancy arising from the resignation of Chokila Iyer (India), whose term of office expires on 31 December 2006.

**Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund (E/2005/9/Add.4)**

Eleven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;

Two members from Asian States;

One member from Eastern European States;

Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Four members from Western European and other States.

**Executive Committee of the Programme of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees**

In accordance with General Assembly resolution 59/169 of 20 December 2004, the Council is to elect two additional members to the Executive Committee, thereby increasing the membership from 66 to 68.

**Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund (E/2005/9/Add.5)**

Eleven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;

Two members from Asian States;

One member from Eastern European States;

Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Four members from Western European and other States.

**Executive Board of the World Food Programme (E/2005/9/Add.6)**

Six members are to be elected from the States included in Lists A, B, C, D and E contained in the annex to the above-referenced document according to the following pattern:

One member from the States included in List A;

One member from the States included in List B;

One member from the States included in List C;

Two members from the States included in List D;

One member from the States included in List E.

**Programme Coordination Board of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) (E/2005/9/Add.7)**

Five members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

One member from African States;

One member from Asian States;

One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Two members from Western European and other States.

2. The attention of the Council is also drawn to the following bodies which have unfilled vacancies from previous sessions:

**Commission on Science and Technology for Development**

One postponed vacancy in the Western European and other States group for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 2008.

**Committee for the United Nations Population Award**

One postponed vacancy in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for a member whose term would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2006.

**Governing Council of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat)**

One postponed vacancy in the Asian States group and two postponed vacancies in the Latin American and Caribbean States group for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 2008.
