## **II. Annotations**

### **1. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters**

At its organizational session for 2008, the Council approved the provisional agenda for its substantive session (Council decision 2008/204).

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council decided to postpone further consideration of the application of the intergovernmental organization International Emergency Management Organization for observer status with the Council (Council decision 2007/260).

### **A. High-level segment**

#### **2. High-level segment:**

##### **(a) High-level policy dialogue with international financial and trade institutions on current developments in the world economy**

In accordance with General Assembly resolutions 48/162 and 61/16, the Council will hold a high-level policy dialogue with the executive heads of international financial and trade institutions during its high-level segment.

##### **(b) Development Cooperation Forum**

In paragraph 155 (b) of its resolution entitled “2005 World Summit Outcome” (resolution 60/1), the General Assembly mandated the Council to hold a biennial high-level Development Cooperation Forum to review trends in international

development cooperation, including strategies, policies and financing, promote greater coherence among the development activities of different development partners and strengthen the links between the normative and operational work of the United Nations.

In paragraph 5 of its resolution 61/16, the General Assembly further requested the Council to consider launching the Forum during the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2007 and to meet thereafter in New York, starting in 2008. Accordingly, the Development Cooperation Forum was launched in Geneva in July 2007 and will hold its first biennial meeting in New York in 2008.

The Development Cooperation Forum will consider an analytical background report prepared by the Secretary-General on a review of trends and progress in international development cooperation (General Assembly resolution 61/16, para. 7).

**(c) Annual ministerial review:**

**Implementing the internationally agreed goals and commitments in regard to sustainable development**

The Council will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on implementing the internationally agreed goals and commitments in regard to sustainable development for the annual ministerial review (Council decision 2007/272), pursuant to paragraph 155 of General Assembly resolution 60/1, entitled “2005 World Summit Outcome”, and paragraph 8 of Assembly resolution 61/16, on strengthening of the Council. The report will incorporate inputs from a number of relevant United Nations entities and draw upon the outcome of the global preparatory meeting of the Council, held on 6 March 2008. The report will also provide policy recommendations for consideration by the Council.

In addition, the Council will have before it the *World Economic and Social Survey 2008*, prepared pursuant to General Assembly resolutions 118 (II) and 52/180 and Council resolution 1983/50, and the relevant part of the report of the Committee for Development Policy on its tenth session (Council resolution 1998/46).

The Council will also have before it the relevant part of the report of the Secretary-General on regional cooperation (Council decision 2004/323).

**(d) Thematic discussion:**

**Promoting an integrated approach to rural development in developing countries for poverty eradication and sustainable development, taking into account current challenges**

Pursuant to paragraphs 155 and 156 of the 2005 World Summit Outcome, the General Assembly, in its resolution 61/16, decided that the Council should continue to promote global dialogue, inter alia, through strengthening existing arrangements, including a thematic discussion on a theme from economic, social and related fields to be decided by the Council and informed by a report of the Secretary-General.

Pursuant to Council decision 2008/208, the Council will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on the theme for the thematic discussion at its substantive session of 2008, entitled “Promoting an integrated approach to rural development in developing countries for poverty eradication and sustainable development, taking

into account current challenges". By adopting this theme, the Council also intends to review progress in the implementation of the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2003. The report will incorporate relevant inputs from a number of United Nations entities with the aim of providing an overview of the efforts to implement the 2003 ministerial declaration and of highlighting key challenges that have emerged since the adoption of the declaration. The report will also provide policy recommendations for consideration by the Council.

The Council will also have before it a note by the Secretary-General on the thematic discussion of the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2009.

## **B. Operational activities of the United Nations for international development cooperation segment**

### **3. Operational activities of the United Nations for international development cooperation**

#### **(a) Follow-up to policy recommendations of the General Assembly and the Council**

At its sixty-second session, in its resolution 62/208, the General Assembly:

- In paragraph 28, requested the Secretary-General to continue to broaden and improve the coverage, timeliness, reliability, quality and comparability of system-wide financial data, definitions and classifications for the financial reporting of operational activities for development of the United Nations system. It also requested the Secretary-General to build a comprehensive, sustainable and consistent financial data and reporting system for the operational activities for development of all the relevant organizations and entities of the United Nations system. The Assembly further asked the Secretary-General to include in the report to be submitted to the Council in 2008 a concise assessment of progress made and a description of planned activities.

- In paragraph 93, requested the Secretary-General to report on an annual basis to the Council at its substantive session on the functioning of the resident coordinator system, including costs and benefits.
- In paragraph 112, requested the executive boards and governing bodies of the United Nations funds, programmes and specialized agencies to assess the progress achieved, including costs and benefits, in the area of simplification and harmonization of the United Nations development system at the global, regional and country levels, analyse the potential impacts on development programming and report to the Council at its substantive session on an annual basis.
- In paragraph 141, requested the Secretary-General, after consultation with the funds, programmes and specialized agencies of the United Nations system, to submit a report to the Council, at its substantive session of 2008, on an appropriate management process, containing clear guidelines, targets, benchmarks and time frames for the full implementation of resolution 62/208, that defined results to be achieved through implementation of the resolution in a format that would allow for adequate monitoring and evaluation of the results, and interdepartmental and inter-agency measures that needed to be set in motion, for the implementation of the resolution.
- In paragraph 122 of the same resolution, the General Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Council, at its substantive session of 2008, a programme of work for the full implementation of the action called for by the Assembly under section C of the resolution, on transaction costs and efficiency, to be completed before the end of 2010, including a specific, measurable, achievable and time-bound results framework, benchmarks, responsibilities and provisions to phase out redundant rules and procedures, as well as a timetable to monitor the progress made towards meeting those targets.

At its substantive session of 1998, the Council invited the Secretary-General to arrange for the submission by the executive heads of the United Nations funds and programmes, in consultation with the United Nations Development Group, to the Council at its annual substantive session, of a concise consolidated list of issues that were central to the improved coordination of operational activities and on which the funds and programmes sought consideration by and guidance from the Council, in particular in regard to the triennial policy review, and to include in the list recommendations whenever possible (Council resolution 1998/27, para. 4).

**(b) Reports of the Executive Boards of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund, the United Nations Children's Fund and the World Food Programme**

The Council will also have before it the annual reports of the Executive Boards of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund, the United Nations Children's Fund and the World Food Programme.

The Council requested the funds and programmes, through their executive boards, to include in their annual reports to the Council: (a) a section outlining measures taken in the implementation of the provisions of the triennial policy review of operational activities; and (b) a section on the activities and measures undertaken within the designated theme of the high-level meeting of the operational activities segment (Council resolution 1994/33).

The reports include a thorough analysis of problems encountered and lessons learned, with emphasis on issues arising from the implementation of the Secretary-General's reform programme, the triennial comprehensive policy review and the follow-up to international conferences, so as to allow the Council to fulfil its coordinating role (General Assembly resolutions 48/162 and 53/192 and Council resolution 1995/51).

## C. Coordination segment

### 4. The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the substantive session of 2007 of the Council

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council decided that the coordination segment of the substantive session of 2008 of the Council would focus on the role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the substantive session of the Council of 2007 (Council decision 2007/261).

Also at its substantive session of 2007, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on the role of the Council in the integrated and coordinated implementation of the outcomes of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits, in the light of relevant General Assembly resolutions,<sup>2</sup> including resolution 61/16, which should also adequately reflect the work of the functional commissions in 2008, including actions taken to follow up Council resolution 2007/29, for consideration by the Council at its substantive session of 2008.

At its sixty-second session, the General Assembly reaffirmed its request to the Council to oversee the system-wide follow-up to the Geneva and Tunis outcomes of the World Summit on the Information Society, and requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its sixty-third session, through the Council, a report for the Commission on Science and Technology for Development, as mandated by the Council in its resolution 2006/46, on the status of the implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the Summit (General Assembly resolution 62/182).

## D. Humanitarian affairs segment

### 5. Special economic, humanitarian and disaster relief assistance

At its resumed organizational session for 2008, the Council decided that the theme of the humanitarian affairs segment of its substantive session of 2008 would be “Building capabilities and capacities at all levels for timely humanitarian assistance, including disaster risk reduction”.

In its resolution 62/94, the General Assembly encouraged Member States to continue to strengthen cooperation and coordination between the Assembly and the Council on humanitarian issues, based on their respective mandates and taking into account comparative advantages and existing complementarities of the two bodies, and requested the Secretary-General to report to the Assembly at its sixty-third session, through the Council at its substantive session of 2008, on progress made in strengthening the coordination of emergency humanitarian assistance of the United Nations and to submit a report to the Assembly on the independent review of the Central Emergency Response Fund in 2008 (see also Council resolution 2007/3).

In accordance with Council resolution 1983/46, the Secretary-General orally appraises the Council annually on the status of the assistance to the drought-stricken areas of Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, the Sudan and Uganda.

#### **6. Implementation of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits**

##### **(a) Follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development**

The General Assembly, in its resolution 58/230, requested the President of the Council to enhance the Council's interactions through regular exchanges with the Bretton Woods institutions, the World Trade Organization and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development on organizational matters related to the follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development, within the context of the preparations for the high-level meeting with these institutions (New York, 14 April 2008), bearing in mind General Assembly resolutions 57/270 B and Council resolution 2003/47, and to report thereon to the Council (see also Council resolution 2007/30).

The Council, at its substantive session of 2007, in its resolution 2007/31, requested the Secretary-General to submit an analytical and results-oriented annual progress report on the further implementation of the Programme of Action for the Least Developed Countries for the Decade 2001-2010. The report is submitted to the General Assembly, through the Council, in response to paragraph 111 of the Programme of Action (Assembly resolution 62/203 and Council decision 2001/320).

**(b) Proposed strategic framework for the period 2010-2011**

In accordance with rule 31 of the rules of procedure of the Council, the Secretary-General will circulate the proposed strategic framework for the period 2010-2011 covering activities in the economic, social and human rights fields. The Council will consider the relevant sections of the proposed strategic framework for the period 2010-2011 (Council resolution 1988/77 and General Assembly resolution 58/269).

**(c) International cooperation in the field of informatics**

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council requested the President of the Council to convene the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Informatics for one more year to enable it to carry out, from within existing resources, the due fulfilment of the provisions of the Council's resolutions on the item. The Council also requested the Secretary-General to report to the Council at its substantive session of 2008 on action taken to follow up the need to harmonize and improve United Nations informatics systems for optimal utilization and accessibility by all States, including the findings of the Working Group and an assessment of its work and mandate (Council resolution 2007/14).

The Council also decided that the work of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group would be reviewed at its substantive session of 2008, with a view to considering whether to continue its mandate, based on the Council's consideration of the report and the situation then prevailing in Haiti (Council resolution 2007/13).

**(e) Mainstreaming a gender perspective into all policies and programmes in the United Nations system**

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its substantive session of 2008 a detailed report on the implementation of paragraph 4 of Council resolution 2006/36 and on progress made in the implementation of mainstreaming a gender perspective into all policies and programmes in the United Nations system (Council resolutions 2006/9 and 2007/33).

At its sixty-second session, the General Assembly encouraged the Council to continue its efforts to ensure that gender mainstreaming is an integral part of its work and that of its subsidiary bodies, through, inter alia, implementation of its agreed conclusions 1997/2 and its resolution 2004/4, and welcomed the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the Council's substantive session of 2007, which, inter alia, reaffirmed that gender equality and the promotion and protection of the full enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms for all were essential to eradicating poverty and hunger. The General Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to continue to report annually to the Assembly under the item entitled "Advancement of women", as well as to the Commission on the Status of Women and the Council, on the follow-up to and progress made in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcome of the twenty-third special session, with an assessment of progress in gender mainstreaming, including information on key achievements, lessons learned and good practices, and recommendations on further measures to enhance implementation (General Assembly resolution 62/137) (see also under item 14 (a)).

**(f) Ad hoc advisory groups on African countries emerging from conflict**

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council decided to extend the mandate of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Guinea-Bissau until its substantive session of 2008, unless the Council decided on an earlier review of the mandate, and requested the Group to report to it, as appropriate (Council resolution 2007/15).

**(g) Tobacco or health**

At its substantive session of 2006, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on the work of the Ad Hoc Inter-Agency Task Force on Tobacco Control to the Council at its substantive session of 2008 (Council decision 2006/248).

Also at its substantive session of 2006, the Council recommended that the General Assembly, at its sixty-first session, consider the implementation of a complete ban on smoking at all United Nations indoor premises, at Headquarters as well as at regional and country offices throughout the United Nations system, and the implementation of a complete ban on sales of tobacco products at all United Nations premises. The Council also recommended that the Assembly request the Secretary-General to submit a report on the implementation of Council resolution 2006/42, on smoke-free United Nations premises, to the Council at its substantive session of 2008, and decided to continue its consideration of the agenda item entitled "Tobacco or health" at its substantive session of 2008 (Council resolution 2006/42).

**8. Implementation of General Assembly resolutions 50/227, 52/12 B, 57/270 B and 60/265, including 61/16**

At its substantive session of 2007, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on the role of the Council in the integrated and coordinated implementation of the outcomes of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits, in the light of relevant General Assembly resolutions,<sup>2</sup> including resolution 61/16, which should also adequately reflect the work of the functional commissions in 2008, including actions taken to follow up Council resolution 2007/29, for consideration by the Council at its substantive session of 2008 (Council resolution 2007/29).

*Assistance to the Palestinian people.* At its sixty-third session, in 1977, the Council requested the Secretary-General to submit to it annual reports on the question of assistance to the Palestinian people (Council resolution 2100 (LXIII)).

The General Assembly, in its resolution 62/93 on assistance to the Palestinian people, requested the Secretary-General to submit a report to the Assembly at its sixty-third session, through the Council, on the implementation of that resolution.

*Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations.* The Council, at its substantive session of 2007, in its resolution 2007/25 on support to Non-Self-Governing Territories by the specialized agencies and international institutions associated with the United Nations, requested the President of the Council to continue to maintain close contact with the Chairman of the Special Committee and to report thereon to the Council. The Council also requested the Secretary-General to follow up on the implementation of resolution 2007/25, paying particular attention to cooperation and integration arrangements for maximizing the efficiency of the assistance activities undertaken by various organizations of the United Nations system, and to report thereon to the Council at its substantive session of 2008 (see also General Assembly resolution 62/114).

### **15. United Nations research and training institutes**
