Addendum

1. At its 10th plenary meeting, on 25 April 2007, the Economic and Social Council, inter alia, elected eight members to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2008 (see Council decision 2007/201 B).
2. In a letter dated 31 March 2008, the Secretariat informed Governments that one elected member of the Permanent Forum, Ms. Xiaomei Qin (China), would vacate her seat on 31 December 2008 and requested States Members of the United Nations that are members of the Group of Asian States to present their nominations by 2 May 2008 to fill the seat.
3. Accordingly, the Secretariat has received nominations from the Governments of Fiji and the Philippines to fill that seat on the Permanent Forum. The term of office would begin on 1 January 2009 and expire on 31 December 2010.
