In the absence of Mr. Mérorès (Haiti), Mr. Lima (Cape Verde), Vice-President, took the Chair.

The meeting was called to order at 3.15 p.m.

The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the substantive session of 2007 of the Council (continued) (E/2008/21; E/2008/L.22 and L.29)

Draft resolution entitled "The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration on strengthening efforts to eradicate poverty and hunger, including through the global partnership for development, adopted at the high-level segment of the substantive session of 2007 of the Economic and Social Council" (E/2008/L.22)

- 1. **The President** drew attention to draft resolution E/2008/L.22 entitled "The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration on strengthening efforts to eradicate poverty and hunger, including through the global partnership for development, adopted at the high-level segment of the substantive session of 2007 of the Economic and Social Council" and noted that it contained no programme budget implications.
- 2. **Ms. Pliner** (Secretary of the Council) said that a comma should have been inserted after the word "development" in paragraph 9.
- 3. Draft resolution E/2008/L.22, as orally corrected, was adopted.
- Mr. Delacroix (France), speaking on behalf of the European Union, said that the European Union attached great importance to the attainment of all the Millennium Development Goals; the fact that those Goals were interdependent required an integrated approach. The United Nations system must therefore adopt a multidimensional approach when tackling poverty and hunger. In that connection, the resolution should have mentioned, in addition to science and technology, the need for sustained economic growth, the importance of taking into account the three pillars of sustainable development, the promotion of full productive employment, the achievement of decent work for all, the need to develop social services, and the promotion of gender equality and empowerment of women.
- 5. Furthermore, the European Union understood paragraph 6 of the resolution to refer to coordination among the funds, programmes and agencies of the United Nations in their development activities, within

their mandates and on the basis of existing texts. Lastly, the implementation of the global partnership for development required first and foremost the engagement of all Member States, in partnership with civil society, non-governmental organizations and the private sector. The United Nations system's role was simply to support the action of Member States.

Draft resolution entitled "Role of the Economic and Social Council in the integrated and coordinated implementation of the outcomes of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits, in light of relevant General Assembly resolutions, including resolution 61/16" (E/2008/L.29)

- 6. **The President** drew attention to draft resolution E/2008/L.29 entitled "Role of the Economic and Social Council in the integrated and coordinated implementation of the outcomes of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits, in light of relevant General Assembly resolutions, including resolution 61/16" and noted that it contained no programme budget implications.
- 7. Draft resolution E/2008/L.29 was adopted.

Oral decision

- 8. **The President** suggested that the Council take note of the report of the Secretary-General on the role of the United Nations system in implementing the Ministerial Declaration of the high-level segment of the 2007 substantive session of the Economic and Social Council (E/2008/21).
- 9. It was so decided.

Economic and social repercussions of the Israeli occupation on the living conditions of the Palestinian people in the occupied Palestinian territory, including Jerusalem, and the Arab population in the occupied Syrian Golan (continued) (E/2008/13; E/2008/L.26)

Draft resolution entitled "Economic and social repercussions of the Israeli occupation on the living conditions of the Palestinian people in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, and the Arab population in the occupied Syrian Golan" (E/2008/L.26)

10. **Mr. Benfreha** (Algeria), introducing draft resolution E/2008/L.26 entitled "Economic and social repercussions of the Israeli occupation on the living conditions of the Palestinian people in the Occupied

Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, and the Arab population in the occupied Syrian Golan", said that South Africa had joined the sponsors. The word "mother" should be inserted before the word "homeland" in paragraph 12 of the draft resolution.

- 11. As noted in the report prepared by the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia on the same subject (E/2008/13), the Israeli occupation of the Palestinian territory and Syrian Golan continued to intensify the economic and social hardship of the Palestinian and Syrian people. The report painted a bleak picture of high unemployment, rampant poverty and rising health-related problems among the Palestinian population, particularly in the Gaza Strip and confirmed that illegal Israeli settlements, the confiscation and destruction of Palestinian land and the unlawful construction of the wall in the occupied Palestinian territory, including East Jerusalem, continued to have negative repercussions on Palestinian people's living conditions. Indeed, such illegal policies curtailed normal economic and social life, and fuelled and prolonged the conflict. The report also documented the continued negative impact of Israeli settlements in the occupied Syrian Golan on the Syrian people's access to their natural resources and social services, and the threat posed by Israeli landmines to Syrian Arab villagers in the occupied Syrian Golan.
- 12. The draft resolution was very similar to the resolution adopted the previous year. In addition, it expressed grave concern about the continuation of settlement activities and other related measures in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, as well as in the occupied Syrian Golan; stressed the importance of national unity among the Palestinian people, and emphasized the need for the respect and preservation of the territorial integrity and unity of the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem; and called upon Israel to comply with the provisions of the Fourth Geneva Convention, and to facilitate the visits of Syrian citizens of the occupied Syrian Golan whose family members resided in their homeland, the Syrian Arab Republic, via the Qunaitra entrance.
- 13. He hoped that the draft resolution would be adopted by consensus and that it might help alleviate the misery and untold suffering of the Palestinian civilian population living under Israel's 41-year-old occupation.

14. **The President** said that Indonesia, Malaysia and Mauritania had become sponsors of the draft resolution and that action would be taken thereon at a later stage.
