B. Operational activities segment

3. Operational activities of the United Nations for international development cooperation

The Council, in its decision 2011/215, decided to defer its consideration of the report of the High-level Committee on South-South Cooperation on its seventeenth session to a session of the Council in 2012.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 66/219, decided to hold the seventeenth session of the High-level Committee on South-South Cooperation from 22 to 25 May 2012, preceded by an organizational meeting on 3 May 2012 to elect the President and Bureau of the seventeenth session of the High-level Committee.

(a) Follow-up to policy recommendations of the General Assembly and the Council

The General Assembly, in its resolution 63/232, requested the Secretary-General to report, in the context of his annual report on the implementation of resolution 62/208, on measures taken in response to paragraph 16 of resolution 63/232, bearing in mind the provisions of that resolution, and including feedback from Member States on ways to achieve the aims contained therein, and decided to change the comprehensive policy review of operational activities from a triennial to a quadrennial cycle in order to better provide policy guidance to the United Nations funds and programmes and the specialized agencies, and in that regard decided to hold its next comprehensive policy review in 2012 and subsequent reviews on a quadrennial basis.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 64/289, requested the Secretary-General to include information on all existing multi-donor trust funds and thematic trust funds, including information on their mandates, performance and governance structures, in the annual report on financial statistics to the Economic and Social Council, with a view to further improving the participation of Member States in their governance, and also requested that future reporting on funding for the United Nations development system more clearly distinguish between funding for development and funding for humanitarian activities, and better differentiate self-supporting contributions from other non-core funding flows.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 64/220, requested the Secretary-General to postpone to its sixty-seventh session the submission, through the Economic and Social Council, of the comprehensive analysis of the implementation of Assembly resolution 62/208 to be prepared in accordance with the guidance contained in paragraph 143 thereof.

The Council, in its resolution 2011/7, requested the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly, through the Council, a comprehensive report on the analysis of the implementation of Assembly resolution 62/208 and a report on the analysis of funding of operational activities for development, as well as to submit directly to the Assembly a report with recommendations for the quadrennial comprehensive policy review. The Council also requested the Secretary-General to pay particular attention to a number of issues, in the report for the 2012 quadrennial comprehensive policy review of operational activities for development of the United Nations system, including taking into consideration the findings of the independent evaluation of “Delivering as one” as well as the reports of the country-led evaluations.

The Council will have before it the annual reports of the Executive Boards of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund/United Nations Office for Project Services, the United Nations Children's Fund, the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, and the World Food Programme (General Assembly resolutions 48/162, annex, 62/208 and 64/289, and Council resolutions 1995/51 and 2010/23).

The Council requested the funds and programmes, through their executive boards, to include in their annual reports to the Council: (a) a section outlining measures taken in the implementation of the provisions of the quadrennial policy review of operational activities; and (b) a section on the activities and measures undertaken within the designated theme of the high-level meeting of the operational activities segment (General Assembly resolutions 62/208, 63/232 and 64/289, and Council resolutions 1994/33 and 2010/23).

The reports include a thorough analysis of problems encountered and lessons learned, with emphasis on issues arising from the implementation of the reform programme of the Secretary-General, the comprehensive policy review and the follow-up to international conferences, so as to allow the Council to fulfil its coordinating role (General Assembly resolution 48/162, annex, 53/192, 62/208 and 65/176, and Council resolutions 1995/51 and 2010/23).

C. Coordination segment

4. The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the 2011 substantive session of the Economic and Social Council

The Council, in paragraph 10 of its resolution 2008/29, requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on measures taken to implement the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the Council for consideration by the Council at the coordination segment of its substantive session of the following year.

The Council, in paragraph 10 of its resolution 2009/29, requested the Secretary-General to prepare, taking into account the views of Member States, a report on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits, in the light of relevant General Assembly resolutions,² including resolution 61/16, which should additionally include recommendations on the periodicity of future reports, and to submit the report for consideration at its 2010 substantive session. In its decision 2010/252, the Council took note of the report of the Secretary-General on the role of the Council in that matter (A/65/84-E/2010/90), and decided that the scope and periodicity of future reports of the Secretary-General on the subject should be reviewed in connection with the review by the Assembly of the implementation of resolution 61/16. The Assembly did not take a decision on the matter. At its substantive session of 2011, the Council, in its decision 2011/216, decided to request that the Secretary-General prepare a note containing recommendations on the periodicity and scope of future reports on the topic for consideration at its substantive session of 2012.

6. Implementation of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences and summits

(a) Follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development

The Council's attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 66/191, in which the Assembly requested the President of the Economic and Social Council to organize a special event on innovative mechanisms of financing for development with the participation of relevant stakeholders during the substantive session of 2012 of the Council.

In its resolution 2011/38, the Council stressed the need to further improve the dialogue between Member States and representatives of the Bretton Woods institutions, the World Trade Organization and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development during the special high-level meeting of the Council, as part

of a forum for multi-stakeholder dialogue, and requested the President of the Council to seek a more interactive, dynamic and substantive discussion on key issues related to the financing for development framework. It also welcomed the efforts undertaken to give more prominence to the consideration of the agenda item on financing for development during the annual substantive session of the Council, including the allocation of the item to its coordination segment. In this connection, the Council stressed its resolve to continue improving those modalities in accordance with its resolutions 2009/30 and 2010/26.

In its resolution 2011/37, the Council requested the Secretary-General, in coordination with the International Labour Organization, to assess and review job-intensive investment and strategies and to report to the Council at its substantive session of 2012, with a view to supporting job creation and promoting sustained, inclusive and equitable economic growth. In its decision 2011/208, the Council decided that the theme of its 2012 annual ministerial review would be “Promoting productive capacity, employment and decent work to eradicate poverty in the context of inclusive, sustainable and equitable economic growth at all levels for achieving the Millennium Development Goals”. The report of the Secretary-General on the theme of the annual ministerial review provides a review and assessment of the strategies followed and progress achieved in the Global Jobs Pact in supporting job creation and promoting sustained, inclusive and equitable economic growth, as requested by the Council in its resolution 2011/37.

D. Humanitarian affairs segment

5. Special economic, humanitarian and disaster relief assistance

At its organizational session for 2012, the Council decided that the theme of the humanitarian affairs segment for its substantive session of 2012 would be “Working in partnership to strengthen coordination of humanitarian assistance in a changing world” [to be adopted at the resumed organizational session on 26-27 April 2012] (General Assembly resolution 52/12 B and Council decisions 1999/208 and 2012/___).

In its resolution 66/119, the General Assembly requested the Emergency Relief Coordinator to continue her efforts to strengthen the coordination and accountability of humanitarian assistance and leadership within the United Nations humanitarian response system and called upon relevant United Nations organizations and other relevant intergovernmental organizations, as well as other humanitarian and development actors, to continue to work with the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs of the Secretariat to enhance the coordination, effectiveness and efficiency of humanitarian assistance.

The General Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to continue strengthening the support provided to United Nations resident/humanitarian coordinators and to United Nations country teams, including by providing necessary

training, identifying resources and improving the identification of and the selection process for United Nations resident/humanitarian coordinators, and enhancing their performance accountability, and to report on actions taken to enable the United Nations to continue to strengthen its ability to recruit and deploy staff quickly and flexibly, to procure emergency relief materials and services rapidly, cost-effectively and locally, where applicable, and to quickly disburse funds in order to support Governments and United Nations country teams in the coordination of international humanitarian assistance. The Assembly further requested the Secretary-General to report to it at its sixty-seventh session, through the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session of 2012, on progress made in strengthening the coordination of emergency humanitarian assistance of the United Nations and to submit a report to the Assembly on the detailed use of the Central Emergency Response Fund (see also Council resolution 2011/8).

The Council, in paragraph 10 of its resolution 2009/29, requested the Secretary-General to prepare, taking into account the views of Member States, a report on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits, in the light of relevant General Assembly resolutions,² including resolution 61/16, which should additionally include recommendations on the periodicity of future reports, and to submit the report for consideration at its substantive session of 2010. In its decision 2010/252, the Council took note of the report of the Secretary-General on the role of the Council in that matter (A/65/84-E/2010/90), and decided that the scope and periodicity of future reports of the Secretary-General on the subject should be reviewed in connection with the review by the Assembly of the implementation of resolution 61/16. The Assembly did not take a decision on the matter. At its substantive session of 2011, the Council, in its decision 2011/216, requested the Secretary-General to prepare a note containing recommendations on the periodicity and scope of future reports on the topic for consideration at its substantive session of 2012.

In its decision 2011/217, the Council invited the Chair of the Committee on World Food Security to transmit to the Council annually, starting in 2012, a report on the main decisions and policy recommendations made as well as the results achieved by the Committee in the area of food security and nutrition, in accordance with its new roles and vision.

(d) Mainstreaming a gender perspective into all policies and programmes in the United Nations system

The General Assembly, in its resolution 62/137, requested the Secretary-General to continue to report annually on the follow-up to and progress made in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcomes of the twenty-third special session, with an assessment of progress in gender mainstreaming, including information on key achievements, lessons learned and good practices, and recommendations on further measures to enhance implementation.

At its substantive session of 2011, the Council, in its resolution 2011/6, requested the Secretary-General to submit, at its substantive session of 2012, a report on the implementation of the resolution, with particular emphasis on progress in promoting system-wide accountability on gender equality and the empowerment of women at both the global and country levels.

(e) Long-term programme of support for Haiti

At its substantive session of 2010, the Council, in its resolution 2010/28, decided to extend the mandate of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Haiti until the substantive session of the Council in 2012, with the purpose of closely following and providing advice on Haiti's long-term development strategy to promote post-disaster socio-economic recovery, stability and reconstruction, with particular attention to the need to ensure coherence and sustainability in international support for Haiti, based on the long-term national development priorities, as contained in the Government's Action Plan for the Reconstruction and National Development of Haiti, and stressed the need to avoid overlap and duplication with respect to existing mechanisms.

The Council, in its decision 2011/268, requested the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Haiti to report on its activities in support of the recovery, reconstruction and development of the country, with recommendations, as appropriate, to the Council for its consideration at its substantive session of 2012.

At its substantive session of 2011, the Council, in its resolution 2011/43, requested the Secretary-General to report, at its substantive session of 2012, on how the United Nations development system was implementing integrated, coherent and coordinated support to South Sudan, consistent with national priorities while ensuring clarity of roles and responsibilities in the implementation of United Nations operational activities.

In the same resolution, the Council also requested the Secretary-General to report on the work of the Ad Hoc Inter-Agency Task Force on Tobacco Control at its substantive session of 2012.

The Council also requested the President to report to it thereon. In addition, the Council requested the Secretary-General to follow up on the implementation of the resolution, paying particular attention to cooperation and integration arrangements for maximizing the efficiency of the assistance activities undertaken by various organizations of the United Nations system and to report thereon to the Council at its substantive session of 2012.
