The Czech Republic is dedicated to the improvement of the situation of refugees through international and regional cooperation, as well as cooperation at the national level. The Czech Republic has demonstrated a strong interest in and devotion to the solution of the problems of refugees, internally displaced persons and stateless persons both internationally and nationally.

The Czech Republic is ready to cooperate fully with all members of the Executive Committee in order to find constructive solutions to the challenges facing the Programme of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

To this end, the Government of the Czech Republic hopes that the Economic and Social Council will give favourable consideration to this request and make a recommendation to the General Assembly to enlarge the membership of the Executive Committee.
