Non-governmental organizations**Report of the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations on
its 2016 resumed session****(New York, 23 May-1 June and 10 June 2016)***Summary*

At its 2016 resumed session, held from 23 May to 1 June and on 10 June 2016, the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations had before it 464 applications for consultative status, including applications deferred from earlier sessions. Of the non-governmental organizations submitting those applications, the Committee recommended 188 for consultative status, deferred 235 for further consideration at its regular session in 2017 and closed consideration without prejudice of 39 applications that had failed to respond to queries over two consecutive sessions. The Committee also had before it seven requests for reclassification of consultative status: it recommended granting four of the requests; deferred its consideration of two; and closed without prejudice consideration of one request. The Committee took note of 15 requests for a change of name. It also had before it 426 quadrennial reports, of which it took note of 336. The Committee heard 20 representatives of the 64 non-governmental organizations that attended the session.

The present report contains eight draft decisions on matters calling for action by the Economic and Social Council.

By draft decision I, the Council would:

- (a) Grant consultative status to 188 non-governmental organizations;
- (b) Reclassify the consultative status of four non-governmental organizations;
- (c) Note that the Committee decided to take note of the change of name of 15 non-governmental organizations;

(d) Note that the Committee took note of the quadrennial reports of 335 non-governmental organizations, including new and deferred reports;^a

(e) Close without prejudice consideration of the request for consultative status made by 39 non-governmental organizations after the organizations had failed to respond to queries over the course of two consecutive sessions;

(f) Close without prejudice consideration of the request for reclassification of status by one non-governmental organization following the failure of the organization to respond to queries over the course of two consecutive sessions;

(g) Decide not to grant consultative status to the non-governmental organization Committee to Protect Journalists;

(h) Decide not to grant consultative status to the non-governmental organization Youth Coalition for Sexual and Reproductive Rights.

By draft decision II, the Council would decide to withdraw the status of the non-governmental organization Human Lactation Center.

By draft decision III, the Council would suspend, for a period of one year, the consultative status of 158 organizations with outstanding quadrennial reports.

By draft decision IV, the Council would decide to reinstate the consultative status of 81 organizations that had submitted their outstanding quadrennial reports.

By draft decision V, the Council would decide to withdraw the consultative status of 85 organizations with continued outstanding quadrennial reports.

By draft decision VI, the Council would approve the provisional agenda for the 2017 session of the Committee.

By draft decision VII, the Council would take note of the present report.

II. Applications for consultative status, requests for reclassification and quadrennial reports received from non-governmental organizations

The Committee considered item 3 (a) and (b) of its agenda, Applications for consultative status and requests for reclassification deferred from previous sessions of the Committee, and New applications for consultative status and new requests for reclassification, at its 17th through 30th meetings, held from 23 May to 1 June and on 10 June 2016. It had before it the following documents:

A. Applications for consultative status and requests for reclassification deferred from previous sessions of the Committee

2. The Committee considered item 3 (a) of its agenda, Applications for consultative status and requests for reclassification deferred from its previous sessions, at its 21st through 28th meetings, held from 25 to 31 May 2016. The Committee considered a total of 245 deferred applications for consultative status.

Committee to Protect Journalists

5. At its 23rd meeting, on 26 May, the Committee considered the application of the non-governmental organization Committee to Protect Journalists.

6. In reviewing the questions posed to the organization at the question and answer session on 24 May, the representative of South Africa stated that the non-governmental organization had not responded clearly to a question regarding the organization's position on the pertinent provisions of article 20 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and requested further clarification on it.

7. The representative of the United States of America noted the critical role that a free press plays in ensuring an open and secure society and in holding Governments accountable, as enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. She stated that the members of the Committee should accredit non-governmental organizations that report on those issues, especially given the global crackdown on civic space, and that the Committee to Protect Journalists was a reputable non-governmental organization that promoted press freedom worldwide and defended the right of journalists. She argued that in recognition of that principle, the Committee should have already accredited the organization. Since that had not happened in seven sessions, she had called for a vote to grant consultative status to the organization under rule 59 of the rules of procedure of the Council.

8. In support of the statement by the representative of the United States, the representative of Greece stated that the safety of journalists was an important issue that had been dealt with in the General Assembly, the Human Rights Council and the Security Council, and that the international community was united in fighting attacks and violence against journalists. He therefore stated that his delegation would vote in favour of granting consultative status to the non-governmental organization and urged the Committee to do the same, given the organization's 35 years of experience and contributions to many United Nations activities.

9. The representative of South Africa took the floor to state that his country shared broadly with the statement by the representative of the United States and reminded the Committee that his country and Austria had initiated the resolution for the protection of journalists in the Human Rights Council in 2011. However, he nevertheless objected to the response from the Committee to Protect Journalists, stating that the non-governmental organization had not responded adequately to the

issue regarding incitement to hatred under article 20 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, and that his delegation would therefore not support the accreditation of the organization.

10. The representative of the Russian Federation added his concerns regarding the Committee to Protect Journalists, stating that the non-governmental organization condemned human rights violations only in countries that were not allies of the United States and that since that raised doubts as to whether it was a genuine non-governmental organization, in the view of the Russian Federation the organization did not merit consultative status with the Council.

11. The representative of Pakistan agreed that the protection of journalists was an issue worldwide. He also supported the statement by the representative of South Africa on maintaining a balance between freedom of expression and respecting limits to that freedom, pursuant to article 20 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. He therefore argued that there was room for further questions. The representative of the Sudan concurred with the statements made by the delegations of South Africa and the Russian Federation and with their concerns about the non-governmental organization, and urged the members of the Committee to vote against granting it consultative status.

12. Following the statements, a vote was called to grant special consultative status to the Committee to Protect Journalists. The proposal to grant consultative status to the non-governmental organization was rejected by a roll-call vote of 10 to 6, with 3 abstentions. All of the 19 members of the Committee were present and voting. The voting was as follows:

In favour:

Greece, Guinea, Israel, Mauritania, United States of America, Uruguay

Against:

Azerbaijan, Burundi, China, Cuba, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Russian Federation, South Africa, Sudan, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)

Abstaining:

India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Turkey

13. Following the vote, the representative of the United States stated that in September 2015 the global community came together to agree on universal Sustainable Development Goals but that it would not be possible to achieve those goals without a robust, free and independent civil society engagement. She added that the role of non-governmental organizations emerged as critical at the recent World Humanitarian Summit. She concluded that this Committee should therefore have shown greater respect for civil society access to the United Nations, and expressed disappointment that that did not happen.

Youth Coalition for Sexual and Reproductive Rights

14. At its 25th meeting on 27 May, the Committee considered the application of the non-governmental organization Youth Coalition for Sexual and Reproductive Rights. The observer for Canada took the floor in support of the application, saying that organization was a well-known organization in excellent standing, composed of dedicated and hardworking young people who were passionate about the issues they faced in today's world. Therefore, in order to invest in young people and their

agenda, as also emphasized by the Secretary-General during his visit to Canada in February 2016, and to treat each applicant non-governmental organization equally in accordance with Council resolution 1996/31, he called on the Committee to grant consultative status to the organization. Following his statement, the Chair asked the members of the Committee whether they wished to grant special consultative status to the non-governmental organization, and since he saw no objection, he gavelled the decision to grant it special status. Immediately thereafter, following the recognition by the Chair, the representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran stated that he had asked for the floor before the Chair had gavelled the decision, and proceeded to pose questions to the organization. The Chair explained that he had not seen the request of the Islamic Republic of Iran on his screen and asked the Committee whether they agreed that the Islamic Republic of Iran had wished to speak before the Chair's decision.

15. The United States emphasized the fact that the Committee always accepted the Chair's decision once gavelled and that, under the rules of procedure of the Council, once a decision had been gavelled, the Committee had to respect the decision. This was following the rules of procedures of the Committee.

16. The representative of the Russian Federation, supported by the representatives of Mauritania and Nicaragua, stated that the questions from the representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran should be taken into account and a vote could be called on the substance of the application rather than on the procedure, which was related to a technical problem. He stated that the Committee should show its good will as it had done before. The representatives of the United States, Greece and Israel emphasized the importance of respecting the rules of procedure.

17. The Chair explained that, according to rule 43 of the rules of procedure, the appeal would need to be put to a vote. Given the lack of consensus among member States, the Russian Federation appealed to the Chair and requested a vote to overturn the Chair's ruling.

18. The appeal against the ruling of the Chair was adopted by a roll-call vote of 10 to 5, with 1 abstention. Of the 19 members of the Committee, 15 were present and voting. The voting was as follows:

In favour:

China, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Mauritania, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Russian Federation, South Africa, Sudan, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)

Against:

Greece, Israel, Turkey, United States of America, Uruguay

Abstaining:

Azerbaijan

Absent:

Burundi, Cuba, Guinea

19. Following the vote, the representative of the United States noted that it had been more than five years since the organization had submitted its application and that giving a voice to the youth in the context of sexual and reproductive health was particularly important since, according to the World Health Organization, pregnancy and childbirth complications were the second highest cause of death in adolescent girls globally, and especially in developing countries. The representative then called

for a vote on the application pursuant to rule 59 of the rules of procedure of the Council.

20. Statements were made before the vote by some member States. The Russian Federation pointed out that during the past five years his delegation had not asked a single question of the organization, but that he nevertheless supported the right of other member States to ask any questions they wished, and therefore supported the right of the Islamic Republic of Iran to pose additional questions. The representative of Nicaragua expressed regret about resorting to a vote, explaining that at no time did her delegation want to go against the ruling of the Chair but that there was no other choice in the matter.

21. The representative of Greece expressed strong support for the non-governmental organization, concurring with the statement by the United States, saying that the NGO had been deferred for many years and that after providing adequate answers to all the questions that had been posed to it over the years, his country would be voting in favour of this organization. The representative of India expressed regret that the Chair's decision had been put to a vote regarding this particular application and explained that his country's decision to vote in favour of the reversal of the decision was guided by the fact that the situation was unclear and that the request of the representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran should be considered.

22. Following these statements, a vote was called to grant consultative status to the organization. The proposal to grant consultative status to the non-governmental organization was rejected by a roll-call vote of 6 to 5, with 4 abstentions. Of the 19 members of the Committee, 11 were present and voting. The voting was as follows:

In favour:

Greece, Israel, Turkey, Uruguay, United States of America

Against:

China, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Nicaragua, Pakistan, Russian Federation, Sudan

Abstaining:

Azerbaijan, India, Mauritania, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)

Absent:

Burundi, Cuba, Guinea, South Africa

Congrès national des Arméniens occidentaux

23. At its 27th meeting, on 31 May, the Committee considered the application of the non-governmental organization Congrès national des Arméniens occidentaux.

24. At the same meeting, the representative of Turkey posed questions to the organization, which were followed by a statement by the observer for Armenia. In his statement, the representative pointed out that in its several sessions since 2013, the Committee had deferred the consideration of two Armenian diaspora organizations owing to persistent questions by two members of the Committee, which ultimately compelled one of the organizations to relinquish further attempts to obtain consultative status with the Council.

25. In response, the representative of Turkey stated that, as a strong supporter of non-governmental organizations in the work of the United Nations, Turkey had always pursued an impartial approach towards the applications of non-governmental organizations for consultative status. Highlighting that the Committee, when assessing the compliance of the non-governmental organizations with the Charter of the United Nations and decision 1996/31, had every right to seek further clarification, she emphasized that many Armenian organizations had been recommended for consultative status by the Committee. The representative of Azerbaijan seconded the statement, adding that Committee members had performed their duties in an impartial manner and that member States had a right to seek clarification from organizations. The Committee decided to defer its consideration of the application.

Society without Violence Non-Governmental Organization

26. At its 29th meeting, on 1 June, the Committee considered the application of the non-governmental organization Society without Violence Non-Governmental Organization.

27. The representative of Azerbaijan requested further information about the organization's rapid response unit. The observer for Armenia then asked for the floor, but the representative of Azerbaijan expressed his objection to the request. Owing to a lack of consensus within the Committee on the request, the Chair announced that observer States would be given the floor before the end of the session, once the Committee had concluded its work.

28. The observer for Armenia was given the floor at the Committee's 29th meeting, on 1 June. The observer stated that all Member States should be given the floor to address the Committee, as necessary, further stating that the representative of Azerbaijan had distorted the facts about the work of the Armenian non-governmental organizations because the questions posed to them were politically motivated. The Committee decided to defer its consideration of the application.

Sheikh Eid Bin Mohammad Al Thani Charitable Association

29. At its 24th meeting, on 26 May, the Committee considered the application of the non-governmental organization Sheikh Eid Bin Mohammad Al Thani Charitable Association.

30. The representative of the Sudan expressed support for the organization's application and called on the Committee to grant the organization consultative status, underlining the valuable contribution the organization had made in providing emergency relief to people affected by natural disasters and conflicts, and its work in promoting educational and cultural programmes, and in view of the fact that the application had been before the Committee for four years. The representative of Mauritania expressed his support for the request of the Sudan.

31. The representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran underscored the need to provide equal treatment to all organizations and requested the non-governmental organization to provide details on its upcoming activities, particularly in view of its alleged funding to terrorists groups.

32. The observer for the Syrian Arab Republic stated that the non-governmental organization was concealing its terrorist activities in the guise of charitable actions,

expressing concern over the alleged contribution of \$10 million made by this organization to the Al-Nusra Front, Da'esh and other terrorist organizations.

33. The observer for Qatar stated that this organization was one of the best organizations in the Middle East, noting that since its creation in 1996 it had engaged in development, humanitarian and educational activities at the national, regional and international level. The Committee decided to defer consideration of this application.

Crisis Management Initiative

34. At its 19th meeting, on 24 May, the Committee considered the non-governmental organization Crisis Management Initiative. The representative of South Africa expressed appreciation for the mandate and the important work carried out by the organization. He then reiterated that matters of international peace and security, peacekeeping, peacebuilding, peace enforcement and conflict resolution fell under the purview of the Security Council, based on the Charter of the United Nations. He concluded by recalling paragraph 1 of Council resolution 1996/31. The representative of the Russian Federation then posed a question, and the Committee decided to defer its consideration of the application.

B. New applications for consultative status and new requests for reclassification

35. The Committee considered item 3 (b) of its agenda, New applications for consultative status and new requests for reclassification at its 17th through 21st meetings, from 23 May to 25 May 2016 and at its 29th meeting on 1 June 2016. The Committee considered a total of 219 new applications for consultative status.

New applications recommended

36. Of the 219 organizations whose new applications had been received, the Committee recommended that the following 125 should be granted consultative status with the Council (see chap. I, draft decision I, para. (a)):

C. Suspension of consultative status of organizations that have failed to submit their quadrennial reports for one or more consecutive reporting periods

46. At its 29th meeting, on 1 June, the Committee considered agenda item 6(c). The Secretariat informed the Committee that it had sent three notifications to non-governmental organizations that had not fulfilled the requirement to submit quadrennial reports by 1 May 2016, pursuant to Council resolution 2008/4. The Secretariat had also sought assistance from the permanent missions to the United Nations of the countries where the non-governmental organizations had their headquarters.

47. In this regard, the Committee adopted a draft decision recommending that the Council suspend, for a period of one year, the consultative status of 158 non-governmental organizations that had failed to submit quadrennial reports, in accordance with the guidelines set out in Council resolution 2008/4 (see chap. I, draft decision III). The Committee further requested the Secretariat to advise the concerned organizations of the suspension of their consultative status and to inform the permanent missions to the United Nations of the countries where the non-governmental organizations had their headquarters.

D. Reinstatement of consultative status of non-governmental organizations that had been previously suspended due to non-submission of their quadrennial reports

48. At its 28th meeting, on 31 May, in accordance with Council resolution 2008/4 and Council decision 2014/224, the Committee decided to recommend reinstatement of the consultative status of 81 organizations upon receipt of their pending quadrennial reports prior to the termination of the suspension period (see chap. I, draft decision IV).

E. Withdrawal of consultative status of organizations with continued outstanding quadrennial reports

49. At the 29th meeting, on 1 June, the Secretariat informed the Committee that it had sent several notifications to non-governmental organizations that were already on the list of organizations suspended for one year owing to outstanding quadrennial reports, pursuant to Council resolution 2008/4 and that it had failed to receive any response from 85 of those organizations. The Secretariat informed the Committee that it had also sought assistance from the permanent missions to the United Nations of the countries where the non-governmental organizations had their headquarters.

50. Accordingly, the Committee decided to recommend that the Council withdraw the consultative status of the 85 non-governmental organizations with continued

outstanding quadrennial reports, in accordance with the guidelines set out in Council resolution 2008/4 and recalling decision 2014/223 (see chap. I, draft decision V). The Committee further requested the Secretary-General to advise the concerned organizations of the withdrawal of their consultative status and to inform the permanent missions to the United Nations of the countries where the non-governmental organizations had their headquarters.

IV. Strengthening of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the Secretariat

51. At its 17th meeting, on 23 May, the Committee jointly considered agenda item 5, Strengthening of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the Secretariat, and agenda item 8, General voluntary trust fund in support of the United Nations Non-Governmental Organizations Informal Regional Network, and heard oral reports made by the Secretariat.

52. The Branch expressed appreciation for the additional human resources recently allocated to it for the purpose of meeting the increased workload of the Committee. It further called on the Committee to advocate extending those resources on a continuing basis in order for the Branch to adequately support all complementary areas of resolution 1996/31.

V. Review of the methods of work of the Committee: implementation of Council resolution 1996/31, including the process of accreditation of representatives of non-governmental organizations, and Council decision 1995/304

Recommendations for improving the working methods of the Committee

53. Informal consultations were held on 1 June 2016 to consider issues that could contribute to improve the working methods of the Committee. The discussions focused in particular on the role of observer States and on the webcast of the proceedings. Some delegates expressed the need to maintain a distinction between the role of observer States and that of the members of the Committee. Other delegates emphasized the beneficial contribution of observers, whose interventions could not be restricted in open meetings. The representative of the Secretariat clarified that article 72 of the rules of procedures provided the basis for their participation in the deliberations. With regard to the timing, it was left to the practice of the Committee. One option was to follow the appropriate agenda item.

54. Some delegations raised questions on the policy on the webcast transmission of meetings of the United Nations, while others welcomed full transparency in the Committee's work. The representative of the Secretariat clarified that while webcast transmission is mandated for all plenary meetings of the three principal bodies, the practice for open meetings of subsidiary bodies is based upon request and the

availability of funding. In addition, any media representative with proper accreditation is allowed to cover open meetings.

55. It is expected that further informal consultations may be held at a later stage to address these matters. The Committee noted useful views expressed by Committee members in that regard.

VI. Other matters

Statements by non-member States of the Committee

57. At its 29th meeting, on 1 June, the observer for the European Union made a statement stressing the crucial role of civil society in the United Nations and expressed concerns that the decisions of the current Committee on Non-Governmental Organization had not always been compatible with its mandate, as set down by the Council. He raised concerns over the disproportionate deferral of the applications of non-governmental organizations that were engaged in the area of human rights and suggested that measures should be considered to strengthen the transparency of the Committee's work, including through webcast transmission of the Committee's proceedings. The observer for Australia delivered a joint statement on behalf of her country, Canada, Iceland, New Zealand, Norway and Switzerland. She expressed concern about the spirit in which the criteria in resolution 1996/31 were being applied, particularly with regard to non-governmental organizations working on human rights-related issues. Citing the example of the applications from the Committee to Protect Journalists and the Youth Coalition for Sexual and Reproductive Rights at the session, she stated that the rules of procedure were being misused for political purposes to prevent non-governmental organizations from gaining consultative status. The representative urged the Committee to allow webcast transmission of its sessions in the interest of greater transparency and accountability, as recommended by Chile, Mexico and Uruguay in 2015. Her call for greater transparency and accountability was echoed in a statement by the observer for Mexico.

Statements by non-governmental organizations

58. At its 20th meeting, on 24 May, the representative of the non-governmental organization International Service for Human Rights delivered a statement in support of a letter sent on behalf of 230 civil society organizations from 45 countries, which called on Members of the Council to ensure that the practice and procedures of the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations are in keeping with the principles, spirit and purpose of Council resolution 1996/31 and in strict compliance with international human rights standards. The representative expressed her concern that some Committee members used procedural tactics to delay certain organizations from being granted consultative status. The representative also underscored the importance of civil society engagement to the work of the United Nations and emphasized the need for transparency, fairness, consistency and non-discrimination in the work of the Committee.

VII. Consideration of special reports and complaints by Member States

59. There were no special reports for the Committee's consideration at the session.

VIII. Provisional agenda and documentation of the 2017 session of the Committee

60. At its 29th meeting, on 1 June, the Committee considered item 9 of its agenda, Provisional agenda and documentation for the 2017 session of the Committee, and had before it the draft provisional agenda for its 2017 session ([E/C.2/2016/L.1](#)).

61. At the same meeting, the Committee decided to recommend to the Council the following dates for the sessions in 2017: from 30 January to 8 February and on 21 February for its 2017 regular session, and from 22 May to 31 May and 12 June for its 2017 resumed session.

IX. Organization of the session

A. Opening and duration of the session

62. The Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations held its 2016 resumed session from 23 May to 1 June and on 10 June. The Committee held 14 meetings.

B. Attendance

63. The session was attended by all 19 members of the Committee. Observers for other States Members of the United Nations, observer States, representatives of organizations of the United Nations system and observers for non-governmental organizations also attended. The list of participants was issued in document [E/C.2/2016/INF/2](#).

64. At its 2016 resumed session, the Committee heard 20 representatives of non-governmental organizations, who were given the opportunity to respond to questions raised by the Committee. The additional information provided by the representatives facilitated the debate and the work of the Committee in taking its decisions.

C. Agenda

65. The agenda ([E/C.2/2016/1](#)) for the 2016 regular and resumed session reads as follows:

 - (c) Other related matters.

- 10. Adoption of the report of the Committee.
