Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

Election of one member of the International Narcotics Control Board from among candidates nominated by governments

Note by the Secretary-General

I. Election for the remainder of the term of office expiring on 1 March 2017

1. In a communication dated 8 August 2016, the Secretary-General was informed of the resignation of Alejandro Mohar Betancourt (Mexico), a member of the International Narcotics Control Board, whose term of office was to expire on 1 March 2017.

2. Article 10, paragraph 5, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, reads as follows:

Where a vacancy occurs on the Board during the term of office of a member, the Council shall fill such vacancy as soon as possible and in accordance with the applicable provisions of article 9, by electing another member for the remainder of the term.

3. Since Mr. Mohar Betancourt was elected by the Economic and Social Council in 2013 from among candidates nominated by governments, the member to be elected to fill the remainder of the term should be elected from a list of candidates nominated by governments.

4. In accordance with established procedure and the provisions of the Single Convention, the Secretary-General, in a note dated 24 August 2016, invited States Members of the United Nations and parties to the Single Convention that were not members of the United Nations to nominate candidates by 14 October 2016.



5. As at 14 October 2016, three candidates had been nominated by governments. Their names are listed below:

7. In accordance with article 9, paragraph 2, of the Single Convention, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, members of the Board shall not hold positions or engage in any activity that would be liable to impair their impartiality in the exercise of their functions. The positions and activities of the following persons are, in particular, incompatible with membership of the Board: persons who hold government posts, are in the paid service of their governments or are acting under instructions from their governments; persons who represent a government at national or international forums on drug-related issues; and persons who are engaged in any activity, whether private or public, that could be likely to impair their impartiality in the exercise of their functions on the Board or that is in conflict with the functions of the Board.

II. Election for the term of office from 2 March 2017 to 1 March 2022

9. In a communication dated 8 August 2016, the Secretary-General was informed of the resignation of Alejandro Mohar Betancourt (Mexico), a member of the International Narcotics Control Board, whose term of office was to expire on 1 March 2017, and who was re-elected by the Economic and Social Council on 5 April 2016 for an additional term of five years, from 2 March 2017 to 1 March 2022, in accordance with article 10, paragraph 1, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol.

10. Article 10, paragraph 5, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, reads as follows:

Where a vacancy occurs on the Board during the term of office of a member, the Council shall fill such vacancy as soon as possible and in accordance with the applicable provisions of article 9, by electing another member for the remainder of the term.

11. Since Mr. Mohar Betancourt was re-elected by the Economic and Social Council in 2016 from among candidates nominated by governments, the member to be elected for this term should be elected from a list of candidates nominated by governments.

12. In accordance with established procedure and the provisions of the Single Convention, the Secretary-General, in a note dated 24 August 2016, invited States Members of the United Nations and parties to the Single Convention that were not members of the United Nations to nominate candidates by 14 October 2016.

13. As at 14 October 2016, four candidates had been nominated by governments. Their names are listed below:

Annex II

Number, length and place of meetings, payments and present membership of the International Narcotics Control Board

1. In accordance with article 11, paragraph 2, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, the Board shall meet as often as, in its opinion, may be necessary for the proper discharge of its functions, but shall hold at least two sessions in each calendar year.

2. The Board normally meets three times a year, each session lasting from one to three weeks. In 2015 the following sessions were held:

112th session: 2-6 February 2015;

113th session: 4-15 May 2015;

114th session: 27 October-13 November 2015.

In 2016 the following sessions were held:

115th session: 1-5 February 2016;

116th session: 17-27 May 2016.

3. The sessions are normally held at the headquarters of the Board's secretariat in Vienna (Vienna International Centre).

4. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 2491 (XXIII), the members of the Board receive a per diem allowance while participating in Board sessions or in official missions. In 2016, the allowance for Vienna is approximately \$358 per day. Members' travelling expenses are defrayed by the United Nations in accordance with current administrative practice.

5. In accordance with General Assembly resolution [56/272](#), members of the Board receive an honorarium of \$1 per year.
