## **Election of a member to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues**

### **Note by the Secretary-General**

1. At its 17th plenary meeting in 2016, held on 5 April, the Economic and Social Council elected seven members to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2017 (see Council decision 2016/201 D).
2. At the same meeting, the Council postponed the election of one member from Asia-Pacific States for a term beginning on 1 January 2017 and expiring on 31 December 2019 (see Council decision 2016/201 D).
3. The Secretariat has since received one nomination from Asia-Pacific States. The term of office would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2019.
