Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

Election of 14 members of the Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund/United Nations Office for Project Services

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund/United Nations Office for Project Services is composed of 36 members, elected with due regard to equitable geographical representation and other relevant factors, with a view to ensuring the most effective and broadest representation.
2. Under the terms of General Assembly resolution [48/162](#), the Economic and Social Council is to elect 14 members of the Executive Board from among States Members of the United Nations or members of the specialized agencies or of the International Atomic Energy Agency, for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2019, to fill the vacancies that will occur on 31 December 2018 upon the expiration of the terms of the following members: Belarus, Benin, Cameroon, Canada, Chad, Denmark, France, Haiti, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malawi, Republic of Korea, Samoa and Uganda.
3. The election will be held at the coordination and management meetings of the Council, to be held from 16 to 18 April 2018.
4. The members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
 - (a) Five members from African States;
 - (b) Three members from Asia-Pacific States;
 - (c) One member from Eastern European States;
 - (d) One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;
 - (e) Four members from Western European and other States.
5. The membership of the Executive Board in 2018 is listed in the annex to the present note.
