## **Election of a member to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues**

### **Note by the Secretary-General**

1. At its 12th and 13th plenary meetings in 2019, held on 7 May, the Economic and Social Council elected seven members to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2020 and expiring on 31 December 2022 (see Council decision 2019/201 C).<sup>1</sup>
2. Also at its 13th plenary meeting, the Council postponed the election of one member from Eastern European States for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2020 and expiring on 31 December 2022 (see Council decision 2019/201 C).<sup>1</sup>
3. In a note verbale dated 20 May 2019 from the Chair, Eastern European States, the Secretariat was informed of the endorsement of Sven-Erik Soosaar (Estonia) as a member of the Permanent Forum. The term of office would begin on 1 January 2020 and expire on 31 December 2022.
