Human rights	Human Rights Council	–	<p>The role of the Human Rights Council in the review of programme 20 of the proposed biennial programme plan has been clarified to the effect that, from a legal point of view, and consistent with the practice of the former Commission on Human Rights, the Council should not be considered a relevant intergovernmental organ within the meaning of regulation 4.8 of the Regulations and Rules Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation. Nevertheless, in follow-up to the invitation made in the statement of the President of the Human Rights Council (A/HRC/PRST/15/2), on 2 May the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights shared programme 20 of the biennial programme plan of the proposed strategic framework for the period 2016-2017 with the Council members, through a letter to the President. In the letter, the High Commissioner informed the Council of the upcoming review of the Committee for Programme and Coordination and expressed her willingness to receive any comments that the members of the Council might have on the proposed biennial programme plan.</p>

Annex II

Proposed revisions to the proposed biennial programme plan for programme 21, International protection, durable solutions and assistance to refugees

The following modifications are proposed to be incorporated in programme 21, International protection, durable solutions and assistance to refugees:

Overall orientation

Paragraph 21.6 (f)

Replace the existing text with: “Promoting gender equality and ensuring that UNHCR and its partners mainstream into all aspects of programme delivery full consideration of the rights of persons of concern, as well as the particular needs and capacities, ascertained through participatory assessments, of women and children, the elderly, persons with disabilities and other persons of concern with specific needs;”.

Paragraph 21.6 (g)

Replace the existing text with: “Ensuring the security of camps, settlements and areas of return as well as their civilian and humanitarian character, and exploring further concrete ways of enhancing the safety and security of UNHCR staff and other humanitarian workers working with refugees, returnees and other persons of concern:”.

Objective of the organization

Replace the existing text with: “To ensure international protection to refugees and, as applicable, other persons of concern to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, and to achieve permanent solutions to their problems in cooperation with States and other organizations, including through the provision of humanitarian assistance”.

Indicators of achievement

Add a new indicator to read “(f) (iv) Increased percentage of persons of concern who have been assisted with voluntary repatriation and sustainable reintegration into communities”.
