Improved and streamlined annual report questionnaire

The Commission on Narcotic Drugs:

(a) Decides, pursuant to the commitment made in the 2019 Ministerial Declaration,¹ to adopt the annual report questionnaire as submitted to the Commission in the note by the Secretariat entitled “Improved and streamlined annual report questionnaire”,² to reflect and assess progress made in the implementation of all commitments contained in the 2009 Political Declaration and Plan of Action,³ the 2014 Joint Ministerial Statement⁴ and the outcome document of the 2016 special session of the General Assembly;⁵

(b) Recognizes the existence of different national data collection practices and approaches to drug-related matters as well as of different national societal contexts in the process of data collection, while recognizing also the importance of improving the comparability of reported data;

(c) Requests the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime to continue to provide enhanced technical and substantive support and targeted, effective and sustainable capacity-building to requesting Member States, in close cooperation with the International Narcotics Control Board, the World Health Organization and other relevant partners, with a view to strengthening national data collection capacity in order to improve the response rate and expand the geographical and thematic reporting of related data in accordance with all commitments, and invites existing and emerging donors to provide extrabudgetary resources for these purposes;

(d) Requests Member States to complete and submit their response to the annual report questionnaire, to the best of their capabilities and in accordance with national legislation, promptly and not later than 30 June of each year;

(e) Also requests Member States to appoint a national focal point, as appropriate in their national context, to facilitate the completion of the annual report questionnaire, working in consultation with their permanent mission accredited to the United Nations Office at Vienna.
