The proposed programme of work is based on suggestions by the secretariat and on Executive Board decisions, including decision 2010/11, which called for a better balance of agenda items throughout the year and for the possibility to harmonize the schedule for relevant items with that of the Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme, of the United Nations Population Fund and of the United Nations Office for Project Services. It has been prepared in consultation with the Bureau of the Executive Board of UNICEF and is presented to the Executive Board for approval. Once adopted, it serves as a framework for setting the agendas for 2015 Executive Board sessions, subject to decisions by the Executive Board and modifications introduced in consultation with the Bureau of the Executive Board.

5. UNICEF programme cooperation**(a) Approval of revised country and area programme documents***For action*

At its annual session of 2014, the Executive Board discussed draft country programme documents for Afghanistan, Angola, Comoros, Sierra Leone, Timor-Leste, Tunisia and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, as well as the area programme document for Palestinian children and women in Jordan, Lebanon, the Syrian Arab Republic and the State of Palestine. The comments made on the country and area programme documents were shared with the respective country and regional offices, and the documents were revised as appropriate and posted on the UNICEF Executive Board website within six weeks of the session.

The revised country and area programme documents are presented to the Executive Board for approval. These documents will be approved on a no-objection basis unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing of their wish to bring a particular country programme document before the Executive Board for discussion.
