SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND OF THE STACE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Fursuant to Rule 11 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure of the Security Council, I submit the following summary statement of matters of which the Security Council is seized and of the stage reached in their consideration on 12 March 1949.

1. The Irenian Question (see S/1273).

- 8. The Indonesian Question (see also S/1273 and S/1279).

Discussion was continued at the 416th and 417th meetings. By letter dated 9 Mirch 1949, the representative of Pakistan requested that Pakistan be permitted to participate in the Security Council discussions on the Indonesian Question (S/1283). At the 417th meeting the Security Council agreed to invite the representative of Pakistan to participate in future meetings.

The representative of Canada proposed that it would seem useful to utilize the services of the United Nations Commission for Indonesia to assist in reaching an agreement between the parties as to the time and conditions under which the proposed conference between the parties at the Hague would be held. He further stated that these exploratory discussions should be without prejudice to the resolutions of the Security Council, and to the rights, claims or positions of the parties, and he suggested that no new resolution of the Security Council would be required.

At the 415th meeting the Council adopted by a vote of 8 in favour, none against and 3 abstentions (Egypt, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) the draft resolution proposed by the Committee of Experts concerning the respective functions of the Security Council and the Trusteeship Council with regard to the Trusteeship System as applied to strategic areas (S/1280).
