## NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 99th and 112th plenary meetings of its thirty-seventh session, on 10 and 20 December 1982 respectively, the General Assembly adopted resolution 37/86, entitled "Question of Palestine".  $\underline{1}$ / In paragraphs 4 and 5 of resolution 37/86 D, the General Assembly

"<u>Requests</u> the Security Council to discharge its responsibilities under the Charter and recognize the inalienable rights of the Palestinian Arab people, including the right to self-determination and the right to establish its independent Arab state in Palestine;

"<u>Reiterates</u> its request that the Security Council take the necessary measures, in execution of the relevant United Nations resolutions, to implement the plan which, <u>inter alia</u>, recommends that an independent Arab state shall come into existence in Palestine".

In paragraphs 4 and 7 of resolution 37/86 E, the General Assembly

"<u>Urges</u> the Security Council to facilitate the process of Israeli withdrawal;

"<u>Recommends</u> that the Security Council should take early action to promote a just and comprehensive solution to the question of Palestine".
