NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

1. At the 113th plenary meeting of its fortieth session, on 12 December 1985, the General Assembly adopted resolution 40/89, entitled "Implementation of the Declaration on the **Denuclearization** of Africa". 1/

2. In paragraphs 8 and 9 of resolution B, the General Assembly

"8. Requests the Security Council, for the purposes of disarmament and to fulfil its obligations and responsibility, to take enforcement measures to prevent any racist **régime** from acquiring arms or arms technology;

"9. Further requests the Security Council to conclude expeditiously its consideration of the recommendations of its Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa, 2/ with a view to **blocking** the existing loopholes in the arms embargo so as to render it more effective, and prohibiting, in particular, all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist regime of South Africa in the nuclear field".
