UNITED NATIONS OBSERVER MISSION IN EL SALVADOR

Report of the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. As I indicated in paragraph 96 of my main report (S/1994/561), I wish to inform the Council that the estimated cost of extending the United Nations Observer Mission in El Salvador (ONUSAL) for the six-month period from 1 June to 30 November 1994 would be approximately \$14 million. The staffing component of the Mission would include a civilian staff of up to 99 international and 175 locally recruited staff, 19 military personnel and, initially, 236 civilian police personnel, who will be reduced to 161 by 1 October 1994. A breakdown of the estimated cost by main categories of expenditure is provided for information purposes in the annex to the present addendum.

2. It would be my recommendation to the General Assembly, should the Council decide to extend the mandate of ONUSAL, that the additional cost relating thereto should be considered an expense of the Organization to be borne by Member States in accordance with Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations and that the assessments to be levied on Member States should be credited to the ONUSAL special account.
