Letter dated 11 July 2000 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to refer to resolution 1295 (2000), adopted by the Security Council on 18 April 2000, concerning Angola. In paragraph 3 of that resolution the Council requested that, after consultation with the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993), I appoint experts to serve on a monitoring mechanism composed of up to five members, for a period of six months from its effective entry into operation, to collect additional relevant information and investigate relevant leads relating to any allegations of violations of the measures contained in resolutions 864 (1993), 1127 (1997) and 1173 (1998).

Accordingly, following consultation with the Committee, I wish to inform you that I have appointed the following five experts:

Christine Gordon (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland)
Juan Larraín (Chile)
James Manzou (Zimbabwe)
Ismaila Seck (Senegal)
Lena Sundh (Sweden)

I have also selected Ambassador Juan Larraín to chair the monitoring mechanism.
