
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Letter dated 30 May 2002 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to submit to you, and through you to the members of the Security Council, the texts of letters exchanged between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations, extending, in the light of Security Council resolution 1409 (2002) of 14 May 2002, the memorandum of understanding of 20 May 1996 concerning the implementation of Security Council resolution 986 (1995) for a new period of 180 days, effective 30 May 2002 (see annexes I and II).

Annex I

Letter dated 28 May 2002 from the Under-Secretary-General for Legal Affairs addressed to the Permanent Representative of Iraq to the United Nations

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 1409 (2002), adopted by the Security Council on 14 May 2002, by which the Council decided, inter alia, that the relevant provisions of its resolution 986 (1995) would remain in force for a new period of 180 days beginning at 0001 hours, United States Eastern Daylight Time, on 30 May 2002. By paragraph 2 of that resolution the Council also adopted the revised goods review list (S/2002/515, annex) and the revised procedures for its application for implementation beginning at 0001 hours, United States Eastern Daylight Time, on 30 May 2002 as a basis for the humanitarian programme in Iraq as referred to in resolution 986 (1995) and other resolutions. I should also like to refer to an exchange of letters dated 1 December 2001 between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations (see S/2001/1172), extending, in the light of Security Council resolution 1382 (2001) of 29 November 2001, the memorandum of understanding of 20 May 1996 between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of Iraq on the implementation of Security Council resolution 986 (1995) for a period of 180 days, effective 1 December 2001.

In view of the foregoing, I have the honour to propose that the provisions of the memorandum of understanding of 20 May 1996, as read in conjunction with the relevant provisions of Security Council resolution 1409 (2002), be extended for an additional period of 180 days, effective 30 May 2002.

It is understood that the distribution plans that have already been approved but have not yet been implemented shall continue to apply for goods purchased with oil revenues generated under the respective Security Council resolutions.

If your Government agrees to this proposal, I suggest that the present letter, and your reply thereto, shall constitute an agreement between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of Iraq. This, however, does not apply to the second sentence of your reply, which is a unilateral statement by the Government concerning matters outside the scope of the mandate of the Secretariat in relation to the present exchange of letters, and which, furthermore, as we understand it, does not affect the nature of the applicable resolutions adopted in accordance with relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations.

Annex II

Letter dated 28 May 2002 from the Permanent Representative of Iraq to the United Nations addressed to the Under-Secretary-General for Legal Affairs

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of the Republic of Iraq has agreed to the proposal contained in your letter of 28 May 2002 for the extension of the provisions of the memorandum of understanding between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of the Republic of Iraq of 20 May 1996 for an additional period of 180 days, effective 30 May 2002. In this connection, the Government of the Republic of Iraq wishes to confirm its position that it is not concerned with or committed to any resolutions, arrangements, measures, concepts or orientations not provided for in the memorandum of understanding between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of the Republic of Iraq of 20 May 1996 or not agreed upon by the Government of Iraq, and that the last sentence of your letter expresses the position of the Secretariat of the United Nations.
