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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

By a letter dated 23 March 2004 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2004/233), the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya to the United Nations, in his capacity as the Chairman of the Group of Arab States for the month of March 2004, and on behalf of the States members of the League of Arab States, referring to a letter dated 22 March 2004 from the Permanent Observer of Palestine (S/2004/231), regarding "the extrajudicial execution by Israel, the occupying Power, of Sheikh Ahmed Yassin", requested that an immediate meeting of the Security Council be convened "to consider the above-mentioned grave Israeli violation of international humanitarian law and the escalation of Israeli military attack against the Palestinian people and their leadership and to take the necessary measures in this regard".

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4929th and 4934th meetings, held on 23 and 25 March 2004, respectively, in response to the above request.

At the 4929th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Bahrain, Cuba, Egypt, Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Ireland, Israel, Japan, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Malaysia, Morocco, Norway, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, the Sudan, the Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, the United Arab Emirates and Yemen, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 23 March 2004 from the Permanent Observer of Palestine to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2004/234), the President, in accordance with the rules of procedure and the previous practice in that regard, invited the Permanent Observer of Palestine to participate in the discussion.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 23 March 2004 from the Permanent Representative of Algeria to the United Nations (S/2004/236), the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Yahya Mahmassani, Permanent Observer of the League of Arab States to the United Nations.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 23 March 2004 from the Chairman of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, the President extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Paul Badji, Chairman of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People.

At the 4934th meeting, the President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/240) submitted by Algeria and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/240, which received 11 votes in favour (Algeria, Angola, Benin, Brazil, Chile, China, France, Pakistan, Philippines, Russian Federation, Spain), one against (United States of America) and three abstentions (Germany, Romania, United Kingdom of Great

Britain and Northern Ireland), and was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4930th meeting, held on 24 March 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 18 March 2004 from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council (S/2004/225).

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2004/6; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4931st and 4937th meetings, held on 24 and 26 March 2004, respectively, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Afghanistan and its implications for international peace and security (S/2004/230).

At the 4931st and 4937th meetings, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Afghanistan, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Hédi Annabi, Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

At the 4937th meeting, the President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/249) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/249, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1536 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1536

(2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4932nd (private) meeting, held on 24 March 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“On 24 March 2004, the Security Council, pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B, held its 4932nd meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone (UNAMSIL).

“The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Daudi Ngelautwa Mwakawago, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Sierra Leone and Chief of Mission.

“The members of the Council, Mr. Mwakawago and the representatives of participating troop-contributing countries had a constructive exchange of views.”

Cross-border issues in West Africa

The Security Council met to consider the item at its 4933rd meeting, held on 25 March 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on ways to combat subregional and cross-border problems in West Africa (S/2004/200).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Ghana, Ireland and Japan, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mohamed Ibn Chambas, Executive Secretary of the Economic Community of West African States, Jan Egeland, Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, and Zéphirin Diabré, Associate Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that

statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2004/7; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/232, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1534 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1534 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/238) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/238, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1535 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1535 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).
