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### Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

#### Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/2004/20 of 14 February 2004.

During the week ending 24 January 2004, the Security Council took action on the following items:

**Small arms** (*see* S/1999/25/Add.37; S/2001/15/Add.31 and 35; and S/2002/Add.40 and 43; *see also* S/2003/40/Add.11)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4896th meeting, held on 19 January 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on small arms (S/2003/1217). There was one suspension and one resumption of the meeting.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Armenia, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Japan, Mali, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Peru, the Republic of Korea, the Syrian Arab Republic, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Switzerland, Ukraine and Zimbabwe, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Nobuyasu Abe, Under-Secretary-General for Disarmament Affairs.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, *see* S/PRST/2004/1; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2003-31 July 2004*).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Egypt, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Israel, Japan, Liechtenstein, Mali, Mexico, Monaco, Myanmar, Norway, Sierra Leone, the Syrian Arab Republic, Uganda and Ukraine, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council’s prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure to Olara Otunnu, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict, and Carol Bellamy, Executive Director of the United Nations Children’s Fund.

Upon the resumption of the meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Kenya, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4899th meeting, held on 23 January 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the progress report of the Secretary-General on the recommendations of the Security Council mission to West Africa (S/2003/1147).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Ghana, Ireland, Japan, Mexico, Nigeria, Sierra Leone and the Syrian Arab Republic, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Tuliameni Kalomoh, Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs.
